





Directions to Cairns Arena in South Burlington, Vt.

From New Hampshire, Boston, and points east: Take I-89 North to Exit 14E (South Burlington) and take first right onto Dorset Street. Follow Dorset through eight lighted intersections, under a bridge, and take left at the ninth light at top of the hill. Take first left for Cairns Arena.

From New York, New Jersey and points west: Follow I-87 North to Exit 20 (Whitehall/Ft. Ann). Follow Route 149 to Route 4 North into Vermont. Take Fair Haven exit and a left onto Route 22A North. Take left onto Route 7 North. Just before the I-189 Exit in South Burlington, take a right onto Swift Street (Denny's Restaurant on corner). At lighted intersection with Dorset Street, stay straight and take left into Cairns Arena parking area.

From Montreal and points north: Take I-89 South to Exit 14 (South Burlington) and take first right onto Dorset Street. Follow Dorset through eight lighted intersections, take left at ninth light at top of the hill. Take first left for Cairns Arena.

activities, and the pure enjoyment of the college years and the Vermont experience to converge in a total Saint Michael's College experience. The Tarrant Recreation Center and Ross Sports Center form the epicenter for athletic and recreational activities on campus. The College offers 21 intercollegiate sports that compete at the NCAA Division II level with all but four teams participating in the highly competitive Northeast-10 Conference, the second-largest Division II conference in the nation.

For students who are looking for something slightly less competitive, there is a wide variety of club and intramural sports such as rugby, basketball, softball and even table tennis. 


The Eastern College Athletic Conference

Since its foundation 67 years ago, the Eastern College Athletic Conference has emerged as a nationwide leader in service, with 323 member institutions (25 percent of the NCAA's membership) in Divisions I, II and III, ranging in location from Maine to North Carolina.

Located in Centerville, Mass., on Cape Cod, the ECAC administers 100 preseason and postseason events for more than 125,000 student-athletes, including the ECAC Collegiate Rowing Series, IC4A cross country and track and field, IFA fencing, EIWA and men's EIGL championships. From 1997 to 2001, the ECAC sponsored conference championships in "endangered" (men's gymnastics, men's water polo) and "emerging" (women's synchronized swimming, women's water polo) sports with funding from the U.S. Olympic Committee, as well as men's wrestling and men's and women's fencing.

The ECAC Women's East ice hockey schedule is comprised of 19 games, with Saint Michael's playing all league members twice, one game at home, and one on the road (one contest against MIT counts as a non-conference game). Because of their status as NCAA Division II institutions, Saint Michael's and Saint Anselm are ineligible to compete in the ECAC East Tournament, as well as MIT (because they do not play the full compliment of league contests) and Holy Cross (because of its status as an NCAA Division I institution).



Chris Donovan Head Coach

Chris Donovan, the only coach the Saint Michael's women's ice hockey program has ever known, enters his seventh season at the helm for the 2006-07 season.

Donovan has an extensive hockey background. A standout for Archbishop William's High School in Braintree, Mass., he went on to play at Norwich University from 1969-73,

serving as captain of the Cadets in his senior year. He also served as an assistant coach to Lou DiMasi with the Saint Michael's men's team from 1991-95.

In 1995, Donovan took over as coaching director for the Vermont Select/Northern Lights women's program. He worked with the 13-15 age group who were the District Regional Runners-Up one year, while the 16-19 group were the District Regional Runners-Up for two consecutive years.

In 2002 and 2004, he was the only coach in his league to be selected as clinician for the YES Clinic during the Division I Women's Frozen Four tournaments. Chris is a member of the Breakaway Hockey Camp for Girls staff held at Cairns Arena in South Burlington. In addition, he also was a coach at the Cornell Hockey Camp in 2005 and the USA Development Camp held at the University of Vermont in 2005. Chris has been associated with the USA Hockey Education Program.

In the past four years, Donovan has recruited three players who received ECAC East Rookie of the Week honors, two players that

have garnered Goalie of the Week honors, an ECAC East All-Rookie Team selection in 2004, and four ECAC Players of the Week. Donovan's players hail from Maine to California. "Chris has had a wide variety of experiences in hockey, both as a player and he has coached both men and women at a number of levels. Those experiences will serve him well in this new opportunity," said Athletic Director Geri Knortz at the announcement of Donovan's hiring.

A 1973 graduate of Norwich, Donovan holds a bachelor of science degree in business administration, and complete his Master's degree in business administration in May 2006. He resides in Hardwick, Vt.

Anne Blair Assistant Coach



Anne Blair, a part-time assistant her first three seasons, was named the Purple Knights' first full-time assistant women's ice hockey coach in August 2005. Heading into her fifth season with the team, she assists head coach Chris Donovan with all facets of the program.

"Increasing Anne's responsibilities within the women's ice hockey program is an extremely positive step," said Donovan, the only head coach the program has ever known who will be entering his eighth season in 2006-07. "I'm excited that Anne has this opportunity to continue to display her commitment and dedication to these young women."

Blair has also served as the secretary and treasurer of the American Women's Hockey Coaches Association since September 2004. Among her many roles with the team, Blair has developed and implemented successful dry-land and on-ice practices, organized and facilitated team meetings and team-building activities, and assisted in recruiting. She also was an assistant with the Saint Michael's women's lacrosse program in 2003 and 2004, helping the 2004 squad win a program record nine games.

Blair is a 1997 graduate of Wheaton College in Norton, Mass., where she received her bachelor of arts in economics. She was a captain of the women's lacrosse team, and finished her career as the program's all-time leader in assists and second in points (currently third and sixth, respectively). Blair also developed and captained the women's ice hockey club team at Wheaton, while also serving as the club's treasurer. She is also a 2006 graduate of the NCAA Women's Coaches Academy.

Former Saint Michael's standout defenseman Brent Hill enters his first season as an assistant coach with the Purple Knights' women's ice hockey team in 2006-07. Hill will be working primarily with the team's goaltenders.



Dr. Marc A. vanderHeyden was born in Ghent, Belgium, in 1938. He earned a diploma in classical studies and a bachelor's degree in philosophy, followed by a certificate of theological studies with great distinction—all from Belgian institutions. He then entered The Catholic University of America, where he received master's and doctoral degrees in history. His dissertation is titled "The Reactions of the Press in Ghent to the Social Revolt of March, 1886." Dr. vanderHeyden is fluent in three languages and has a

working knowledge of five more. He has an acute sense of the need for globally informed education that goes beyond one's own borders.

As president of Saint Michael's College, Dr. vanderHeyden continues to demonstrate his ability to move academic programs forward as well as his extraordinary interest in building a collegial community of students, faculty and staff working together to advance student learning. Since his inauguration on October 19, 1996, he has involved all of the College's constituencies in developing a shared vision of Saint Michael's—to be a superior, Catholic, liberal arts, undergraduate, residential college, excelling in the preparation of students for lifelong learning in a global society. He is also committed to making the institution part of the surrounding community's arts and cultural environment as well as the many volunteer services in the region.

Dr. vanderHeyden is an active member of various professional, government, charitable, business, arts, health care and religious groups at the local, regional and national levels. He currently serves on the boards of the following organizations: Association of Vermont Independent Colleges (AVIC), Eleanor Roosevelt Center at Val-Kill (ERVK), Green Mountain Power (GMP), New England Board of Higher Education (NEBHE, an appointment made by the governor of Vermont), Vermont Business Roundtable (VBR), Vermont Health Foundation (VHF) and Vermont Higher Education Council (VHEC).

Previously, Dr. vanderHeyden has held dual teaching and administrative positions at three American institutions. At Rider University in Lawrenceville, NJ, he started as assistant professor of history in 1968, becoming an associate professor in 1973 and earning the National Lindback Award for distinguished teaching. During his last years at Rider (1978-79), he also served as associate dean of the school of liberal arts and sciences and acting chair of the graduate program for administrators. In 1979, Dr. vanderHeyden was named vice president for academic affairs and dean of the faculty at Cedar Crest College in Allentown, PA, where he was also professor of history. Then, in 1986, he was appointed vice president for academic affairs and professor of history at Marist College in Poughkeepsie, NY. As a historian, Dr. vanderHeyden has lectured on Erasmus, Peter Abelard, Zwingli, Joan of Arc, French Calvinist Reformers and Martin Luther, and the Renaissance and Reformation in 16th century Europe.

Dr. vanderHeyden is a naturalized American citizen and is married to Dana Lim vanderHeyden. She, too, has pursued a career as a faculty member and academic administrator.





Geri Knortz
Athletics Director

On May 7, 1997, Geraldine S. Knortz became the fifth athletics director in the College's 93-year history, and the first woman to ever hold the position.

"We were looking for someone with the leadership abilities to carry Saint Michael's into the 21st century, with concern for all students," college president Marc A. vanderHeyden said. "I am convinced we have found the right person in

Geri Knortz."

While at Saint Michael's, Knortz has guided the successful transition of the women's ice hockey program to varsity status and the men's ice hockey program's move to the ECAC East Conference. Knortz has also been instrumental in the addition of numerous full-time coaching positions, improvements to coaches offices, the renovation of the Ross Sports Center gymnasium floor in 2001, and the construction of the Duffy Artificial Turf Field in 2005.

Under her leadership, notable team successes include the field hockey team's semifinal finish at the 2000 and 2001 NCAA Championship, the men's basketball "Sweet Sixteen" appearance in 2001, and the crowning of the men's hockey team as the 1999 NCAA Division II Champions.

Knortz has been a member of many college committees at Saint Michael's including: strategic planning, athletic advisory, technology steering, administrative council, and numerous search committees. At the national level, she currently serves on the NCAA Committee on Women's Athletics, and is past chair of the NCAA Division II Nominating Committee and the NCAA Postgraduate Scholarship Committee for the Northeast District. She is also active with the National Association of Collegiate Women Athletic Administrators.

Knortz prepared well for her opportunity at Saint Michael's during a very successful 15 year career at Hamilton College, where she held the position of associate director of athletics and senior woman administrator. She was also a professor of physical education (tenured 1987), and coached two varsity sports: volleyball and softball. She is a 1974 graduate (magna cum laude) of the State University of New York at Cortland, where she earned a bachelor of science in physical education and mathematics. She went on to earn her master of science in education at Northern Illinois University in 1978, and a master of science in administration at Saint Michael's in 2005.



Chris Kenny
Associate Athletics Director

Now in his 20th year as a college employee, Chris Kenny is primarily responsible for NCAA compliance, marketing, development, and sport administration. Kenny is a product of Saint Michael's, earning a bachelor of arts degree in journalism and master of science degree in administration and management at the College.

After a brief stint as public relations director in the Cincinnati Reds and Philadelphia Phillies minor league systems following graduation, he returned to his alma mater to be the College's sports information director, a position he held for eight years. A member of the athletic department since 1975, Zaf Bludevich has been involved in nearly every aspect of Saint Michael's athletics since his arrival 30 years ago.

Bludevich has served as associate athletic director, head athletic trainer, summer camp director, intramural director and has coached several sports. From

1975 to 2003, he served as the College's head athletic trainer, and in 2004 was promoted to his current title.

A 1993 Saint Michael's Hall of Fame inductee, Bludevich has served on numerous committees and received several awards for his tireless efforts and dedication to Purple Knights athletics. He has held the positions of treasurer and secretary on the Vermont Association of Athletic Trainers and been a member of the NCAA Ice Hockey Rules and Women's Championship committees and ECAC Cross Country and Track Committee.

A 1974 graduate of Norwich University (and 2004 Norwich Hall of Fame inductee), where he received his bachelor's degree in physical education, he earned his master's in education/athletic training in 1975. In 1991, he received a degree in physical therapy from the University of Vermont.

Facilities



Duffy Field at Doc Jacobs Complex (left) is Saint Michael's brand-new artificial turf playing field built in the summer of 2005. It is home to Saint Michael's field hockey team, in addition to women's soccer and men's and women's lacrosse. The field was made possible due to a generous lead gift by John and Kathy Duffy, whose son, Kevin, played lacrosse at Saint Michael's. The Duffys made their gift in memory of their son Christopher, who died in the September 11, 2001 attack on the World Trade Center. Doc Jacobs Complex also has a natural grass soccer field, a softball and baseball field, and one of the finest natural grass field hockey fields in New England.



The Saint Michael's basketball teams and women's volleyball team play in the Ross Sports Center, which was renovated in the summer of 2001. A new state-of-the-art floor was put down to replace the previous one that existed since the building opened in 1973. The gym is highly regarded as one of the best Division II facilities in the Northeast.



The Ross Sports Center pool is home to the Purple Knights swimming and diving teams. The 25-yard, six-lane pool is also the home of Green Mountain Aquatics.



The Tarrant Recreation Center, named after the parents of former basketball All-American Rich Tarrant '65, offers students indoor basketball, tennis, racquetball and squash courts. It also has a 1/8 mile suspended indoor track.



The Fitness Center provides a wide variety of cardiovascular and weight-training equipment, including free weights, for all Saint Michael's students, alumni, faculty members and staff.
