#### **Match Notes**

- Santa Clara is a seven-seed in the tournament.
- This will be the third time the programs have played in the NCAA Tournament. Santa Clara has won both meetings. Both were played at Santa Clara in the second round. In 2002 the Broncos won 5-1 and in 2003 they won 1-0.
- The Broncos have won their first round match-up for the last eight years.

#### **Season Notes**

- This season the Broncos have outscored their opponents 38-11. They have outshot their opponents 313-141 and 139-63 in shots on target and have drawn 134 corners and given up 41.
- Farrah Walters leads the team with 11 goals and 24 points while adding two assists. Jordyn Crosby has scored five times with Colby Barnett Mailin Orozco, and Sally Menti each adding three. Makoto Nezu, Leah O'Brien, and Holly Furphy finding the back of the net twice each. Seven others have scored once apiece giving the Broncos 15 goal scorers this
- Menti's eight assists lead the team and Barnett, Addie Whitehouse, and Alex Klos all have four. Nezu and Orozco both have three. Six others have two with seven collecting one each. A total of 19 have registered an assist this year.
- Marlee Nicolos has taken over as the starter in net and has a 0.55 GAA with 43 saves for a .843 save percentage. She has seven solo shutouts and one shared with Kylie Foutch who has appeared in six games, allowing three goals, and has a 0.66 GAA with a .750 save percentage.

#### **Season Notes**

- Walters picked up her second WCC Offensive Player of the Week honor on October 16 after registering a brace at Pacific. She was also picked September 24 after recording a hat trick against the Tigers.
- Walters' hat trick was the 31st in program history and the second of her career. She also accomplished the feat September 8, 2022 when she scored her first three collegiate goals.
- Nicolos was named the WCC Defensive Player of the Week October 9 after making six saves in a shutout of Saint Mary's. She won again on November 7 after a shutout with nine saves at Portland.
- Annie Karich was named the WCC Defensive Player of the Year. She was also First Team All-WCC, joined by Farrah Walters and Sally Menti. Colby Barnett was named to the Second Team with Alyssa Bourgeois and Lucy Mitchell taking home honorable mention. Jordyn Crosby, Mailin Orozco, and Malia Yamamoto were named All-Freshman.
- The offense scored 16 goals over four matches from September 24-October 14. It was the most in a four match stretch since scoring 22 over four matches in 2013. It's been a total team effort with 9 goal scorers and 12 with assists.
- Santa Clara's six goals against Pacific were their most since topping LMU 6-0 at home November 3, 2021.
- With the win over Pacific on October 14, the Broncos reached doubledigit wins for the 15th year in a row and 36th time in Jerry Smith's 37 years leading the program.
- The Broncos welcome eight newcomers to the roster for 2023. Malia Yamamoto, Addie Whitehouse, Jordyn Crosby, Jacey Martinez, Abby Kiil, Amaris Franco, and Mailin Orozco join as freshman with Ally Reynolds transferring from Virginia.
- They also welcome back two big weapons in Menti and Holly Furphy.
  Menti missed all of last season with an ACL injury and Furphy went down with the same injury in the fifth game of the season.
- Santa Clara got a head start on the season with a foreign trip to Germany, Switzerland, and Austria from June 22-July 1. The Broncos played three matches against professional teams overseas, going 2-0-1.
- The Broncos have gone 13-2-2 over the last five NCAA Tournaments despite playing just five matches at home. They have hosted the first round in nine of the last 12 seasons, including 2020 when games were not at campus sites.
- Overall, the Broncos are 64-25-6 in the NCAA Tournament and 38-3-3 at home. They have won at least one game in each of their last 10 appearances and haven't lost in the first round since 2007, a span of 13 appearances.
- Santa Clara has been to 32 NCAA Tournaments, 12 College Cups (1989, 1990, 1992, 1996, 1997, 1998, 1999, 2001, 2002, 2004, 2020, 2021), and won two National Championships (2001, 2020). The program is one of just eight with two or more national titles. Only three teams have more.
- The Broncos have won the West Coast Conference 13 times (1993, 1997, 1998, 1999, 2001, 2002, 2003, 2004, 2006, 2013, 2020, 2021, 2022).
- Head coach Jerry Smith is in his 37th year. He has 547 career wins, the third most Division I wins in women's soccer history.
