# HEAD COACH AL MISTRI

No fuss. No fanfare. That's the way he wants it.

Al Mistri is bowing out after this, his 25th season as head men's soccer coach at Cal State Fullerton. Don't expect any special ceremonies or presentations.

"It's time. I think we have brought the program about as far as we can take it," he said this summer. "We put the program on the map, so to speak. We've created a situation where some young men can actually make a living playing soccer."

To appreciate how far Titan soccer has come, you must go back almost three decades. Between 1976 and 1980, five different men carried the title "head coach" or "co-head coach," working on a part-time basis and playing on a field surrounded by perhaps 300 temporary bleacher seats. Portable speakers and a flip-card scoreboard kept the fans informed. There was a loosely-knit conference -- the Southern California Intercollegiate Soccer Association -- and the coaches did the team laundry. Despite the lack of "frills," the Titans went 62-41-13 in their first six seasons at the Div. I level.

Enter Mistri in 1981, another part-timer, who commuted from his home in the Inland Empire. He kept his "day-job" as a mathematics teacher at Damien High School in La Verne, where he had coached the likes of future Olympian and professional star Rick Davis.

The progress wasn't immediate. Al's wife, Nikki, picked up the laundry duties. Football still was king in the Fall. But the Titans were competitive, enduring only three losing seasons in his first 11 years.

Then came measurable progress. Mistri's appointment to a full-time coaching position and the construction of Titan Stadium in the 1990s allowed him to establish the program as a perennial national title contender. The Titans competed in the NCAA Tournament five times between 1993 and 2000, advancing to the national semifinals in 1993 and the quarterfinals in 1994.

"We've brought in and developed quality players and always played an exciting brand of soccer," said Mistri, who has compiled an impressive 260-189-39 record in 24 seasons while playing the strongest competition he could schedule. "A wide-open style has been our trademark and now there's an outlet for our players to play professionally. We've had eight or nine players at a time making a living at soccer. We've also reached for a unique audience that includes a lot of first-generation college students."

Local bus rides long ago gave way to flights for tournament appearances across the country. The Titans play a truly national schedule with a trip this year to a tournament at Penn State, continuing the tradition of recent junkets to Indiana, Florida, New Jersey, Vermont, Virginia and South Carolina. They've also competed in tournaments in Texas, Kentucky, Colorado and Washington in the past 11 seasons. And, of course, there was a memorable summer trip to Italy prior to the 2003 season.

"To be the best, you must play the best," says Mistri of his scheduling philosophy. Eight matches this year will be against teams from last year's NCAA Tournament field. A year ago, the Titans lined up



nine times against veterans of the 2003 tourney. They played both the NCAA champion (Indiana) and runnerup (UC Santa Barbara, twice), taking each of them into a second overtime period before losing.

Since Titan Stadium was erected for the 1992 season, the Titans are 85-28-9 (.734) at home and 149-97-19 (.598) overall. With better players has come the influence of professional soccer, bringing both plusses and minuses. Products of the Titans' men's program are now scattered on numerous professional rosters and Brian Dunseth and Joe DiGiamarino were members of the 2000 U.S. Olympic team, giving Mistri four Olympians including soccer Hall of Famer Rick Davis (at Damien HS) and former Titan Mike Fox.

"I'm OK with the professional situation," says Mistri, who has seen several stars leave for pay before their eligibility had expired. "It's an outlet and a boost for soccer. It's part of what we are about."

The Titans reached a new zenith five Springs ago when senior Duncan Oughton, who already had graduated in seven semesters, was selected in the first round of the MLS draft by the Columbus Crew. Oughton also was Cal State Fullerton's male scholar-athlete of the year for 2000-01.

Mistri, who is surpassed only by fencing Coach Heizaburo Okawa (26th season) in campus coaching seniority, is ranked 20th in victories among active Div. I head coaches and 37th (tie) all-time. He boasts five trips to the NCAA playoffs in the past 11 years with a 7-6-1 record. His best season was in 1993 with a 16-7 mark as Fullerton won three successive road playoff matches and reached the Final Four at Davidson, North Carolina. Mistri's 1986 team won the Pacific Coast Athletic Association championship to earn him his first NCAA trip.

Mistri also launched the Titan women's soccer program in 1993, but relinquished control of that team prior to the 2001 season to concentrate on the men's squad. He has coached dozens of professional players at Fullerton including U.S. Olympian and National Team pool player Mike Fox, who also played for the Wichita Wings (MISL); Bob Ammann of the Edmonton Brickmen, Los Angeles Salsa (APSL) and a team in Neuchatel, Switzerland; and Lewis Garcia of the Los Angeles Kickers. More recent professional players include MLS veteran goalkeeper Mike Ammann, who began his professional career with a stint with Charlton, a First Division team in England; Paul McDonnell, Ken Hesse and Ricky Rodriguez with the 1997 Anaheim Splash of the Continental Indoor Soccer League and recent MLS play-

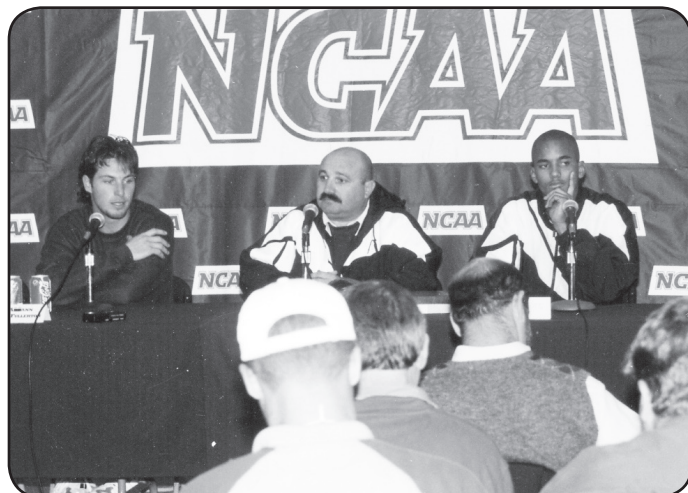
ers Duncan Oughton, Brad Wilson, DiGiamarino, Peter Lak, Joey Franchino and Dunseth. Antonio Martinez (Dallas) and Colby Jackson (New York/New Jersey) both were selected in the 2000 MLS draft. Oughton also is a member of New Zealand's national team which defeated rival Australia three years ago. More recent products Brent Whitfield (Seattle) and Sam Reynolds and Sean Higgins (Portland) are playing in the United Soccer League.

Mistri attended the University of Bologna in Italy before coming to Southern California, where he graduated from Cal Poly Pomona in 1970. He received his U.S. Soccer Federation "B" coaching license in 1973 and his "A" license in 1976. Mistri was at the helm of one of the top high school programs in Damien. In a 10-year stint,

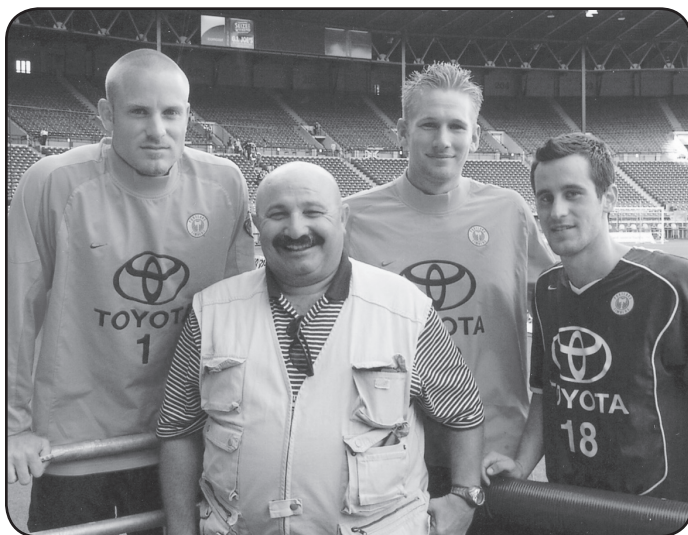
Mistri posted a 190-40-14 record while participating in the CIF playoffs nine times. Two of his top players were Mike Hunter and Rick Davis. Hunter played for the Los Angeles Lazers in the MISL and Davis debuted at 19 years of age for the New York Cosmos of the NASL and was the captain of the U.S. National Team along with being a U.S. Olympian in 1984 and 1988.

Al and his wife, Nikki, live in Fullerton. They have two adult children -- Michelle, a graduate of UC Santa Barbara, and Jeffrey, a graduate of Cal State Fullerton. Upon his retirement, Coach Mistri will visit his parents in Italy and then see what develops.

"I've had some success with investments," he said. "Coaching again is not on the horizon."

# COACHING STAFF

## Assistant Coach Bob Ammann

Bob Ammann is in his 15th season as an assistant coach at Cal State Fullerton, his 11th on a full-time basis and his first with virtually co-head coaching assignments as Al Mistri phases himself out. Ammann's tremendous experience as a coach, professional player and former Titan has been a tremendous benefit to the coaching staff and his experience as a first-class goalkeeper has been of particular value to the Titan squads.

Ammann, 40, graduated from Cal State Fullerton in 1986 after a storied playing career (1983-86) as a Titan under Coach Mistri. He posted 12 career shutouts including six in the 1986 season when he helped the Titans capture the Pacific Coast Athletic Association

championship. His best goals-against average was 1.250 in 1985, his junior campaign.

Ammann played at the professional level for Neuchatel Xamax of the Swiss First Division in 1989 and 1990. He also played for Brighton and Hove Albion F.C. in England, the Edmonton Brickmen of the Canadian Soccer League and the Los Angeles Salsa of the American Professional Soccer League.

Born on May 27, 1965, the Mater Dei High School (Santa Ana) graduate was followed to Cal State Fullerton by younger brother Mike, who also was a goalkeeper for the Titans (1990-93). Mike is a veteran of Major League Soccer, playing in 2002 for D. C. United.

Bob and his wife, Liz, live in Corona.



## Assistant Coach Adam Reeves

Adam Reeves returns for a second season as an assistant coach with the Cal State Fullerton men's soccer program, reunited after a four-year hiatus.

A two-year letterman for the Titans in 1998 and 1999, he transferred to the University of Washington to complete his soccer eligibility. He played one season at left back for a Huskies' team that advanced to the second round of the NCAA Playoffs. He then returned to Fullerton and earned his bachelor's degree in kinesiology in 2003.

Reeves, 26 on Sept. 9, played in 12 matches for the Titans as a freshman and started in all

18 of his appearances as a sophomore in 1999, helping the Titans to a 14-5 record. He had 8 assists to tie for the team lead.

Reeves has coached for four years with the Fullerton Rangers Soccer Club, where he began his coaching career handling the boys under 11 and under 15 squads. He began work at CSF on his masters degree in kinesiology and hopes to pursue a full-time collegiate coaching position.

Currently a Placentia resident, Reeves played four years at Rio Mesa High School in Oxnard and was team co-most valuable player in his junior and senior seasons.

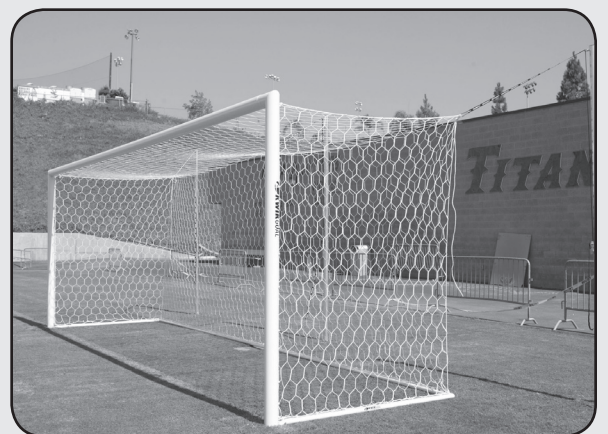
## Recent Improvements to Titan Stadium

The pitch at Titan Stadium has a brand new look for the 2005 season, its 14th year of intercollegiate soccer.

During the summer the entire playing surface was renovated from the underground drainage system up. Professional

Turf Specialties, Inc., removed the old turf, regraded the plot and installed new sod to make the field as smooth as it was in 1992 when the stadium opened.

More noticeable are the new game-standard goals at each end. They are lighter (aluminum) and impervious to weather elements and feature the "European" look with three posts in the back.



# 2005 SEASON PREVIEW

Coach Al Mistri never has been known to bite his lip and he isn't about to start now as he enters his 25th and final season as men's soccer coach at Cal State Fullerton.

"We have the best talent we've had in quite some time," he says with no hesitation. "Barring some of the unfortunate kinds of things that happened to us last year, I think we are going to go out with a bang. It's easy to be optimistic going into a season, but we are confident we will get back to the NCAA playoffs and make a run at the conference championship."

The reason for Mistri's "guarded" optimism is twofold -- a virtual double recruiting class.

"We aggressively pursued and recruited new talent and utilized our full allotment of scholarships," said Mistri, whose only current retirement plans are to visit his parents in native Italy and stay away from coaching.

"The results will be obvious. We have brought in three strong European players and two high school recruits as well as three players who will enter in the Spring and be a great starting point for the next coach.

"Secondly, we get three players back who missed all of last year in Eugene Brooks, Amir Shafii and Brett Gallinger. We thought we had a fourth returnee in Marco Rodriguez, but further surgery was required on his knee late in the summer. They would have made a significant impact on last year's record, I'm positive. We won all but one of our Spring games and it was obvious what a difference the presence of Eugene, Brett and Amir made."

Fullerton sustained in 2004 only its seventh losing season in the Mistri Era at 6-10-2. All but one of the losses was by one goal and two came in the second overtime period to the teams which eventually played in the Soccer Cup -- national champion Indiana and runnerup UC Santa Barbara.

"We have again cut out a job for ourselves with our non-conference schedule and the Big West is one of the top five conferences in the nation, no question about it," said Mistri. "The whole schedule is as demanding as ever. The European players give us the maturity, experience and stability we will need to deal with it."

The international flavor comes from Englishmen Arron Craggs and Jason O'Connor and German Florian Wolff. Craggs (Yorkshire) is a midfielder who played two seasons at Judson College in Elgin, Illinois, where he earned NAIA All-American honors and led his team to a two-year record of 23-1-1. O'Connor (London) is a big (6-foot-2) defender who captained his county side that won the South East Regional Championship and played for AFC Bournemouth. Wolff is considered one of the best talents for his age group to come out of Hamburg. He scored 40 goals in 150 matches over a 3-year period.

The other portion of the incoming class consists of Yavapai College transfer Bobby Armstrong and midfielder Jacob Shumway, one of

the stars of the Martin Luther King High School team from Riverside. Goalkeeper Armstrong (Jr., Aurora, CO) went 45-4-1 in the nets and led Yavapai to the 2003 national championship while twice winning JC All-American honors. Shumway won all-league honors three times as well as all-county and All-CIF acclaim.

Armstrong will challenge holdover goalkeeper Matt Cowan (Jr., Arcadia, CA / Temple City HS), who played in 7 matches (2-2 in four starts) in the past two seasons behind departed Sam Reynolds and had a strong Spring campaign. A handful of walk-ons also will augment 15 returning lettermen and 6 returning starters.

Brooks (Jr., El Paso, TX / Bel Air HS) was the Titans' No. 2 scorer in 2002 with 7 goals and 15 points and earned honorable mention All-Big West honors. But he developed foot problems which ultimately resulted in surgery that sidelined him for all of last season.

Shafii (RSoph., Irvine, CA / Woodbridge HS) started all 20 matches as a freshman in 2003 but went down with an ankle injury in a pre-season scrimmage last year.

Redshirt freshman Gallinger (Gig Harbor, WA / Bellarmine Prep) started three matches before mononucleosis abruptly turned his 2004 campaign into a medical hardship claim.

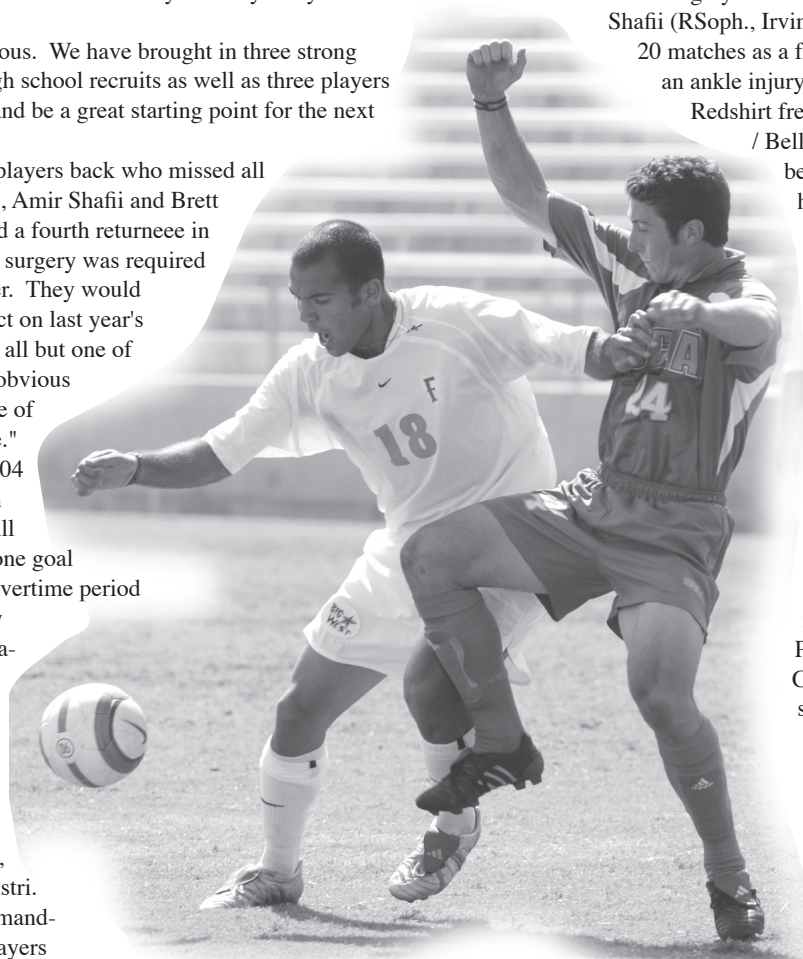
Eleven other lettermen who survived last season intact also return led by the Nos. 2 and 3 scorers in sophomore Steve Moreno (Oceanside, CA / Rancho Buena Vista HS) and sophomore Ben Hofstetter (Boise, ID / Timberline HS), who had 10 and 9 points, respectively. Junior defender Taylor Sheldrick (Palmdale, CA / Quartz Hill HS) had the first three goals of the season and started more matches (17) than any other Titan. Powerful Jose Barragan (Signal Hill, CA / Compton College) returns for a senior season and will concentrate on a striker's role.

The injuries of last season did produce one positive -- force-feeding some youngsters on Div. I play. Six freshmen who saw plenty of action in 2004 return as sophomores in midfielder Allen Chote (Seatoun, Wellington, NZ / St. Patrick's College), defender

Anthony Dedeaux (Huntington Beach, CA / Mater Dei HS), defender Alejandro Diaz (Lennox, CA / Animo Leadership HS), defender German Moreno (Long Beach, CA / Cabrillo HS), forward Farzad Samari (Tehran, Iran) and midfielder Skyler Thuresson (Long Beach, CA / Seaside Academy).

Maryland, which tied for third in last year's NCAA Tournament, opens Fullerton's season with an inaugural matchup on Sept. 2 in Titan Stadium. The Terrapins (17-6-2) are the first of eight matches against last year's 32-team field with Santa Clara (15-6), Penn State (10-4-8), Ohio State (12-7-2) and two conference clashes each with UCSB (21-3-1) and Cal State Northridge (11-6-2) to follow.

Coach Mistri can't be accused of taking the easy way out.

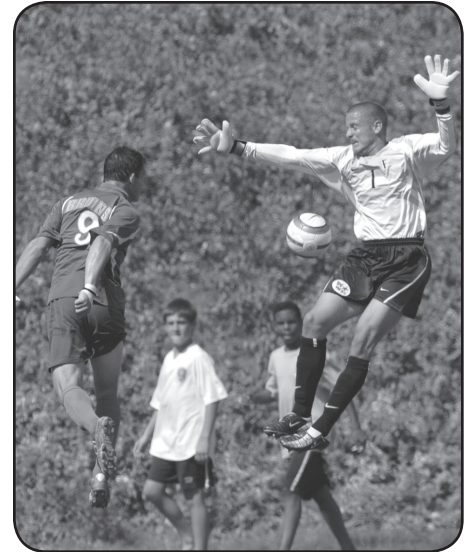

# HISTORY OF TITAN SOCCER

While the Cal State Fullerton men's soccer program reached unprecedented heights in the 1990s, success was not lacking in the formative years. Coaches and players in the 1970s and 1980s laid the groundwork for the national success the Titans now enjoy. Unfortunately, most of the pre-Div. I records are lost and there are only snippets of the program's accomplishments in the early seasons.

The Titans' trip to the Final Four at Davidson in 1993 for a third-place national finish was not the closest they have come to a national championship. In 1973, CSF went 15-3 and advanced to the Div. II title game in Springfield, Massachusetts, losing

to Missouri-St. Louis, 3-0. Coach Dennis Checkett had served as assistant to Coach Paul Fardy from 1970 through 1972 and he led the program into Div. I status in the 1975 and 1976 seasons.

The Titans made annual trips to the NCAA playoffs in the early 1970s, but probably the single most memorable game in early Titan soccer history occurred at the Santa Ana Bowl on Oct. 30, 1974. A near full-house crowd of more than 6,000 showed up to see the playoff-bound Titans play the UCLA Bruins to a 1-1 tie. Another memorable moment occurred in 1974 when the Titans took advantage of a whistle blown in the stands. Host San Diego State's players relaxed and

the Titans scored an easy and decisive goal for a 3-2 win at the old Aztec Bowl.

## Morrison Gave Titans Presence in Old NASL



Dave Morrison was featured on the cover of the Nov./Dec., 1976, issue of titanSports, a magazine produced by the CSF communications department. "He could become the best goalkeeper ever to come out of California, he's that good," said his coach, Dennis Checkett. Morrison was born in Seattle but grew up in Livermore and Fountain Valley, California.

Dave Morrison was one of the earliest Titans to advance to the professional ranks. A four-year standout as goalkeeper for the Titans from 1975 through 1978, he was a member of the Los Angeles Aztecs of the North American Soccer League from 1978 through 1980, when the league ceased operations.

"I didn't play much, but it was an honor just to be around the great players and our coach, Rinus Michels," said Morrison, who currently manages an L.A. Fitness Center in Fountain Valley. "My most memorable moment was a playoff game at Edmonton (Drillers) when he sent me in for a shootout. That's when you had one player line up 35 yards out and try to score. I stopped him and we won."

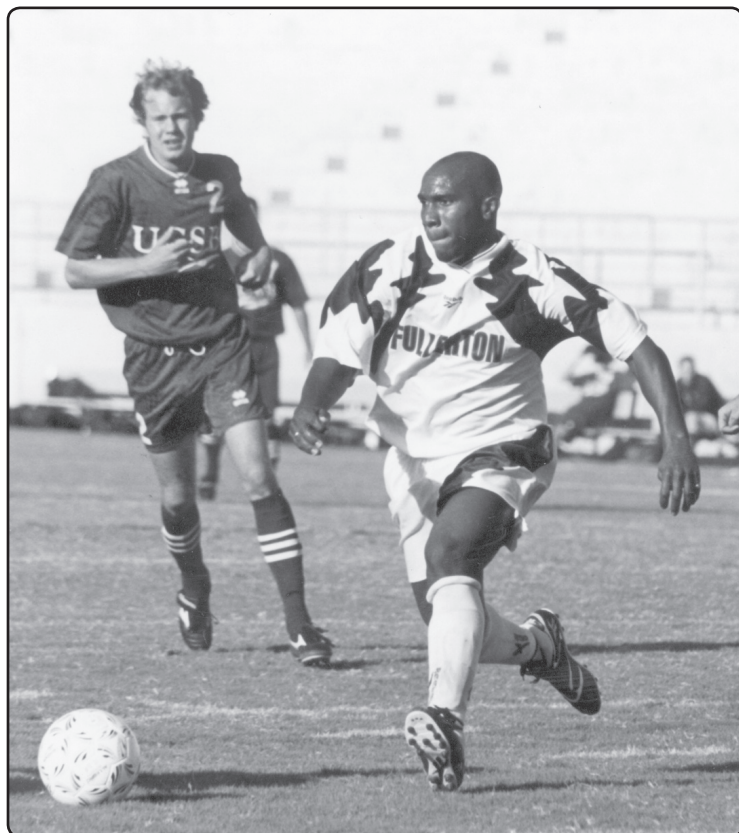

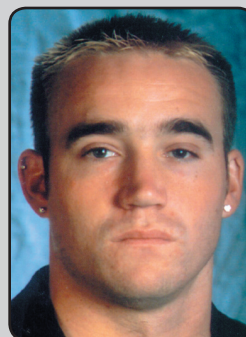

Mike Fox (1979-82) was the first Titan to make a big name for himself in soccer upon graduation. He was on the U.S. Olympic team in 1984 and the U.S. national team from 1985-87. He played with numerous professional teams including the New York Cosmos of the North American Soccer League.

In August of 2000, the Titans' Olym-

pic ranks swelled to three with the selection of 1995 & 1996 teammates Joe DiGiamarino and Brian Dunseth to the U.S. squad. Dunseth was named team captain by Coach Clive Charles. Fullerton joined UCLA and Virginia (two each) as the only college programs with more than one product on the squad, which became the first American team to advance to the second round.

# TITANS IN THE PRO RANKS

The Cal State Fullerton men's soccer program has been well represented at the professional level in a variety of venues and the advent of Major League Soccer (MLS) has provided another opportunity beyond college soccer for players. According to *Soccer America*, about 70 percent of MLS players have collegiate experience and only five schools (UCLA, Virginia, Fresno State, Indiana and Southern Connecticut) had more products than Cal State Fullerton play in an MLS game in 1998.

Head Coach Al Mistri and his coaching staff are aware of the new opportunities after college for players and they work to create an environment at Fullerton that will benefit everyone.

"The quality of our schedule is a clear indicator of the professional opportunities that players have here at Cal State Fullerton," said Mistri. "We take a serious approach for our training and our overall level of the program guarantees exposure for our players."

The Titans have regularly competed against "A" League teams such as the Orange County Waves (formerly Zodiac) in pre-season exhibitions and the Los Angeles Galaxy of MLS in spring action. The Galaxy, which played many of its matches in Titan Stadium before the opening of the Home Depot Center, also has used Titans as "enemy" players in scrimmages in Titan Stadium.

The Titans had four players on MLS rosters in August, 2003, in Joey DiGiamarino of the MetroStars, Brian Dunseth of Dallas, Antonio Martinez of the Galaxy and Duncan Oughton of Columbus. The list grows to six if you add New England's Joey Franchino and San Jose's Josh Saunders, who finished up at Washington and Cal, respectively.

Mike Ammann (Kansas City) and midfielder Brad Wilson (Los Angeles) both played in the MLS' inaugural season. Ammann returned

home after spending a number of seasons with Charlton, a member of England's First Division. He played in 2000 for New York/New Jersey and was the leading vote getter for the All-Star Game. Wilson also spent some time in Germany with F.C. Saarbrücken.

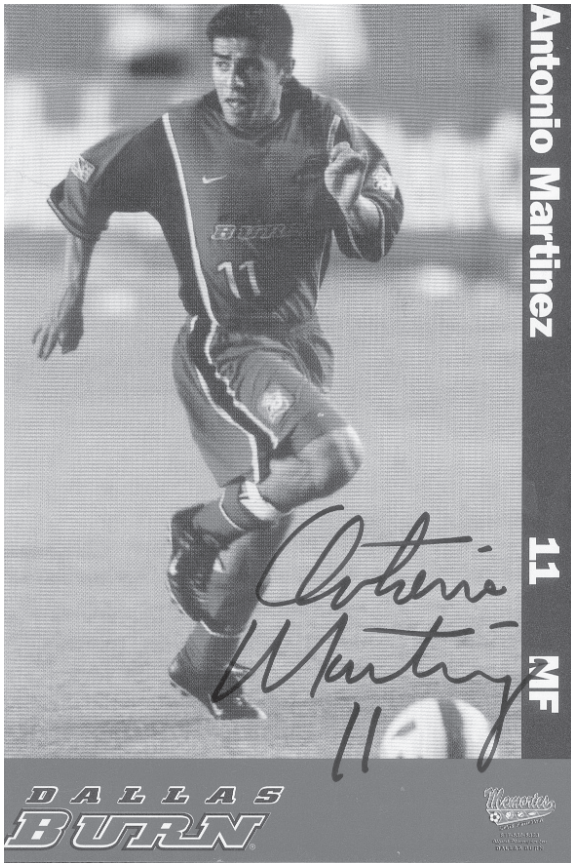
The Waves, the "farm team" for the Galaxy, played their home games at Santa Ana Stadium and featured as many as five Titans in the lineup at one time including former assistant coach Eddie Soto and Peter Lak, who also has been on the Galaxy. Others have included Colby Jackson, Paul McDonnell, Ricky Rodriguez, Art Temblador, Sheldon Thomas and Ken Hesse.

Indoor soccer also had some Titan connections. McDonnell, Hesse and Rodriguez played in 1996 for the Anaheim Splash of the Continental Indoor Soccer League at the Arrowhead Pond of Anaheim.

Perhaps the best-known Titan was Mike Fox, whose career at CSF ran from 1979 through 1982. He debuted professionally for the New York Cosmos, joining former Titan goalkeeper Dave Morrison in the North American Soccer League. Fox played in the Major Indoor Soccer League with the Las Vegas Americans (1984-85), Wichita Wings (1985-90) and the St. Louis Storm (1991). He also spent time with the California Emperors (1990-91) and the Los Angeles Salsa (1992-94).

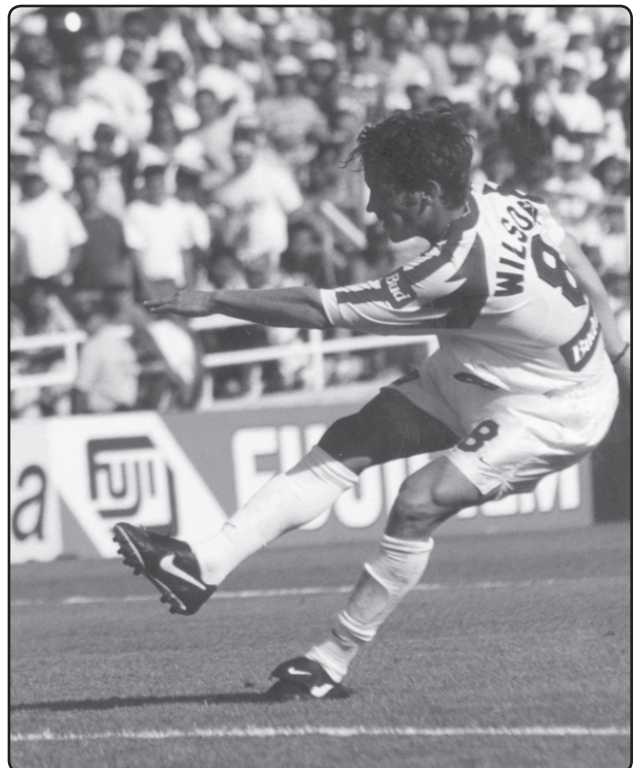
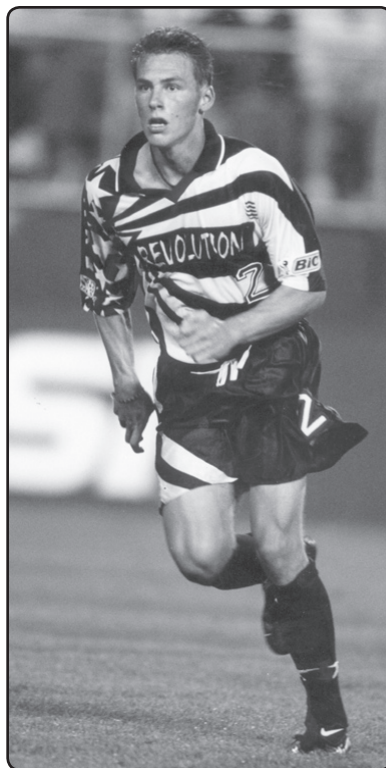

Ammann's brother and current assistant coach, Bob, was also a pro standout. After his Titan career (1983-86), Bob made his first pro start for the Los Angeles Heat of the American Professional Soccer League. He then went to Europe where he played for Brighton, a Second Division team in England. His career continued with the Edmonton Brickmen of the Canadian Soccer League and Neuchatal Xamax, a First Division team in Switzerland.

Former Titans also have made an impact in the soccer coaching ranks. Noah Kooiman is head coach at Cal State San Bernardino. Ray Ramirez coaches at Diamond Ranch High School and Mt. San Antonio College in Walnut. Other high school coaches include Mike Lussier at Servite of Anaheim, Curt Bauer at Santa Margarita and Spencer McDearmon at Woodbridge in Irvine. Former Titan assistant coach Ralph Perez recently stepped out of the professional coaching ranks and is now in community relations with the Los Angeles Galaxy.

And, of course, Ali Khosroshahin and Demian Brown comprise the full-time staff for the Titans' women's team.

# TITAN STADIUM



As Cal State Fullerton soccer establishes itself as one of the nation's elite programs, the cornerstone can be seen in the form of Titan Stadium. Completed in 1992, the 10,000-seat facility has been called by many "one of the finest soccer facilities in the nation." With deference to the much larger but fan-unfriendly Rose Bowl, site of the 1994 World Cup and 1999 Women's World Cup, Titan Stadium was the finest soccer facility in Southern California until the completion of the Home Depot Center in Carson, the new home of the Los Angeles Galaxy.

Titan Stadium features 2,000 chair-back seats and 2,500 bleachers with backrests in the western grandstand and about 5,000 seats on concrete steps along the eastern sideline. The pitch has an underground drainage system that allows it to be almost perfectly flat and it is of maximum width and length -- 75 x 120 yards. The main press box seats more than 50 and there are 10 booths for broadcasting, hospitality, etc.

The stadium shell was completed on Jan. 15, 1992. The first event was commencement on May 30, 1992, and the first soccer activity was a scrimmage between Fullerton and Biola University on Aug. 22, 1992. The first collegiate soccer game was Fullerton vs. UC Santa Barbara on Sept. 5, 1992, followed that evening by Fullerton vs. Cal State Northridge in football. During the summer of 1998, the field level locker room was completed and concessions stands and restrooms were built on the eastern terrace.

During the months leading to the 1994 World Cup, Titan Stadium

played host to several international exhibitions featuring the United States team. The Colombian team trained at Fullerton and several other nations used the facility after the Colombian team was eliminated.

In 1993 and 1994, Titan Stadium served as the home of the Los Angeles Salsa of the American Professional Soccer League. Los Angeles lost to Colorado, 2-1, in the 1993 APSL Championship held in Titan Stadium.

In recent years, the soccer slate has included many international exhibitions and Los Angeles Galaxy and women's pro matches.

In 1994, Cal State Fullerton hosted its first NCAA tournament games ever when the Titans played, and defeated, the University of San Diego and the University of San Francisco in the first two rounds of the tournament.

The stadium is only part of the Titan Sports Complex, which was financed

by a unique arrangement with the city of Fullerton and an on-campus Marriott Hotel. A baseball stadium seating 3,500, a two-diamond softball complex seating more than 1,000, an all-weather running track, renovated tennis courts and an auxiliary soccer field all were part of the original \$10 million project that has seen more than \$4 million in improvements.

With its proximity to Hollywood, Titan Stadium has become a favorite film location for movies, commercials and video games. Numerous professional stars from many sports including soccer's Mia Hamm have been featured. The latest major studio movie production to utilize Titan Stadium was "Rocky and Bullwinkle."

# BIG WEST CONFERENCE

The Big West Conference enters the 2004-05 academic calendar for its 36th year of operation but only its fourth since 1991 to feature men's soccer. After a mandatory two-year wait after the reformation of the soccer alignments, the Big West will again have an automatic berth into the NCAA Tournament, where both Cal State Northridge and UC Santa Barbara advanced in last year's bracket.



Over the past three and a half decades, the conference has strived for athletic and academic success and this year will be no different. A total of 10 teams will compete in 17 sports with six -- Fullerton, UC Irvine, Cal State Northridge, UC Riverside, Cal Poly and UC Santa Barbara -- again vying for the men's soccer crown with a 10-game home-and-away round-robin schedule.

The longest-running conference member is Long Beach State, which was one of the original members of the league when it was formed back in 1969. UCSB, another original member, is tied for the second-longest tenure, with 32 years vested in the conference (the Gauchos left the conference for two seasons in the mid-70s). Pacific has also been a member for 32 years, joining in 1971. Three other members joined in the mid-to-late 1970s including Cal State Fullerton (1974), UC Irvine (1977) and Utah State (1978). The next pair of current members joined in the mid-90s as Cal Poly and Idaho came into the league for the 1996-97 season. The current alignment was formed just four years ago when Cal State Northridge and UC Riverside were admitted as full-time members. The roster will change next year when Idaho and Utah State depart and again in 2007 when UC Davis is admitted.

The Big West was formed as the Pacific Coast Athletic Association on July 1, 1969. However, the unofficial history of the conference pre-dates that point of time, extending back to 1967.

Cal State Los Angeles, Fresno State, Long Beach State and San Diego State were members of the

California Collegiate Athletic Association, long recognized as the nation's premier college circuit.

That conference was classified college division, and therein lay a major source of dissatisfaction. Between 1963 and 1969, the four institutions captured 16 national titles. The number swelled to 21 if the mythical football championships were included.

With no more territory to conquer at the college division, a step up to university ranks had to be considered. Therefore, officials of the seven colleges and universities assembled as a body in May of 1969, tied up loose ends and less than two months later the PCAA was born. The name was changed to the Big West for the fall of 1988.
