- Santa Clara will compete in the Stanford Invitational Feb. 3-4. On Saturday, they will face Cal State East Bay (0-0) at 11 a.m. and No. 23 Biola (2-2) at 3 p.m.
- On the last day of the tournament, the Broncos will take on No. 6 Stanford (2-2) at 9:45 a.m.

Season Notes

- Santa Clara is coming off a win against CSU Monterey Bay, where they defeated the Otters 10-5.
- Liyara Senadheera was noticed as a top performer of the week by the GCC after recording 13 saves with a save percentage of .833.
- Elle Fredrickson led the Broncos to their first victory with three goals to her name.
- Five seniors- Chloe Morrison, Maddie Clough, Alyssa Jacobsen, Fredrickson, and Senadheera come back for their fourth season.
- Sophomore Kate Rodman was named to the All-Golden Coast Conference second team after the 2023 season. She had eight games during the season where she scored at least three goals and she scored a season-high four goals on two different occasions.
- Rodman and Fredrickson tied with the most goals on the team throughout the 2023 season (44).
- Morrison was the sole Bronco to start in all 31 games of the 2023 season.
- The Broncos are looking to improve from last years 10-21 record as they compete in the Golden Coast Conference.
- Santa Clara is led by Claire Linney, who served as the assistant coach for eight seasons, and enters her third season at the helm. She is assisted by Allie Lamb in her second year in the role and Lauren Baglietto as the graduate assistant coach.



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Coaching Staff

Claire Linney is currently in her third season as the head coach, having previously served as the assistant for eight seasons.

Linney, a former Bronco team captain and MVP, led the team to seven wins in her first campaign in 2022 and most recently, 10 wins in the 2023 season.

A native of Watsonville, Calif., Linney served as the assistant coach at Cal State Monterey Bay from 2010-12. She helped the team to its best-ever finish in the Western Water Polo Association. She also served as the head varsity boys coach at Salinas High School where she was a two-time Monterey Bay League Coach of the Year.

Linney is joined by former Bronco stars Allie Lamb, who is starting her second year, and Lauren Baglietto, who serves as the graduate assistant coach.

Lamb initially joined the women's water polo staff as a volunteer assistant coach before the start of the 2022 season. Following the season's conclusion, she was promoted to a full-time assistant coach. Lamb brings experience from her tenure as the head varsity and junior varsity water polo coach at The Harker School from 2010 to 2020, and she was also a member of the Broncos' water polo team from 2006 to 2009.

Baglietto remains with the Broncos after her time as a player. In her senior season, she secured a spot on the All-Golden Coast Conference Second Team, finishing in the top 10 of the league with 40 goals for the year.
