Match Notes

- Santa Clara has won the last seven WCC meetings between the two teams. The Broncos have outscored the Dons 23-5 in those matches.
- San Francisco pulled the upset earlier this year in the City in a nonconference match up.
- Santa Clara has gone 31-1-4 over the last five seasons in the WCC, winning each of the last three conference titles.

Season Notes

- Santa Clara topped Pacific 5-1 on Saturday.
- This season the Broncos have outscored their opponents 33-9. They have outshot their opponents 223-103 and 102-42 in shots on target and have drawn 99 corners and given up 34.
- Farrah Walters leads the team with 10 goals and 22 points while adding two assists. Colby Barnett, Mailin Orozco, and Jordyn Crosby have each scored three goals with
- Sally Menti, Makoto Nezu, Leah O'Brien, and Holly Furphy each finding the back of the net twice each. Six others have scored once apiece giving the Broncos 14 goal scorers this year.
- Menti's five assists lead the team and Addie Whitehouse has added four. Barnett, Nezu, and Alex Klos all have three. Seven others have two with six collecting one each. A total of 18 have registered an assist this year.
- Marlee Nicolos has taken over as the starter in net and has a 0.64 GAA with 24 saves for a .800 save percentage. She has four solo shutouts and one shared with Kylie Foutch who has appeared in six games, allowing three goals, and has a 0.66 GAA with a .750 save percentage.

Season Notes

- Walters picked up her second WCC Offensive Player of the Week honor on October 16 after registering a brace at Pacific. She was also picked September 24 after recording a hat trick against the Tigers.
- The sophomore is red hot lately, scoring seven goals in the team's last four matches with three multi-goal performances, giving her four on the year.
- Walters' hat trick was the 31st in program history and the second of her career. She also accomplished the feat September 8, 2022 when she scored her first three collegiate goals.
- Nicolos was named the WCC Defensive Player of the Week October 9 after making six saves in a shutout of Saint Mary's.
- The offense has been on fire over the past four matches, scoring 16 goals. It's the most in a four match stretch since scoring 22 over four matches in 2013. It's been a total team effort with 9 goal scorers and 12 with assists.
- Santa Clara's six goals against Pacific were their most since topping LMU 6-0 at home November 3, 2021.
- With the win over Pacific on October 14, the Broncos reached double-digit wins for the 15th year in a row and 36th time in Jerry Smith's 37 years leading the program.
- The Broncos were picked as preseason favorites in the West Coast Conference with a maximum of 64 points. Colby Barnett, Annie Karich, and Sally Menti were selected to the Preseason All-WCC team as well.
- Barnett, Karich, and Menti were also named to the United Soccer Coaches Midfielders to Watch list. Karich was also ranked No. 73 in Top Drawer Soccer's Top-100 Players list.
- The Broncos welcome eight newcomers to the roster for 2023. Malia Yamamoto, Addie Whitehouse, Jordyn Crosby, Jacey Martinez, Abby Kiil, Amaris Franco, and Mailin Orozco join as freshman with Ally Reynolds transferring from Virginia.
- They also welcome back two big weapons in Menti and Holly Furphy. Menti missed all of last season with an ACL injury and Furphy went down with the same injury in the fifth game of the season.
- Santa Clara got a head start on the season with a foreign trip to Germany, Switzerland, and Austria from June 22-July 1. The Broncos played three matches against professional teams overseas, going 2-0-1.
- The Broncos have gone 13-2-2 over the last five NCAA Tournaments despite playing just five matches at home. They have hosted the first round in nine of the last 12 seasons, including 2020 when games were not at campus sites.
- Overall, the Broncos are 64-25-6 in the NCAA Tournament and 38-3-3 at home. They have won at least one game in each of their last 10 appearances and haven't lost in the first round since 2007, a span of 13 appearances.
- Santa Clara has been to 32 NCAA Tournaments, 12 College Cups (1989, 1990, 1992, 1996, 1997, 1998, 1999, 2001, 2002, 2004, 2020, 2021), and won two National Championships (2001, 2020). The program is one of just eight with two or more national titles. Only three teams have more.
- The Broncos have won the West Coast Conference 13 times (1993, 1997, 1998, 1999, 2001, 2002, 2003, 2004, 2006, 2013, 2020, 2021, 2022).
- Head coach Jerry Smith is in his 37th year. He has 544 career wins, the third most Division I wins in women's soccer history.
