Match Notes

- Last season was the first meeting between the two teams since 2018.
- Santa Clara is 4-0-1 in the last five matchups, dating back to 2011.

Season Notes

- Santa Clara has outscored its opponents 12-4 over the first two games while holding a 86-57 advantage in shots and a 41-20 edge in shots on target.
- Kennedy Schoennauer leads the team with four goals and eight points. Kat Jordan and Marissa Vasquez have scored twice with Lauren Hunter, Tori Powell, Colby Barnett, and Sally Menti all scoring once. Menti leads the team with three assists while Lucy Mitchell has two. Addie Whitehouse and Holly Furphy each have one.
- Marlee Nicolos has started five matches and has a solo shutout and one shared. She has made 15 saves and allowed three goals for a 0.62 GAA and a .833 save percentage. Lauren Zontos and Ally Reynolds each played a half at Long Beach State. Zontos made one save.
- Schoennauer had a brace in the opener against San Jose State and another at Long Beach State. She is the first Bronco with multiple goals in two of the team's first three games since Rachel Weber in 1998. She did it at Cal Poly (5-0, 9/1/98) and vs. Washington State (9-2, 9/4/98).
- The Broncos are off to a 5-1 start after playing their first six matches in 18 days. It is the fifth time in the last seven years Santa Clara has just one loss through six matches. They were 6-0 in 2023, 3-1-2 in 2021, 5-1 in 2020, the season they won their second National Championship, and 5-1 in 2018.
- Sally Menti and Colby Barnett were named to the Hermann Trophy Watch List and as Midfielders to Watch by United Soccer Coaches.
- Menti (No. 52) and Kat Jordan (No. 54) were on TopDrawerSoccer's Top 100 Players.
- Menti, Barnett, and Marissa Vasquez, a transfer from San Francisco,

were named Preseason All-WCC.

- The 4-0 win over San Jose State was the team's largest opening day win since also beating the Spartans 4-0 on the road in 2009.
- A total of 13 players saw their first action for the Broncos in the first game of the year at San Jose State. Transfers Shira Elinav, Caroline Gray, Kat Jordan, Marissa Vasquez, and Schoennauer made their Santa Clara debut while freshman Mana Hayashi, Ava Weiland, Daniela Cervantes, Tessa Ferguson, Hunter, and Stella Villalta made their collegiate debuts. Also debuting was redshirt freshman Abby Kiil and senior Zontos. Tori Powell debuted vs. Cal and Ally Reynolds save her first minutes with Santa Clara giving the Broncos 15 Santa Clara debuts this season.
- Santa Clara was picked to win the WCC in a poll of the league's 11 coaches, receiving nine first place votes.
- Menti was 2023 First Team All-WCC with Barnett being named to the Second Team. Lucy Mitchell was honorable mention and Mailin Orozco and Malia Yamamoto were All-Freshman.
- Menti led the team in assists last year with nine and added four goals for 17 points, second on the team. Barnett scored three goals and had six assists. Vasquez was the WCC Midfielder of the year and First Team All-WCC after scoring seven goals with one assist.
- Vasquez is one of seven transfers new to the team for the 2024 season. Shira Elinav (Kansas), Caroline Gray (Notre Dame), Kat Jordan (Columbia), Tori Powell (Virginia Tech), Kennedy Schoennauer (Utah), Vasquez (San Francisco), and Eva Wirtz (Notre Dame). Powell has been with the team since winter quarter.
- Also joining the team are freshmen Izzy DeBuyl, Mana Hayashi, who joined last winter as well, Ava Weiland, Daniela Cervantes, Tessa Ferguson, Lauren Hunter, Kaylee Smith, and Stella Villalta.
- In all, Santa Clara has 15 newcomers on the roster.
- The Broncos also welcome back Menti, Marlee Nicolos, Marisa Bubnis, and Lucy Mitchell for their extra year of COVID eligibility.
- Santa Clara has six international players on the team, representing six different countries: Hayashi (Japan), Lia Henkelmann (Germany), Elinav (Israel), Holly Furphy (Australia), Cervantes (Spain), Villalta (England).
- Hayashi is with team Japan at the U20 World Cup in Colombia, potentially though late September.
- The Broncos have gone 14-3-2 over the last six NCAA Tournaments despite playing just six matches at home. They have hosted the first round in 10 of the last 13 seasons, including 2020 when games were not at campus sites.
- Overall, the Broncos are 65-27-6 in the NCAA Tournament and 39-3-3 at home. They have won at least one game in each of their last 11 appearances and haven't lost in the first round since 2007, a span of 14 appearances.
- Santa Clara has been to 33 NCAA Tournaments, 12 College Cups (1989, 1990, 1992, 1996, 1997, 1998, 1999, 2001, 2002, 2004, 2020, 2021, 2022, 2023), and won two National Championships (2001, 2020). The program is one of just eight with two or more national titles. Only three teams have more.
- The Broncos have won the West Coast Conference 13 times (1993, 1997, 1998, 1999, 2001, 2002, 2003, 2004, 2006, 2013, 2020, 2021, 2022).
- Head coach Jerry Smith is in his 38th year. He has 553 career wins, the third most Division I wins in women's soccer history.
