Series History

Match Notes

- Santa Clara has not played Boise State in almost 14 years.
- The Broncos and Red Raiders first meeting was in the second round of the 1992 NCAA Tournament.
- The three teams have combined for one loss in their first 14 games.
- Santa Clara has won its last three games by at least 21 points.

Season Notes

- Santa Clara is averaging 68.0 ppg on the young season on 41.6-percent shooting from the field and 36.4-percent from downtown. The Broncos have a plus-8.3 rebound differential, averaging 39.3 pg and are dishing out 14.0 apg.
- Defensively, they are holding opponents to 52.0 ppg and have allowed more than 54 points just once. Teams are being held to 23.6-percent from beyond the arc with Santa Clara adding 8.7 spg while forcing 17.7 tpg.
- Tess Heal is the leading scorer, averaging 18.0 ppg on 50.0-percent shooting from the field and is adding a team-high 4.0 apg. Olivia Pollerd is second with 11.0 ppg and has added 5.3 rpg while knocking down a team-high 12 3-pointers. Marya Hudgins' 7.5 rpg lead the team and she is scoring 8.3 ppg while and Keeley Frawley is second with 6.0 rpg.

Season Notes

- The Broncos had back-to-back 30+ point wins against CSUN (71-39) and at Oregon (89-50). It was the first time they had done that against two Division I opponents since January 30 and 31, 1998 against Portland (95-65) and Gonzaga (98-58). That season they finished 23-8 overall and 11-3 in the WCC. They won both the conference regular season and tournament championships that season and made the NCAA Tournament.
- The plus-71 point differential in two games was the most against DI opponents since the December 13 and 15 at Cal Poly (85-61, plus-24) and at Sacramento State (88-31, plus-57) when they were plus-81.
- By beating Texas A&M Corpus Christi 75-54 in their next game, the Broncos had a winning streak of three games against DI opponents with all victories coming by 20 or more points for the first time since December 2001. They beat Temple (86-66), Portland State (73-49), and CSUN (103-58).
- The 39-point win over the Ducks was the Broncos biggest ever over a Pac-12 opponent.
- Oregon had lost just one of its previous 61 nonconference games at Matthew Knight Arena in Eugene.
- Santa Clara's 16 3-pointers made at Oregon were the second-most in a game in program history. The program record is 18 at Portland on January 8, 2006.
- Tess Heal was named the WCC Player of the Week on November 20.
 She averaged 20.0 ppg in the Broncos two games while going 13-of-22 from the field and 6-of-7 from beyond the arc. She also added 13 assists in the pair of wins.
- Santa Clara was picked to finish tied for third in the WCC in a poll of the league's nine head coaches. It is their highest placement in the preseason poll since being picked third prior to the 2005-06 season.
- Heal was named to the Preseason All-WCC Team after her historic freshman campaign.
- Heal started all 32 games for Santa Clara while scoring 17.6 ppg and grabbing 4.3 rpg. She scored in double-figures in all but three contests and scored 20-plus 11 times, including a season-high of 39 against BYU. She also dished out five or more assists 13 different times.
- She scored 562 points, the fourth-most in a single season in Santa Clara history and the most by a freshman. She also landed on the single top-10 lists in made free throws (4th, 141), made field goals (t-4th, 200), and minutes played (8th, 1,031).
- Heal started all 32 games for Santa Clara while scoring 17.6 ppg and grabbing 4.3 rpg. She scored in double-figures in all but three contests and scored 20-plus 11 times, including a seasonhigh of 39 against BYU. She also dished out five or more assists 13 different times.
- The Broncos have seven international players on the roster. Keeley Frawley, Olivia Pollerd, Lara Edmanson, Jayde Cadee, and Tess Heal are from Australia while Georgia Grigoropoulou and Rafailia Stergaki are from Greece.
- Bill Carr picked up his 300th win as a head coach at Oregon on November 18. He is at 99 with the Broncos.
