Meet Notes

- The Santa Clara University women's cross country team hosts its own annual Bronco Invitational Saturday morning at Baylands Regional Park in Sunnyvale, Calif.
- The Broncos finished ninth out of 19 teams at last season's Bronco Invitational. Freshman Amelia James led the team with a 36th-place finish in 21:26.5. Olivia Schlieman was five seconds behind her in 39th place with a time of 21:31.2.
- Saturday's race includes six West Coast Conference teams including Santa Clara.
 LMU, Pacific, Saint Mary's, San Francisco and Seattle will all be in attendance.
- The Broncos posted three consecutive top-five finishes at their own Bronco Invitational from 2021-23. They finished fourth in 2021, third in 2022 and fifth at the 2023 edition.

Season Notes

• In the Broncos' last time out on Oct. 3, junior **Milaina Almonte** placed among the top-35 in an ultra-competitive field to lead Santa Clara at the Sean Earl Lakefront Invitational at the Sydney R. Marovitz Golf Course in Chicago.

Almonte set a 6-kilometer personal best for the second time in as many races this season, finishing in 20 minutes, 28.11 seconds. Almonte was the eighth finisher from a non-Power-4 school. **Sarah Guralnick** came in as the Broncos' No. 2 runner in 87th place with a time of 21:24.23. **Olivia Schlieman** gave Santa Clara three runners in the top-100 with a 96th-place finish in 21:39.64. Sydney Lim (108th, 22:18.37) and Julia Russo (118th, 22:54.54) rounded out Santa Clara's top-five.

Santa Clara finished 15th in the team standings in a race that featured eight nationally ranked teams. West Coast Conference preseason favorite Gonzaga, who received votes in the latest national poll, was also in attendance, finishing third overall. No. 2-ranked NC State won the team title with 34 points and had four finishers in the top-10. NC State's Hannah Gapes won the individual race in 19:19.69.

• Santa Clara placed four individuals among the top-50 on Sept. 13 in its second competition of the season on its way to a seventh-place team finish at the Kim Duyst Twilight, hosted by Stanislaus State at River Oaks Golf Course, in Ceres, Calif.

Sarah Guralnick led the Broncos' efforts under the lights with a fifth-place finish in 21 minutes, 10.7 seconds over the 6-kilometer course. **Olivia Schlieman** made her 2025 season debut and gave Santa Clara two individuals among the top-25 with a 21st-place finish in 21:38.0.

Season Notes

• The Broncos had a strong season-opening performance on Aug. 29 at the 32nd annual USF Invitational, powered by a second-place individual showing from **Milaina Almonte** at the Speedway Meadows in Golden Gate Park.

Almonte set a cross country 6-kilometer personal best, finishing second overall in the 130-runner field with a time of 20 minutes, 37.6 seconds. She trailed race winner, Anna Buettner of host San Francisco, by less than 10 seconds after chasing her down. Buettner had built a large gap between herself and the rest of the field, but Almonte pushed to close it, cutting down a more-than 38-second gap at the 4 km mark to fewer than 10 seconds and passing two Stanford runners in the process.

- The Broncos only graduated two student-athletes from last year's roster, returning a total of 16 for 2025-26. And even this season's roster only has three seniors on it. Junior **Olivia Schlieman** is Santa Clara's top returner after leading the team with a 123rd-place finish at the 2024 NCAA Division I West Regional in Colfax, Wash.
- Santa Clara also welcomes seven newcomers in 2025-26 -- all freshmen -- who hail from three different states to give SCU a roster of 23. **Sigrid Brakenhielm** (Lake Oswego, Ore.), **Josie Cahill** (Winnetka, III.), **Emma Gardner** (Mill Valley, Calif.), **Heidi Green** (Santa Cruz, Calif.), **Ramneek Kaur** (San Jose, Calif.) and **Keira Kime** (Portland, Ore.).
- The Broncos were picked seventh out of 12 teams in August's West Coast Conference Preseason Poll, voted on by the conference's head coaches. Gonzaga (eight first-place votes), Washington State (2), Portland, San Francisco (2) and Oregon State were the top-five in the poll.
