Match Notes

- Santa Clara and Oregon State opens West Coast Conference play. It is the first WCC contest for league newcomer Oregon State.
- The schools have met three times previously (see above series history). The lone Broncos win came on Sept. 7, 2001 - a 2-1 double overtime win at the University of San Francisco Diadora Classic in San Francisco.
- In last season's game, played on Labor Day at Stevens Stadium, Pierce Dyal scored in the fourth minute but the Beavers tallied three unanswered goals to win 3-1.

Season Notes

- Santa Clara closed out the nonconference portion of the schedule with a 3-4-1 record, going 1-1-1 at home and 2-3 in road games.
- Dating back to last year, three of the last four wins have come on a game-winning goal at the 88th minute or later. In the season finale against Pacific last season, Joshua Dabora scored in the 88th minute to help the Broncos clinch a share of the West Coast Conference title. In this year's season opener against UCSD, Florian Deletieglo tallied the game winner also in the 88th minute. And against San Jose State this season, the Broncos had a [2-1 buzzer beating win](#). Itamar Efrat scored the game winner with just two seconds left in the game that saw 12 cards issued.
- The nonconference schedule was comprised of four Big West opponents - UC San Diego, UC Davis, Sacramento State and CSUN. The Broncos went 1-3 against them.
- SCU has a minus nine goal differential (11-2) in first half goals despite the number of shots being close to even (SCU 37, opponents 38) and a plus five (7-2) goal differential in the second half with a 65-31 advantage in shots.
- The Broncos have fallen behind in the first half in each of the last seven matches and have yet to lead in the opening 45 minutes all season.
- The Broncos started the year playing four straight games on the road, going 2-2-0, including a week long trip to the east coast playing Fordham and Boston University.
- Deletieglo returned to Fordham where he starred for four seasons before transferring this season. Deletieglo leads the team with three goals along with Tyler Tipton.
- SCU opened the season with a [1-0 win over UC San Diego](#). The Aug. 22 season opener was the earliest game the Broncos played (in the fall) since at least 1977.
- The Broncos leading goal scorers Deletieglo and Tipton each have a game-winning goal to their credit along with Itamar Efrat. Andrew Sullivan and Will Wiersdorf each have a team leading two assists. Jack Stoecker has started at goalkeeper in six matches posting a .667 save% and 1.17 goals-against-average. Jackson Ozburn has started in a pair of matches with a .571 save% and 3.00 GAA.
- Six Broncos have started in every game - Yoni Aidlberg, Keagan Rhodes, Alvaro Girdonda, Deletieglo, Jack Civitts and Brennan Mallett.
- Ten (out of 15) newcomers have seen action thus far - Deletieglo, Girona, Baronyi Kengeye, Tipton, Jaiden Windell, Quinn Garrett, Kai Hatten, Andrew Sullivan, Ozburn and Simon Diagana.

Season Notes

- Santa Clara is coming off a West Coast Conference Championship season, finishing the league slate with a 5-1-1 record (7-7-3 overall), to share the conference co-championship with the University of San Diego.
- It was the 14th conference title in Bronco history.
- San Diego got the automatic qualifying bid to the NCAA Tournament due to their head-to-head win against Santa Clara for the tiebreaker advantage.
- Last season, Santa Clara played six teams that qualified for the 2023 NCAA Tournament, defeating two of them – shutting out a high-powered Portland squad 1-0 that entered the game leading the nation in scoring and also blanking LMU 2-0 on the road.
- Head coach Cam Rast enters his 23rd season at the helm coming off a season in which he was named WCC Coach of the Year for the seventh time (won previously in 2003, 2006, 2007, 2010, 2015, & 2021). Rast hit a couple of career milestones during the season picking up his 200th career victory (Nov. 4 vs. Gonzaga) and 100th WCC win (Sept. 30 vs. Saint Mary's). He has a career record of 204-152-65 including 104-64-34 in West Coast Conference play and 101-57-38 at home.
- In season openers, Rast has a record of 12-10-1.

2024 Team

- The 2024 squad is comprised of 29 players including 14 returners and 15 newcomers.
- Three returners were named All-West Coast Conference last year - graduate student goalkeeper Jack Stoecker garnered first team honors, sophomore midfielder Martin Kwende Jr. was named second team all conference and was named to the All-Freshman team along with sophomore forward Jack Civitts.
- Fifteen newcomers dot the roster: Jackson Blake, Sean Bratkowski, Simon Diagana, Florian Deletiglu, Quinn Garrett, Alvaro Girona, Kai Hatten, Baronyi Kengeye, Jackson Ozburn, Khalil Rashad, Andrew Sullivan, Tyler Tipton, Carter Tseu, Jaiden Windell and Yu Yokokawa.
- Of the 15 newcomers, 10 are freshman and five are transfers - Deletiglu (Fordham), Girona (played in Spain), Kengeye (West Alabama), Ozburn (Washington) and Tipton (Stanislaus State).
- The captains for this season are: senior defender Yoni Aidlberg, junior midfielder Pierce Dyal and sophomore midfielder Will Wiersdorf.
- The Broncos return seven of 23 goals from last season (30.4%) led by Civitts with four. Dyal, Will Wiersdorf and Naji Elder each tallied a goal.
- Fourteen of 25 assists (56%) returns led by Aidlberg with five followed by Civitts with four.
- Stoecker played in nine games and posted a 6-1-2 record with a 0.78 goals-against-average, a .848 save percentage and recorded four shutouts. He was inserted into the starting XI midway through the season starting in nine of the final 10 matches. During that span, he twice won the WCC Defensive Player of the Week honors. Stoecker's .848 save percentage was the fifth best in the nation. In WCC play, he led in save percentage (.833) and finished second with a .857 goals-against-average and 4.29 saves per game to earn the only goalkeeper spot on the WCC first team.

Preseason

- By a vote of the league's nine head coaches, Santa Clara was picked to finish sixth in the WCC with Portland as the favorite to win the conference. League newcomer Oregon State was picked to finish first (56 points).

Coaching Staff

- All four members of the coaching staff played in the WCC including three at Santa Clara - head coach Cam Rast '91, associate head coach Eric Yamamoto '90 and assistant coach Jack Murphy '22. Assistant coach Riley Hanley '15 played at Saint Mary's.
- Murphy was promoted to assistant coach/manager of operations in July after serving as a graduate assistant last season.

Olympic Year, Bronco Olympic Ties

- Rast served as the captain of the 1992 U.S. Olympic men's soccer team in Barcelona, Spain.
