Tournament Notes

- The Broncos are looking to end their fall campaign on high note after three consecutive top-five finishes in their first three tournaments.
- Santa Clara is coming off back-to-back outings in which they shot under par as a team. It's
 just the third and fourth times in program history they have done so.
- The Rainbow Wahine Invitational will be played on the par 72, 6,039-yard Ocean Course at Hokuala
- Kelsey Kim will remain in the No. 1 spot of the lineup followed by Audrey Brust, Chloe Lam,
 Proud Sriwongngam and Alexa Pineda.
- A total of 19 teams will take part in the event with Hawai'i serving as the host institution.
 Santa Clara joins Baylor, Boise State, BYU, Eastern Michigan, Grand Canyon, Idaho, Kansas,
 Kennesaw State, Long Beach State, Missouri, Nevada, Osaka Gakuin (Japan), Sacramento State, San Diego, San Diego State, Tulane, Washington State and Wyoming to make up the field

Season Notes

- Santa Clara is coming off two of the top team performances in program history. SCU
 most recently took fourth place at the Golf Iconic Classic after finishing 1-under 863,
 their second-consecutive tournament where they shot under par, and just the fourth such
 instance in program history.
- SCU was 8-under 568 after the first two rounds. It is the second-lowest 36-hole score in program history. They shot 5-under 283 in the second round, which is tied for the sixthlowest 18-hole score in program history.
- Kelsey Kim nearly captured her first collegiate title, but ultimately tied for fourth after carding a 5-under 211 - both a career best and tied for the fifth-lowest score in program history.
- The Broncos finished runner-up at the Pat Lesser Harbottle after turning in a 2-under 862. Audrey Brust came ever so close to winning her first collegiate event, but ultimately finished tied for fourth - tied for her best career finish - at 1-under 215.
- The Broncos opened the season by winning the Kalispel Invitational by 10 strokes for the 19th team title under head coach Krystal Kelly.
- Kim finished runner-up at the Kalispel Invitational the best finish of her career.
- Brust is tied for fourth in program history in career top-20 finishes (20), sixth in top-10 finishes (8), third in rounds under par (15) and fourth in rounds played (105).
- Kim has 14 rounds under par for her career, good for the 4th most in program history just behind Brust.

2024-25 Recap

- Santa Clara ended the season on a high note by capturing the 2025 National Golf Invitational team title. It was the Broncos' first tournament win since the 2022 season.
- The Broncos quietly put together the best team scoring average in program history, besting their 2023-24 record with a collective 295.67 strokes per round.
- Kelsey Kim was the best of the bunch with a 73.88 average (second-best in program history) and logged a team-best seven top-20 finishes as a sophomore.
- Chloe Lam had a fantastic freshman season, finishing with a the eighth-best scoring average in program history at 74.37 strokes. She was the Broncos' top finisher at the WCC Championship, tying the program record in the tournament of 3-over 219 to finish in a tie for fifth. For her efforts, she was honored as an All-WCC performer.
- With a 74.40 average of 62 career appearances, Kim currently holds the best career scoring average in program history, just ahead of Borina Sutkito (74.56) and Claire Choi (74.95).
- Audrey Brust, entering her senior campaign, is also one of the top players in program history, ranking fifth in career scoring average at 75.29 strokes over 96 rounds. Her 11 career rounds under par also rank fifth-most in the program's history.
