Match Notes

- The No. 16 Santa Clara University men's water polo team heads to Stockton, Calif., for the 2024 West Coast Conference Championship Tournament, running Friday through Sunday. The fifth-seeded Broncos face No. 4 seed and No. 16 ranked California Baptist at 2 p.m. Friday in the first round of the single-elimination competition.
- Santa Clara narrowly lost to the Lancers on Oct. 24, dropping a one-goal game at home. The Broncos erased what had been a six-goal deficit to tie the game at 12-12 before CBU got the eventual game-winner with 2 minutes, 14 seconds left.
- Each of the teams' last five meetings have been decided by two or fewer goals, four of them by only one goal. Every single one of their last 21 meetings (since 2010) have been decided by five or fewer goals, with 19 of those by a margin of three or fewer.
- California Baptist has won eight of the last nine meetings versus Santa Clara. The Broncos won seven in a row and eight of 10 from 2010-17.

Season Notes

- Santa Clara clinched the No. 5 seed in the WCC Tournament, honored nine seniors in a pregame ceremony, and scored its most goals in a game in at least the last 18 years Friday with a 23-13 blowout win over Air Force. 10 Broncos scored goals, with seven of them scoring multiple. **Riccardo De Simon** and **Reese Jenican** led the team with four.
- Three Broncos earned all-WCC distinctions Wednesday, led by senior attacker **Zach Fales** being named to the all-WCC first team for the second year in a row, as announced by the conference office. Freshman utilityman **Riccardo De Simon** and redshirt freshman center defender **Luke Baird** joined Fales as award winners, earning all-WCC honorable mention distinctions. The three recognitions equal what the Broncos hauled in last season during the WCC's first year sponsoring men's water polo.
- Santa Clara swept the KAP7 WCC weekly awards two week ago (week of Oct. 28-Nov. 3), with senior attacker **Zach Fales** being named Player of the Week and freshman utilityman **Riccardo De Simon** being named Newcomer of the Week.

Fales scored seven goals, grabbed five steals and tallied two assists in two WCC road games, including powering No. 18 Santa Clara to a 13-9 win over No. 17 LMU on Saturday. He also drew four kickouts and recorded two field blocks on defense in the two games. De Simon scored five goals and tallied three assists in the Broncos' two road games while helping Santa Clara in a big way to beat No. 17 LMU on Saturday. De Simon played well on both sides of the ball on the weekend with six steals, three drawn kickouts and three field blocks on defense.

Season Notes

• **Riccardo De Simon** owns two other WCC Newcomer of the Week awards this season on top of his award last week, giving him three. He won it for the week of Sept. 23-29 after helping lead the Broncos to a milestone road victory at No. 13 UC Davis. He also won the award for the week of Sept. 9-15 after scoring 11 goals across four games at the Princeton Invitational.

• Santa Clara redshirt freshman **Luke Baird** has added to classmate De Simon's newcomer prowess this season, earning his own KAP7 WCC Newcomer of the Week award on Oct. 15 after helping lead the No. 17 Broncos to a perfect weekend at the Lancer Joust. Baird totaled seven goals, four steals, three field blocks and an assist with two multi-goal performances in three games. Baird tied for the game high on Oct. 11 with a season-best four goals in the tournament opener versus host Cal State Fullerton. He came back in the nightcap with two more goals against Concordia University Irvine for a six-goal day. Baird added another goal on Oct. 12 in the Broncos' 14-8 win over Biola, one of 10 Broncos to score in the game.

• The Broncos already have 13 wins on the season and look to surpass their win totals from each of the past four years. Santa Clara still has at least one more game to play in 2024 and hasn't won more than 13 games in a seasons since 2019 (15).

• Senior attacker **Zach Fales** was one of 20 student-athletes from across the country named on Oct. 17 to the 2024 Cutino Award Watch List, the award given annually to the top NCAA Division I collegiate male and female in water polo. Fales is the Broncos' leading points-getter with 90 total points. He has team highs in goals (53) and assists (37). Fales is also second on the team with 34 steals.

• Santa Clara head coach **Keith Wilbur** reached his 300th career men's water polo win this season thanks to a 14-12 win at No. 13 UC Davis on Sept. 27. He's earned all 300 of his wins at the helm of the Broncos' program. Wilbur is in his 23rd season as head coach of the program and is the winningest coach in program history. He began his tenure at Santa Clara in the fall of 2002.

• The Broncos (12-14 in 2023) finished 2023 ranked tied for 18th in the nation alongside WCC rival Pacific. Santa Clara has 13 matches scheduled in 2024 against teams ranked in both of the preseason top-20 polls, including showdowns against top-five teams California (No. 2/2) on Oct. 17, Stanford (No. 3/3) on Nov. 9 and Princeton (No. 5/5) on Sept. 13.

• All seven members of the WCC received votes in the CWPA preseason national poll, with six of them earning placement in the poll. WCC Preseason Coaches' Poll favorite Pacific was the highest-ranked WCC member at No. 7. San Jose State landed at No. 9, Pepperdine was No. 13, LMU was placed at No. 16, Cal Baptist earned a No. 17 showing, and the Broncos came in at No. 19. Air Force earned three votes in the CWPA poll.

• Santa Clara returns its top two points scorers from 2023 in **Zach Fales** and **Gojko Kapovic**. Fales earned first team all-WCC honors and was tabbed an All-American honorable mention by the ACWPC after scoring a team-high 61 goals and totaling 101 points. Kapovic was the team's leading assists-getter with 59 and was second on the team with 88 total points. He also scored 29 goals (fourth on the team).

• The Broncos also return their starting goalkeeper from a year ago, **Harrison Labrosse**. The sophomore Labrosse made 159 saves in 16 starts. He also grabbed 12 steals on the season while logging a season-high 13 saves on two occasions.
