Match Notes

- Santa Clara is 6-3 in the last nine meetings between the two programs and 3-2 in the NCAA Tournament since 1999.
- The last meeting was the national semis in the 2020 Tournament.

Season Notes

- Santa Clara has outscored its opponents 42-16 while holding a 343-153 advantage in shots and a 154-68 edge in shots on target.
- Kennedy Schoennauer leads the team with 11 goals and has one assist for 23 points. Marissa Vasquez is second with five goals. Kat Jordan, Sally Menti, and Tori Powell have scored four times. Lucy Mitchell, Lauren Hunter, Addie Whitehouse, and Holly Furphy have scored twice each with Colby Barnett, Shira Elinav, Ava Weiland and Lia Henkelmann all scoring once. Menti leads the team with seven assists while Mitchell has five. Barnett had Powell have four and Jordan, Leah O'Brien, and Marisa Bubnis have three while Vasquez, Whitehouse, and Weiland have two assists and Furphy, Hunter, Shira Elinav, and Tessa Ferguson each have one.
- Marlee Nicolos has started 18 matches and has three solo shutouts and five shared. She has made 46 saves and allowed 14 goals for a 0.81 GAA and a .767 save percentage. Lauren Zontos has appeared in six matches and made one start. She has six saves with a 0.46 GAA and a .857 save percentage. Ally Reynolds has appeared twice.
- Jordan was named the co-WCC Midfielder of the Year and Hayashi took home the Freshman of the Year. Barnett, Bubnis, Hayashi, Menti, and Schoennauer were named First Team All-WCC with Jordan, Mitchell, Powell, Vasquez, and Whitehouse honorable mention. Hayashi and Weiland were All-Freshman.
- Santa Clara has been ranked in each of the last 28 United Soccer Coaches polls, dating back to October 25, 2022. The Broncos are one of six teams with streaks at least that long. The other teams are all from Power 4 conference: Florida State, Stanford, North Carolina, Notre Dame, and Arkansas.
- The Broncos have won a game in each of the last 10 Tournaments. Only Florida State and Penn State have done that as well.
- Powell was the co-WCC Offensive Player of the week on November 11 after scoring a goal against San Diego and adding two assists in the WCC-title clinching 3-0 win over Saint Mary's.
- Nicolos was the WCC Defensive Player of the Week on October 14. She had eight saves and one goal against on the week. In her shutout of LMU, she had six stops, including on a penalty kick.

Season Notes

- Whitehouse was named the WCC Offensive Player of the Week on September 30 after scoring two goals in a 4-0 win at San Francisco.
- Carolyn Gray was named the WCC Defensive Player of the Week on August 19 after leading the back line in a season-opening shutout at San Jose State.
- Schoennauer had a brace in the opener against San Jose State and another at Long Beach State. She was the first Bronco with multiple goals in two of the team's first three games since Rachel Weber in 1998. She did it at Cal Poly (5-0, 9/1/98) and vs. Washington State (9-2, 9/4/98).
- Schoennauer added her third brace of the year against Cal Poly. She scored both goals in the first 6:53.
- She had her fourth brace of the year in a 2-0 win at LMU on October 12.
- Santa Clara is now 55-7-7 in WCC play since 2017.
- The team has won 10 games for the 16th season in a row and has reached that mark in 37 of head coach Jerry Smith's 38 seasons at the helm.
- The Broncos started the season with a 6-1 start after playing their first six matches in 18 days. It is the second year in a row they have one or fewer losses through their first seven matches. Last season they started 6-0-1. Prior to 2023, they started the 2020 National Championship campaign 6-1 as well.
- Sally Menti and Colby Barnett were named to the Hermann Trophy Watch List and as Midfielders to Watch by United Soccer Coaches.
- Menti, Barnett, and Vasquez, a transfer from San Francisco, were named Preseason All-WCC.
- The 4-0 win over San Jose State was the team's largest opening day win since also beating the Spartans 4-0 on the road in 2009.
- A total of 13 players saw their first action for the Broncos in the first game of the year at San Jose State. Transfers Shira Elinav, Caroline Gray, Kat Jordan, Marissa Vasquez, and Schoennauer made their Santa Clara debut while freshman Mana Hayashi, Ava Weiland, Daniela Cervantes, Tessa Ferguson, Hunter, and Stella Villalta made their collegiate debuts. Also debuting was redshirt freshman Abby Kiil and senior Zontos. Tori Powell debuted vs. Cal and Ally Reynolds saw her first minutes with Santa Clara against Long Beach State. Jacey Martinez got on the field for the first time as a redshirt freshman against Portland and Kylie Stiles made her debut after two years of injuries vs. Pacific giving the Broncos 17 Santa Clara debuts this season.
- Santa Clara was picked to win the WCC in a poll of the league's 11 coaches, receiving nine first place votes.
- Vasquez is one of seven transfers new to the team for the 2024 season. Shira Elinav (Kansas), Caroline Gray (Notre Dame), Kat Jordan (Columbia), Tori Powell (Virginia Tech), Kennedy Schoennauer (Utah), Vasquez (San Francisco), and Eva Wirtz (Notre Dame). Powell has been with the team since winter quarter.
- Also joining the team are freshmen Izzy DeBuyl, Mana Hayashi, who joined last winter as well, Ava Weiland, Daniela Cervantes, Tessa Ferguson, Lauren Hunter, Kaylee Smith, and Stella Villalta.
- In all, Santa Clara has 15 newcomers on the roster.
- Santa Clara has six international players on the team, representing six different countries: Hayashi (Japan), Lia Henkelmann (Germany), Elinav (Israel), Holly Furphy (Australia), Cervantes (Spain), Villalta (England).
- Hayashi is with team Japan at the U20 World Cup in Colombia, potentially though late September.
- Santa Clara has been to 34 NCAA Tournaments, 12 College Cups (1989, 1990, 1992, 1996, 1997, 1998, 1999, 2001, 2002, 2004, 2020, 2021, 2022, 2023, 2024), and won two National Championships (2001, 2020). The program is one of just eight with two or more national titles. Only three teams have more.
- The Broncos have won the West Coast Conference 14 times (1993, 1997, 1998, 1999, 2001, 2002, 2003, 2004, 2006, 2013, 2020, 2021, 2022, 2024).
- Head coach Jerry Smith is in his 38th year. He has 561 career wins, the third most Division I wins in women's soccer history and the most among active coaches.
