Game Notes

- The Broncos won both meetings last season and have won four of the last five.

Season Notes

- Santa Clara is scoring 63.2 ppg this season on 40.7-percent shooting from the field and 29.6-percent from beyond the arc. The Broncos are dishing out 13.2 apg as well.
- Defensively, they allow 64.7 ppg and are holding opponents to 37.6-percent from the floor and 26.2-percent from deep, 33rd nationally. They force 12.2 tpg while collecting 4.7 spg and 3.4 bpg.
- Olivia Pollerd leads the team with 16.5 ppg on 42.7-percent shooting and leads the team with 33 3-pointers made. She also leads the way with 31 blocks and adds 5.9 rpg. Malia Latu scores 10.2 ppg with Georgia Grigoropoulou adding 5.8 ppg and a team-high 6.0 rpg. Maddie Naro's 3.9 apg are tops on the team and she adds 8.1 ppg with Kaya Ingram scoring 8.3 ppg as well.
- Pollerd was named the WCC Player of the Week on November 11. In the Broncos wins over UC Riverside and at Fresno State, Pollerd played 77 minutes while averaging 27.0 ppg on 51.3-percent (20-of-39) shooting and an impressive 55.0-percent (11-of-20) from downtown. She also added 10 rebounds, four assists, three blocks, and a steal. Her 33 at Fresno State was a career-high.
- She took home her second Player of the Week on January 13. For the week, Pollerd averaged 23.5 ppg while shooting 57.6-percent from the field and going 4-of-7 from beyond the arc. She also added 6.0 rpg and 2.0 bpg.

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Season Notes

- Pollerd scored her 1,000th career point against San Francisco on December 30. She became the 29th Bronco to accomplish the feat. She scored her 1,000th point with Santa Clara in the next game against Washington State.
- Last season, Pollerd was named First Team All-WCC and Maddie Naro was on the All-Freshman Team. Also back are junior forward Georgia Grigoropoulou and senior guard Malia Latu.
- The Broncos have a different look from last season, bringing in eight newcomers to the squad highlighted by graduate guard Kaya Ingram, who started all 26 games for Cornell last season, leading the team with 30.5 mpg, 10.5 ppg, and 3.1 apg.
- The Broncos also brought in graduate forward Irena Korolenko, who played in all 28 games at Seattle a season ago with 26 starts. She averaged 29.2 mpg, 8.3 ppg, 6.3 rpg, and 1.5 apg, finishing third on the team in points and assists, and second in rebounds.
- Rounding out the newcomers is graduate guard Mia Curtis, who played in 26 games last season for Dartmouth, finishing third on the team with 6.9 ppg and second with 1.7 apg. She led the team in steals and scored in double figures five times last season.
- Also new to the Broncos this season is Northwestern transfer Alana Goodchild, two-sport Bronco athlete Lauren Grover, who stars on the Broncos women's volleyball team, Saint Mary's transfer Hannah Rapp, and junior guard Gabby Harris.
- The team has signed five already for next season. Tyler Gildersleeve-Stiles (6-1, Forward, Snohomish, Wash., Snohomish High School), Sienne Grieger (5-9, Guard, West Adelaide, Australia, St. Michael's College), Kate Schat (5-9, Guard, Redwood Valley, Calif., Cardinal Newman High School), Sara Schmerbach (5-10, Guard, South Medford, Ore., South Medford High School), and Maddy Warberg (5-11, Guard, Eugene, Ore., South Medford High School) will be the newest Broncos.
- Michael Floyd is in his ninth season with the program and first as interim head coach. The win vs. UC Riverside was his first Santa Clara win.
