This will be the first meeting between the two programs.

Season Notes

- Santa Clara is averaging 66.6 ppg on the young season on 41.5-percent shooting from the field and 38.5-percent from downtown. The Broncos have a plus-7.4 rebound differential, averaging 38.6 pg and are dishing out 13.4 apg with 8.8 spg.
- Tess Heal is the leading scorer, averaging 18.2 ppg on 47.7-percent shooting from the field and is adding a team-high 4.0 apg. Olivia Pollerd is second with 11.4 ppg and has added 4.8 rpg while knocking down a team-high 11 3-pointers. Marya Hudgins' 9.2 rpg lead the team and she is scoring 9.2 ppg while and Keeley Frawley is second with 5.2 rpg.
- The Broncos had back-to-back 30+ point wins against CSUN (71-39) and at Oregon (89-50). It was the first time they had done that against two Division I opponents since January 30 and 31, 1998 against Portland (95-65) and Gonzaga (98-58). That season they finished 23-8 overall and 11-3 in the WCC. They won both the conference regular season and tournament championships that season and made the NCAA Tournament.

Season Notes

- The plus-71 point differential in two games was the most against DI opponents since the December 13 and 15 at Cal Poly (85-61, plus-24) and at Sacramento State (88-31, plus-57) when they were plus-81.
- The 39-point win over the Ducks was the Broncos biggest ever over a Pac-12 opponent.
- Oregon had lost just one of its previous 61 nonconference games at Matthew Knight Arena in Eugene.
- Santa Clara's 16 3-pointers made at Oregon were the second-most in a game in program history. The program record is 18 at Portland on January 8, 2006.
- Tess Heal was named the WCC Player of the Week on November 20.
 She averaged 20.0 ppg in the Broncos two games while going 13-of-22 from the field and 6-of-7 from beyond the arc. She also added 13 assists in the pair of wins.
- Santa Clara was picked to finish tied for third in the WCC in a poll of the league's nine head coaches. It is their highest placement in the preseason poll since being picked third prior to the 2005-06 season.
- Heal was named to the Preseason All-WCC Team after her historic freshman campaign.
- Heal started all 32 games for Santa Clara while scoring 17.6 ppg and grabbing 4.3 rpg. She scored in double-figures in all but three contests and scored 20-plus 11 times, including a season-high of 39 against BYU. She also dished out five or more assists 13 different times.
- She scored 562 points, the fourth-most in a single season in Santa Clara history and the most by a freshman. She also landed on the single top-10 lists in made free throws (4th, 141), made field goals (t-4th, 200), and minutes played (8th, 1,031).
- Heal started all 32 games for Santa Clara while scoring 17.6 ppg and grabbing 4.3 rpg. She scored in double-figures in all but three contests and scored 20-plus 11 times, including a seasonhigh of 39 against BYU. She also dished out five or more assists 13 different times.
- Also back are key members of last year's squad Lara Edmanson, Olivia Pollerd, Marya Hudgins, and Ashley Hiraki. Edmanson finished second on the team in scoring with 10.6 ppg and led thew ay with 5.7 rpg. Pollerd scored 10.2 ppg with 3.6 rpg and knocked down a team-high 54 3-pointers. Hudgins joined Heal on the WCC All-Freshman Team while scoring 7.5 ppg with 4.8 rpg. Hiraki had a team-best 60 steals while scoring 6.6 ppg with 3.9 rpg.
- The Broncos were the second-best offense in the WCC, scoring 71.3 ppg, just 0.3 ppg behind Gonzaga.
- They were also third with 14.6 assists per game, first with 12.8 turnovers per game, and first with a 1.14 assist-to-turnover ratio.
- As a team Santa Clara shot 43.1-percent from the field.
- The Broncos have seven international players on the roster. Keeley Frawley, Olivia Pollerd, Lara Edmanson, Jayde Cadee, and Tess Heal are from Australia while Georgia Grigoropoulou and Rafailia Stergaki are from Greece.
- Bill Carr picked up his 300th win as a head coach at Oregon on November 18. He is at 98 with the Broncos.
