Game/Season Notes

- Santa Clara hosts San Diego in the final regular season series starting Thursday with West Coast Conference championship implications. Prior to the game, four Broncos will be recognized as part of the Senior Day ceremony - Sage Hager, Cameron McGinnis, Bailey McLaughlin and Ella Romero.
- In the WCC standings, Saint Mary's currently sits atop with a 8-4 record, followed by LMU and Santa Clara with 7-5 records. Santa Clara has the tiebreaker advantage over Saint Mary's with a 3-1 record in head-to-head matchups. LMU holds the tiebreaker over Santa Clara winning three of four games. Saint Mary's and LMU play this weekend. Santa Clara needs to win at least three games this weekend to have a shot at claiming the conference title.
- This season, the WCC encompassed a 16-game league slate for each of the five conference member schools. The WCC schedule will run for five weeks from April 12 to May 11 with one bye week. Each weekend series is comprised of four games with a single game series opener, followed by a double-header the next day and a single game series finale on the last day.
- Last week, the Broncos took three of four games against Pacific. Hazyl Gray went 9-for-13 with three home runs and 12 RBIs to take home the [WCC Player of the Week honors](#). A week earlier Hannah Edwards was the [WCC Pitcher of the Week](#) after tossing a pair of complete game victories against Saint Mary's.
- In the last 15 games, Gray is hitting .396 (19-for-48) with eight home runs, 26 RBI and a .958 slugging percentage. She hit three home runs in the first doubleheader game against LMU (April 2) becoming the first Bronco to achieve the feat since at least 2000.
- The Broncos closed out the nonconference portion of the schedule with a 21-16 record. The 21 nonconference wins are tied for most in program history since at least 1979, matching the totals from 1986 and 2002 seasons.
- In the final series of the nonconference slate, Santa Clara traveled to San Antonio to play Incarnate Word. During the trip, the Broncos attended a San Antonio Missions game, the double-A affiliate of the San Diego Padres, where Marie Martorella's brother, Nathan Martorella, plays.
- This is the third-straight season SCU has reached the 20-win mark, the first time they've done that since 2004-06. Head coach Gina Carbonatto is the first Bronco coach to post three-straight 20-win seasons since March Crouch did it from 2002-04.
- The 28 wins so far this season is the highest win total under Carbonatto eclipsing last year's high of 23 and have assured themselves a winning regular season record for the first time since 2004 when they went 30-23.
- SCU played in six tournaments this spring going 16-11.
- The Broncos had a season-high seven-game win streak in early March. The win streak was the longest since the 2004 season when that team won 12-straight to close out the season.
- Offensively, on the season, SCU has a .273 batting average with four starters hitting over .300 - Hazyl Gray (.340), Abigail Charpentier (.323), Bailey McLaughlin (.319) & Cairah Curran (.314) and average 4.6 runs/game.
- Gray and Salmon are tied for first in the West Coast Conference in RBIs (37). Other Bronco statistical leaders include: Curran in runs (39), Bailey McLaughlin in sacrifice bunts (12), Marie Martorella & Hazyl Gray in sac flies (T1 - 4), Hannah Edwards in wins (T1 - 12) and Avery Seva in saves (4).
- Freshman Cairah Curran had a 14-game hitting streak and safely reached base in 17-straight games earlier in the season.
- Broncos are tied for 13th in the nation averaging 1.96 steals per game.
- The veteran pitching staff that returns three of the four pitchers from last season has a 3.70 ERA. Hannah Edwards has a team-high 12 wins. The staff has six saves topping last season's total of two.

2024 Preseason

- Three Broncos - Hannah Edwards, Hazyl Gray and Morgan Salmon - were named 2024 preseason All-West Coast conference by a vote of the league's five head coaches.
- The Broncos were picked to finish fourth by a vote of the same panel.

2023 Season Highlights

- The Broncos finished with an overall record of 23-26 after finishing the 2022 season at 21-30 to post their first back-to-back 20-win seasons since 2005 and 2006.
- The 23-win total was the highest since the 2006 campaign when they went 24-34.
- Most home wins (15-11) since Santa Clara Softball Stadium was built in 2016.
- Had the first sweep of a conference opponent (Pacific) since 2019.

- Five West Coast Conference Player/Pitchers of the Week honors won - the most ever in a season for SCU. The first year of WCC softball was in 2014.
- Six All-WCC honorees - First Team: Ashley Trierweiler; Second Team: Emma Bickford, Allyson Ferreira & Morgan Salmon; Honorable Mention: Hannah Edwards & Hazyl Gray.
- Two National Fastpitch Coaches Association All-Pacific Region honorees - First Team: Ashley Trierweiler; Second Team: Hazyl Gray. They were the first Broncos to be recognized to the all-region team since Jaime Forman-Lau in 2004.
- Ashley Trierweiler named Second Team D1 Softball, Third Team NFCA & Second Team College Sports Communicators (CSC) Academic All-American.

2023 Summer

- Edwards, Salmon and Cameron McGinnis were selected to Great Britain women's senior national fastpitch team.
- Departing graduate student Sammy Needham was co-winner of the #WCCRepresent Award for promoting the positive WCC SAAC values of sportsmanship and community service.

2024 Team

- The 22 player roster has 15 returnees including the three of the four pitchers who pitched last season.
- The three returning pitchers (Hannah Edwards, Sage Hager and Hazyl Gray) account for 21 of 23 wins (91-percent) and 81-percent of innings pitched in 2023.
- Mix of returnees and newcomers will step in to replace the offensive productivity from last season where five of the top seven hitters closed out their Bronco careers. The Broncos return 35-percent of the hits and 42-percent of the RBIs from 2023.
- Six of the seven newcomers hail from the prep ranks with Alaina Valdez hailing from the JUCO ranks.
- All but two players hail from California. Cairah Curran is from Hawaii and Kyla Acres from Nevada.

About the Coaching Staff:

- Gina Carbonatto enters her fifth season as the head coach of the Broncos. Entering the 2024 season, she has a career record of 60-92.
- Carbonatto has served as the assistant coach for Great Britain's Under-22 women's softball team since 2018.
- In the summer of 2022, Carbonatto coached Great Britain's U-22 that competed in the European Under-22 Women's Fastpitch Championship in Kunovice, Czech Republic.
- On Carbonatto's SCU staff are pitching coach Jen Deering, who is also in her fifth season, hitting coach Kristi Villar is in her second season, graduate assistant Montana Dixon is in her third season and former Bronco player Emma Bickford is in her first season as a volunteer assistant.
- Dixon serves in the Director of Operations role; Bickford will help with the infield coaching and Carbonatto with the outfield coaching.
- Bickford finished her Bronco career tied for eighth in hits (168), second in doubles (42), third in RBIs (102), seventh in total bases (242), eighth in slugging percentage (.425) and first in sacrifice flies (10) since 2000.
- For the upcoming season, Carbonatto will be the third base coach and Bickford the first base coach.
- Deering and Villar will be the bench coaches.
