

## WOMEN'S SOCCER: BRONCOS OPEN SLATE WITH EXHIBITION AT BUCK SHAW, EASTERN ROAD TRIP

**BRONCOS OPEN VERSUS JAPANESE NATIONAL TEAM:** The Santa Clara women's soccer team opens the 1993 season with an exhibition match at Buck Shaw Stadium versus the Japanese National Team on Wednesday, Sept. 1 at 3:00. The Broncos open the regular season with road games on Saturday, Sept. 4 at Connecticut and Monday, Sept. 6 at Hartford. Here's a look at the opening week's slate for the Broncos:

**BRONCOS RANKED 5TH IN COLLEGE SPORTS MAGAZINE PRESEASON TOP 10:** Santa Clara has opened the season ranked fifth in the nation on *College Sports Magazine's* Pre-season Top 10. Last year, the Broncos finished the season ranked sixth in the nation on the Gatorade/ISAA coaches' poll. The Gatorade/ISAA preseason poll will be released every Tuesday during the season.

**HEAD COACH JERRY SMITH:** Santa Clara Head Coach Jerry Smith (CS Hayward '86) enters the 1993 season with a career record of 75-28-7 in six seasons at Santa Clara. Smith's 75 wins place him atop the Broncos all-time coaching wins list. Smith has led the Broncos to the post-season in each of the last four years, and last season was named the West Coast Conference coach of the Year after leading Santa Clara to a 12-5-2 record and its third National Semifinal berth in four years. Prior to coming to Santa Clara in 1987, Smith coached seven seasons at Homestead High School and one at Foothill College.

**FRESHMEN STEP INTO SPOTLIGHT:** For the second season in a row, SCU will have a pair of freshmen in the starting lineup in Mikka Hansen (F, 5-6, Fr., San Jose) and Erin Martinez (F, 5-4, Fr., Fremont). Both are slated to start in the Bronco front line and make an immediate impact. An added benefit to the two newcomers is that they have already had the opportunity to play as teammates on the West Regional U.S. Olympic Development Team.

**NEW GROUP SET TO START AT FORWARD:** The Broncos have an almost entirely new set of starting forwards this season. The coaching staff envisions a four-forward set with Erin Martinez and Barbara Riddle (F, 5-6, Sr., Albuquerque, NM) playing wide, and Mikka Hansen and Heidi Smartt (F, 5-5, So., Albuquerque, NM) in the middle. Riddle, who scored a career-high three goals last season, has spent the last two seasons as the Broncos spark off of the bench and will utilize her physical style and endurance on the outside. Smartt was a walk-on last season that has impressed the coaches with her work rate, speed and quickness. Christina DiGiacomo (F, 5-4, Sr., Austin, TX), a starter most of last season at forward and second on the team with five goals in 1992, will also see time up front, but will also be asked to fill in at other positions.

**LALOR HEADLINES OFFENSIVE ATTACK FROM MIDFIELD:** The linchpin of not only the midfield but the entire offense is midfielder Jennifer Lalor (MF, 5-2, So., Chula Vista), who recorded five assists and three goals last season. She is the player that the Broncos look to get the ball to in the middle to start the attack, and in addition to her ball-control and passing skills she has added a physical dimension to round out her game. An often unsung hero among the Bronco midfielders last season was Margaret Krawiec (MF, 5-5, Jr., Lakewood, CO), one of the hardest workers on the field. After two seasons in the starting lineup, Krawiec will be asked to shoulder more of the leadership burden this season as one of the most experienced members of the squad. Another Bronco that may see considerable time in the midfield is redshirt freshman Tracy Georgetti (MF, 5-6, Fr., San Jose). After sitting out the fall season last year, she impressed the coaches in the spring with her hard work and her decision-making skills. Lalor and Krawiec would start in a 4-2-4 set, with Amy Kroeger and Sherrie Buente moving up in a 3-4-3 set.

**TIPPIT MOVES INTO SWEEPER POSITION:** For the third season in a row, the Broncos enter the new season looking for a new sweeper. With the graduation of Lesley Low, a second-team All-WCC pick last season, Denise Tippit (D, 5-7, Sr., Foster City) looks to inherit the position. Joining Tippit in the backfield is Amy Kroeger (D, 5-8, So., Dana Point), fresh off of a freshman campaign where she established herself as one of the top defenders on the West Coast. An explosive player on offense as well as defense, Kroeger capped the 1992 season with a selection to the all-tournament team at the National Semifinals/Finals. In addition, Kroeger and Sherrie Buente (D, 5-4, Sr., Yorba Linda) will be asked to push forward and be a part of the offense more often this season. Rounding out the backfield are Maily Smitt (D, 5-6, Jr., Campbell) and Laura Brun (D, 5-8, So., Los Alamitos).

**MCDONALD TAKES OVER GOALKEEPING CHORES:** Perhaps the biggest loss off of last year's squad is goalkeeper Sue Wall. Her graduation leaves Dawn McDonald (GK, 5-4, Jr., San Jose) as the starting goalkeeper. Santa Clara will have a freshman goalkeeper on hand as well in Rachel Stoppello (GK, 5-7, Fr., Eagle, ID). A smart, hard-working player with good technique, she may give McDonald some competition for the starting job.

**ANOTHER TOUGH SCHEDULE LOOMS:** As usual, the Broncos will be facing a slate full of top-quality competition in 1993. The Broncos open up with two tough tests right off the bat, as they face UConn and Hartford on the road to open the season, both of which

were ranked as high as No. 3 in the nation last year. The road slate also includes stops at Washington, Washington State, Gonzaga, San Francisco, Saint Mary's and California, plus showdowns with Massachusetts and seven-time defending NCAA Champion North Carolina at the Saint Mary's Tournament. At home, the Broncos face Oregon State, San Diego, Cal Poly SLO, UC Irvine, Portland, Butler, Stanford, Loyola Marymount and UC Santa Barbara.

**NOTING CONNECTICUT:** Connecticut and Head Coach Len Tsantiris open the 1993 season versus the Broncos after finishing 15-5-1 in 1992 and falling in the first round of the NCAA Tournament. UConn returns 15 letterwinners off of the 1992 squad, including senior Karn Ferguson and junior Christy Rowe, who notched 17 and 15 points respectively in 1992. The Broncos and Huskies have met each of the last three seasons, with Connecticut winning in the 1990 National Semifinals 2-1 and the 1991 regular season 1-0, and the Broncos defeating the Huskies 3-0 last season in Buck Shaw Stadium.

**NOTING HARTFORD:** Hartford and 1992 Northeast Region Coach of the Year Austin Daniels open the 1993 season against the Broncos after finishing the 1992 season with a 19-2-0 record and reaching the National Semifinals, where it lost to Duke. The Hawks lose six starters off of last year's team, but return All-American senior forward Rose Daley (14 goals, four assists in 1992) and sophomore midfielder Jessica Reifer (11 goals, seven assists). The Broncos and Hawks have met twice before, with Santa Clara winning 1-0 in 1991 and Hartford victorious 1-0 last season.

### **SCU WOMEN'S SOCCER OPENS 1993 SEASON RANKED NINTH Squad Opens Season with Exhibition Versus Japanese National Team Tomorrow**

SANTA CLARA, Calif.—The Santa Clara University women's soccer squad will open the 1993 season ranked ninth on the adidas/ISAA Pre-Season Coaches Poll.

The Broncos and Head Coach Jerry Smith have reached the National Semifinals in three of the past four seasons, including last year. This season, the Broncos look to implement a more up-tempo style of play. For the second season in a row, Santa Clara will feature a pair of freshmen in the starting lineup, as Mikka Hansen and Erin Martinez join last year's freshman sensations Jennifer Lalor and Amy Kroeger.

Santa Clara was ranked sixth on the final poll last season, their highest ranking of the year.

The Broncos open the 1993 season with an exhibition match with the Japanese National Team tomorrow in Buck Shaw Stadium. There will be a full 90-minute match beginning at 3:00 p.m. followed by a 45-minute scrimmage between each team's second string. The Broncos regular-season opener is on Sept. 4 at the University of Connecticut.

## WOMEN'S SOCCER: BRONCOS SWEEP ROAD TRIP, OPEN HOME SLATE VERSUS OREGON STATE, SAN DIEGO

**BRONCOS OPEN WCC SLATE THIS WEEK:** The Santa Clara women's soccer team, 2-0-0 overall this season, opens its home slate with a pair of matches at Buck Shaw Stadium this week, including a West Coast Conference match vs. San Diego. The Broncos take on Oregon State on Sept. 11 at 7:30 p.m., and host the Toreros on Sept. 12 at 2:00 p.m.:

**BRONCOS RANKED 9TH IN ADIDAS/ISAA PRE-SEASON POLL:** Santa Clara opened the season ranked ninth in the nation on the adidas/ISAA coaches poll. The coaches poll is released each Tuesday during the regular season. Last year, Santa Clara concluded the season ranked sixth, the Broncos highest ranking of 1992. Santa Clara's two wins this week were each on the road versus Top 10 teams (No. 7 Connecticut, No. 4 Hartford).

**HEAD COACH JERRY SMITH:** Santa Clara Head Coach Jerry Smith (CS Hayward '86) enters the this week's action with a career record of 77-28-7 (.719) in six-plus seasons at Santa Clara. Smith's 77 wins place him atop the Broncos all-time coaching wins list. Smith has led the Broncos to the post-season in each of the last four years, and last season was named the West Coast Conference coach of the Year after leading Santa Clara to a 12-5-2 record and its third National Semifinal berth in four years. Prior to coming to Santa Clara in 1987, Smith coached seven seasons at Homestead High School and one at Foothill College.

**BRONCOS WIN SIXTH STRAIGHT SEASON OPENER:** Santa Clara's 4-1 win over Connecticut was the Broncos sixth straight season-opening victory. The last time the Broncos dropped a season opener was in 1987, a 2-1 loss to CS Sonoma in Jerry Smith's first game as Bronco head coach. Since then, SCU is 6-0 in such games, and has outscored its opponents 29-2.

**STREAK BUSTERS:** With victories at Connecticut and Hartford in the season openers for each team, the Broncos did a little streak stopping. The 4-1 victory over UConn marked the first time in 15 years that the Huskies had lost a home opener. The 2-0 win at Hartford halted the Hawks' nine-year unbeaten streak in season openers.

**DÉJA VU:** For the second season in a row, the Broncos won their season opener on the road behind a player's first two career goals. Last year, defender Maily Smitt (Campbell, CA) notched her first two career scores as Santa Clara defeated Oregon State 4-0. This year, freshman Mikka Hansen (San Jose, CA) recorded a pair of goals in her first career collegiate game as the Broncos defeated Connecticut 4-1. If that wasn't coincidental enough, both times Bronco midfielder Jennifer Lalor (Chula Vista, CA) assisted on both goals.

**STILL MORE DÉJA VU:** Hansen's performance against the Huskies was a coincidence in another way, as well—it marked the second year in a row that a Bronco freshman has scored two goals in a game against UConn. Last season, Amy Kroeger (Dana Point, CA) drilled a pair of goals and added an assist in Santa Clara's 3-0 victory over Connecticut. In the Bronco win on Saturday, she added another goal.

**FRESHMEN SHINE:** In addition to her performance against UConn, Hansen added another goal, the game-winner, at Hartford in the Broncos 2-0 win over the Hawks. That match proved a showcase for SCU freshmen, as Tracy Georgetti (San Jose, CA) also recorded her first goal. Both Georgetti and Hansen are local San Jose products out of Presentation High School. Freshman goalkeeper Rachel Stoppello (Eagle, ID) recorded six saves and her first career shutout vs. Hartford, despite 22 shots on goal for the Hawks.

**NOTING OREGON STATE:** Oregon State and Head Coach Tom Rowney opened the season with a 3-1 loss at Portland. Senior forward Jenna Leavitt recorded the lone OSU goal, with nicki Alley recording the assist. Freshman Michelle Mitchell mans the nets. The Broncos and Beavers have met each of the last four seasons, with the Broncos taking all four contests by a cumulative 18-1 score.

**NOTING SAN DIEGO:** The San Diego program enters its second season under Head Coach Tony da Luz. The Toreros fell 3-1 in overtime at UC Santa Barbara in its opener, as returning All-WCC performer Dawn Birdsall scored the San Diego goal. Sophomore Danielle Lopez is in the nets. Santa Clara and San Diego met in the Toreros first-ever WCC match last year, with SCU winning 2-1.

**BRONCOS SWEEP EAST COAST SWING:** Santa Clara opened the season impressively, with a pair of road wins over opponents ranked in the Top 10. At the conclusion of the week, the Broncos were 2-0-0.

- On Sept. 4 in Storrs, the Broncos defeated seventh-ranked Connecticut 4-1. Mikka Hansen scored two goals within a 1:04 span in the second half to break open what was a 1-0 game and help the Broncos deal UConn its first loss in a home opener in 15 years. Denise Tippit and Amy Kroeger accounted for the other two SCU goals.
- On Sept. 6 in Hartford, Santa Clara upped its record to 2-0-0 with a 2-0 victory over the fourth-ranked Hawks. After a scoreless first half, Hansen struck again with a second-half score to break a 0-0 deadlock. Tracy Georgetti also scored and Rachel Stoppello recorded her first career shutout.

### **MIKKA HANSEN NAMED WEST COAST CONFERENCE PLAYER OF THE WEEK Scores Three Goals as Bronco Women's Soccer Defeats Two Top-10 Teams**

SANTA CLARA, Calif.—Santa Clara freshman forward Mikka Hansen has been named the West Coast Conference Player of the Week for women's soccer, the conference announced today. Hansen tallied three goals over the weekend as the ninth-ranked Broncos opened the season with road wins at seventh-ranked Connecticut and fourth-ranked Hartford.

The freshman out of San Jose's Presentation High School made her Santa Clara debut on Saturday, Sept. 4 by scoring a pair of goals in a 1:04 span versus Connecticut in Storrs. Her two scores came early in the second half, and broke open what had been a 1-0 game as the Broncos went on to win 4-1.

She struck again at Hartford on Monday, Sept. 6, breaking a scoreless tie in the second half in a match the Broncos would go on to win 2-0.

Hansen and the Broncos open their home schedule this weekend with a pair of matches in Buck Shaw Stadium. Santa Clara will host Oregon State on Saturday, Sept. 11 at 7:30 p.m. and San Diego on Sunday, Sept. 12 at 2:00 p.m.

SANTA CLARA, CA—The Broncos outshot Oregon State 22-0 and freshman forward Erin Martinez out of Mission San Jose High School in Fremont tallied two assists as Santa Clara racked up a 3-0 win over visiting Oregon State in women's soccer action at Buck Shaw Stadium. Santa Clara upped its season record to 3-0-0, while Oregon State fell to 1-2-0.

Santa Clara scored all three of its goals in the first half, the first two coming in a 1:04 span. At 25:19, junior defender Maily Smitt scored her first goal of the year when she headed Martinez's corner kick past OSU goalkeeper Michelle Mitchell. At 26:23 Martinez took a feed from sophomore defender Amy Kroeger and in turn fed redshirt freshman Heidi Smartt for her first career goal. Junior midfielder Margaret Krawiec capped the scoring at 42:21, when she took a cross from sophomore Jennifer Lalor and drilled the goal from the top of the box.

Martinez peppered the San Diego net with a West Coast Conference record 13 shots on goal.

**BRONCOS RANKED 9TH IN ADIDAS/ISAA PRE-SEASON POLL:** Santa Clara opened the season ranked ninth in the nation on the adidas/ISAA coaches poll. The coaches poll is released each Tuesday during the regular season. Last year, Santa Clara concluded the season ranked sixth, the Broncos highest ranking of 1992. Santa Clara already has two wins over Top-10 teams this season.

**HEAD COACH JERRY SMITH:** Santa Clara Head Coach **Jerry Smith (CS Hayward '86)** enters the this week's action with a career record of 79-28-7 (.724) in six-plus seasons at Santa Clara. Smith's 79 wins place him atop the Broncos all-time coaching wins list. Smith has led the Broncos to the post-season in each of the last four years, and last season was named the West Coast Conference coach of the Year after leading Santa Clara to a 12-5-2 record and its third National Semifinal berth in four years. Prior to coming to Santa Clara in 1987, Smith coached seven seasons at Homestead High School and one at Foothill College.

**SHUTOUT:** The Broncos controlled the ball so effectively in Santa Clara's 3-0 victory over Oregon State that the Beavers were unable to get off a shot the entire game. The last time that Santa Clara held an opponent shotless was October 27, 1990, when the Broncos outshot UC Irvine 18-0 on the way to a 7-0 victory.

**MAKING THEIR POINTS:** Santa Clara's 6-1 victory over San Diego marked the highest goal output for the Broncos since a 7-1 victory over Oregon State in the season opener of 1991. Freshman forward **Mikka Hansen (San Jose, CA)** scored two goals for the Broncos, the second time she has scored twice in a game this season. Hansen now has five goals in four career collegiate games. Hansen was named the WCC Player of the Week on Sept. 7, after scoring twice at Connecticut and once at Hartford in the Broncos season-opening road sweep of those two Top-10 teams.

**HIT ME WITH YOUR BEST SHOT:** Freshman forward **Erin Martinez (Fremont, CA)** peppered the net with a West Coast Conference record 13 shots on goal in the Broncos victory over San Diego. In the second half she scored her first goal of the season. Smith has led the Broncos to the post-season in each of the last four years, and last season was named the West Coast Conference coach of the Year after leading Santa Clara to a 12-5-2 record and its third National Semifinal berth in four years. Prior to coming to Santa Clara in 1987, Smith coached seven seasons at Homestead High School and one at Foothill College.

**HANSEN NAMED WCC PLAYER OF THE WEEK:** Freshman forward Mikka Hansen (San Jose, CA) was named WCC Player of the Week on Oct. 11 for her performances as the Broncos swept two WCC matches. Hansen recorded two assists in SCU's 4-0 win at USF on Oct. 5, then drilled second-ranked Portland for two goals, including the game-winner in the second overtime, in the Broncos 3-1 win. Hansen's second goal in the Portland game was from 35 yards out, and placed into the upper left corner of the net. Over the last three games, the freshman has recorded five goals and three assists for 13 total points. **ALMOST 3,000 SEE BRONCOS KNOCK OFF PORTLAND:** The second-largest home crowd in the history of Santa Clara women's soccer turned out on Oct. 8 as 2,790 fans filled Buck Shaw Stadium to see third-ranked Santa Clara defeat second-ranked Portland 3-1 in overtime. The largest home crowd for a Bronco match was on Oct. 4, 1991, when 3,208 showed up for a Santa Clara-North Carolina match.

**BRONCOS WRAP UP A SHARE OF WCC TITLE:** Santa Clara's 5-1 win at Saint Mary's on Wednesday gave the Broncos at least a share of their first ever West Coast Conference title. Santa Clara is the only WCC team unbeaten in conference play, and can clinch the crown for themselves with a win over Loyola Marymount on Oct. 31. The WCC is in its second season as a sponsor of women's soccer. Portland won the first WCC title last season.

**RANKING WITH THE BEST:** Santa Clara's 3-1 overtime win over Portland on Oct. 8 gave the Broncos a 5-1-0 record against ranked opponents in 1993, with four wins coming on the road. Santa Clara has a 10-3-1 record against its last 14 ranked opponents, going back to a 3-0 win over Duke on Sept. 20, 1992. The Broncos have three matches remaining on the regular-season schedule versus teams currently ranked in the adidas/ISAA Top-20, including today's match vs. California

**GETTING OFFENSIVE:** With five more goals at Saint Mary's, Santa Clara continues to set a school-record scoring pace. Prior to coming to Santa Clara in 1987, Smith coached seven seasons at Homestead High School and one at Foothill College.

**RANKING WITH THE BEST:** Santa Clara's 3-2 loss to North Carolina and 1-0 win over Massachusetts in the Saint Mary's Fall Soccer Classic give the Broncos a 4-1-0 record against ranked opponents in 1993, with all four wins coming on the road. Santa Clara has a 9-3-1 record against its last 13 ranked opponents, going back to a 3-0 win over Duke on Sept. 20, 1992. The Broncos have four matches remaining on the regular-season schedule versus teams currently ranked in the adidas/ISAA Top-20.

**GETTING OFFENSIVE:** With eight more goals in two matches last week, Santa Clara continues to set a school-record scoring pace. In 11 matches, the Broncos have registered 38 goals and 39 assists, putting the Broncos on a pace to score 65 goals and 67 assists by the end of the regular season, which would shatter the school records of 58 goals and 53 assists, both set in 1987. The 38 scores and 39 assists this season already surpass the Broncos totals of 35 goals and 30 assists in 1992.

**LALOR NAMED WCC PLAYER OF THE WEEK:** Sophomore midfielder Jennifer Lalor (Chula Vista, CA) was named the West Coast Conference Player of the Week on Oct. 4, becoming the third Bronco to earn the award this year. She also becomes the first non-freshman to claim the honor this year (Mikka Hansen and Erin Martinez of Santa Clara, Denise Kenyon of USF, Justi Baumgardt of Portland). Lalor earned the honor after scoring twice and adding an assist in the Broncos 3-0 win over Cal Poly SLO, and adding two more assists in Santa Clara's 5-0 win over UC Irvine.

**MIKKA'S NEW HAT:** Bronco freshman forward Mikka Hansen (San Jose, CA) became the sixth player in Bronco history to record a hat trick with three goals and an assist in the Broncos 5-0 victory over UC Irvine on Oct. 2. Hansen had been held without a goal in the three previous matches, the longest such span in her brief career, before scoring her seventh, eighth and ninth goals of the season. Hansen leads the Broncos with nine goals and 21 total points. Santa Clara has now had a player turn a hat trick in each of the last four seasons (Lesley Low in 1990, Kristi DeVert and Debbie Norbutas in 1991, Norbutas in 1992).

Lalor's 10 assists lead the squad and tie for the fourth-highest single-season total in school history. Her 15 career assists tie Emily Saarenas for ninth in SCU history. Martinez's nine assists in 1993 tie Debbie Norbutas's 1990 total for the eighth-best single-season total.

**NOTING PORTLAND:** The second-ranked Pilots and Head Coach Clive Charles enter the week with a 8-1-0 record and a match at Loyola Marymount on Oct. 4 before coming to Santa Clara. Since their lone loss to North Carolina on Sept. 10, the Pilots have reeled off a school-record six consecutive shutouts, and outscored opponents 35-0. Portland is without the services of Tiffeny Milbrett, second in the nation in scoring in 1992, but sophomore Shannon MacMillan is among the nation's leaders with 12 goals and eight assists for 32 total points. Michelle Voiland has recorded a 0.55 goals-against average and four shutouts. Though Santa Clara leads the all-time series with the Pilots 6-3-0, Portland has won the last two matches, including a 3-1 decision last year in Portland.

**LALOR NEARS SCHOOL ASSIST MARK:** Bronco midfielder **Jennifer Lalor (Chula Vista, CA)** scored a goal and added two assists versus Loyola Marymount, upping her season assist total to 15. That total is the second highest single-season mark in Bronco history, and trails just Tamie Batista's 17 in 1987. Lalor's 20 career assists rank as the seventh-highest career total in Santa Clara history.

**NOTING STANFORD:** The Cardinal and first-year Head Coach Ian Sawyers are 15-2-1 entering the Nov. 4 match in Buck Shaw Stadium. Second-ranked Stanford has won its last three games by 4-0 (California), 4-0 (Butler) and 4-1 (Colorado College) scores. Sarah Rafanelli and Erin Martin lead the Stanford attack with 16 and 14 goals, respectively, accounting for almost half of the Cardinal's 62 team goals. Leslie Garrard ranks among the nation's leaders with a 0.40 goals-against average and 14 shutouts. The all-time series between Santa Clara and Stanford stands tied at 6-6-4, but the Broncos are 4-1-1 against the Cardinal since 1989. Last season, the teams tied 1-1 during the regular season and Santa Clara defeated the Cardinal 2-0 in the NCAA Playoffs, with both matches taking place at Stanford's Maloney Field.

**NOTING UCSB:** The Gauchos and Head Coach Tad Bobak enter their Nov. 6 match in Buck Shaw Stadium with a 13-5-0 record. UCSB is ranked 16th in the nation, and is led by Phronsie Franco's seven goals. Amy Goodwin leads the Gauchos in the nets with a 0.95 goals-against average and eight shutouts. UCSB has won seven wins in its last eight matches, including a 1-0 victory over California on Oct. 31. The Gauchos lead the all-time series 7-4-3. Last year's 2-1 Gaucho win at Santa Barbara snapped a four-match win streak for the Broncos in the series.

**BRONCOS CLINCH WCC WITH LOYOLA MARYMOUNT WIN:** In the Broncos lone match last week, Santa Clara defeated Loyola Marymount 7-0 as seven different players scored goals. The win gave Santa Clara the West Coast Conference Championship as they ran the table in the league season, finishing 6-0-0 in WCC games. Overall, the Broncos are 14-3-0.

SANTA CLARA, CA—Sarah Rafanelli, Stanford's leading scorer, drilled two goals in a 1:31 span as the second-ranked Cardinal women's soccer team defeated fourth-ranked Santa Clara 2-0 in front of a crowd of 3,457 in Buck Shaw Stadium. The win concluded Stanford's regular season at 16-2-1, while Santa Clara, which still has one regular-season match remaining on Saturday versus 12th-ranked UC Santa Barbara, fell to 14-4-0.

The victory for Stanford was a key one in the race to host the NCAA Western Regional. The regional will be held on Nov. 13-14 at the home field of one of the four invited teams, with the winner moving on to the National Semifinals.

After a scoreless first half, it was the Stanford offense that smothered the Santa Clara net in the early minutes of the second period. The Cardinal got off seven shots on the Bronco goal before SCU was able to get off a shot in the half. SCU succeeded in creating several scoring opportunities later in the match, Cardinal senior goalkeeper Leslie Garrard successfully held off the Bronco barrage.

Rafanelli struck with both of her goals early in the second half. At 54:50, Cardinal freshman Erin Martin hit the junior with a pass five yards in front of the goal, and she drilled it past Stoppello for a 1-0 Cardinal lead. Just a minute and a half later, Rafanelli struck again as she drove around the right corner and drilled the ball into the left side of the net for the final 2-0 margin.

The official attendance of 3,457 was the largest crowd ever to see a Bronco women's soccer match in Buck Shaw Stadium, surpassing the 3,208 that saw the Broncos take on North Carolina on Oct. 4, 1991.

**ALL-TIME BEST CROWD WATCHES STANFORD MATCH:** On Nov. 4, 3,457 fans came to Buck Shaw Stadium to watch No. 2 Stanford defeat No. 4 Santa Clara 2-0. The crowd was the largest ever to come to Buck Shaw Stadium to watch a women's soccer match, and was the third crowd this year of better than 1,800 fans (1,892 vs. North Carolina at Saint Mary's, 2,790 vs. Portland). The attendance broke the former record of 3,208 on Oct. 4, 1991, when the Broncos hosted North Carolina. Over 1,200 fans were present at the Broncos 3-0 win over UC Santa Barbara on Saturday, making the tally over 4,700 fans for the two-game set.

**NOTING PORTLAND:** The seventh-ranked Pilots and Head Coach Clive Charles enter the NCAA Tournament with a 15-3-1 overall record. Portland finished second in the WCC with a 5-1-0 conference mark. The Pilots are led by sophomore sensation Shannon MacMillan, who leads the West Region with 22 goals and 56 total points. Leslie Garrard mans the nets with a 0.38 goals-against average, the lowest in the West Region, and 15 shutouts. Stanford now leads the all-time series 7-6-4, with the two teams having split in two playoff matches. California and Head Coach Andy Bonchonsky were unbeaten at 9-0-4 and ranked No. 2 in the nation after defeating the Broncos 1-0 in Berkeley on Oct. 17, but have since gone 1-3-0 to finish the regular season at 10-3-4. Senior Erika Hinton, who scored the Bears goal in the win over SCU, leads the team with nine goals and 23 total points. Senior Alexis Thompson has added eight goals and 21 total points. Junior goalkeeper Kyla Schmedding has recorded a 0.97 goals-against average and five shutouts. Schmedding recorded six second-half saves in the Santa Clara match. **SANTA CLARA FALLS TO PORTLAND IN NCAA FIRST ROUND:** The Broncos competed in the NCAA Tournament for the fifth successive year, but fell to Portland 2-0 in the Western Regional semifinal at Stanford's Maloney Field to finish the season at 15-5-0. The 15 wins for the Broncos marked the second-highest victory total in the program's history, trailing only the 18 wins posted by the 1990 squad.

**BRONCOS FINISH SEASON RANKED 4TH IN ADIDAS/ISAA COACHES POLL, 4TH IN SOCCER NEWS POLL:** Santa Clara ended the season ranked fourth in the nation on both the adidas/ISAA Coaches' Poll and the Soccer News Poll. The ranking was Santa Clara's third highest season-ending ranking in the program's history. During the season, the Broncos were ranked as high as No. 2 in the nation. SCU has achieved a ranking as high as No. 2 in three out of the last four years, and as high as No. 3 in four of the last five.

**HEAD COACH JERRY SMITH:** Santa Clara Head Coach Jerry Smith (CS Hayward '86) concludes his seventh season at Santa Clara with a career record of 90-33-7 (.719). Smith's 90 wins place him atop the Broncos all-time coaching wins list. Smith has led the Broncos to the post-season in each of the last five years, and last season was named the West Coast Conference coach of the Year after leading Santa Clara to a 12-5-2 record and its third National Semifinal berth in four years.

**BRONCOS BREAK SCHOOL SCORING MARK:** With 63 goals and 66 assists in 1993, the Broncos set school scoring marks in both categories, breaking the old marks of 58 goals and 53 assists set in 1987. Freshman Leighann Franson (Atlanta, GA) scored the record-breaking 59th goal, the first of her career, against Loyola Marymount. The LMU win marked the Broncos seventh match this season in which they scored four or more goals—another school record. SCU had turned the trick six times in a season in 1985, 1987, 1988 and 1989.

**BRONCOS WRAP UP FIRST WCC TITLE:** With their 7-0 win over Loyola Marymount on Oct. 31, the Broncos concluded the WCC season with a perfect 6-0-0 record for their first West Coast Conference title. Here are the final regular-season West Coast Conference standings:

**ALL-TIME BEST CROWD WATCHES STANFORD MATCH:** On Nov. 4, 3,457 fans came to Buck Shaw Stadium to watch No. 2 Stanford defeat No. 4 Santa Clara 2-0. The crowd was the largest ever to come to Buck Shaw Stadium to watch a women's soccer match, and was the third crowd this year of better than 1,800 fans (1,892 vs. North Carolina at Saint Mary's, 2,790 vs. Portland). The attendance broke the former record of 3,208 on Oct. 4, 1991, when the Broncos hosted North Carolina. Over 1,200 fans were present at the Broncos 3-0 win over UC Santa Barbara on Nov. 6, making the tally over 4,700 fans for the two-game set.

**FRESHMAN CLASS MAKES ITS MARK:** The Santa Clara freshman class, led by forwards Mikka Hansen (San Jose, CA) and Erin Martinez (Fremont, CA) and midfielder Tracy Giorgetti (San Jose, CA), was the highest-scoring class this season for the Broncos. Hansen led all scorers for Santa Clara with 15 goals and eight assists for 38 total points, while Martinez added seven goals and 12 assists and Giorgetti six goals and three assists. Hansen's total's were among the best in SCU history (15 goals—t-6th; eight assists—t-11th; 38 total points—6th). Here is a look at the freshman class's contributions:
