Match Notes

- · Santa Clara and No. 15 Oregon State meet for the fifth time in history.
- With three matches remaining in the nine-game West Coast Conference schedule, Santa Clara sits in fifth place in the league standings with eight points. Oregon State moved into sole position of first (with 14 points) after beating Seattle U last weekend and with Portland losing to Santa Clara as the Beavers and the Pilots entered last weekend tied atop the WCC standings.
- Oregon State enters the game on a six-match unbeaten streak going 4-0-2 since WCC play started. In conference games, they have scored the most goals with 17 including five each in the last two matches.
- Arnau Farnos leads the WCC with 11 goals and 29 points.
- Goalkeeper John Nicolson has played in every minute of the Beavers' 13 games with a .587 save percentage and a 1.46 goals-against-average.
- Head coach Jarred Brookins is in his third season at the helm and has a 21-11-8 record in his first two seasons.

Season Notes

- Santa Clara is coming off a 1-0 shutout victory over then-No. 5 Portland that snapped the Pilots' 23-match unbeaten streak. Goalkeeper Jackson Ozburn made a penalty kick save in the 48th minute and Niv Berkovitz scored the game-winner in the 75th minute. Ozburn finished with five saves to earn his third WCC Defensive Player of the Week recognition on Monday.
- Berkovitz has scored a team-high six goals on the year, tied for fifth most in the WCC.
- Oregon State is the fifth ranked opponent SCU will face this season going 1-1-2 so far.
 They beat No. 5 Portland, lost to No. 4 Stanford and tied No. 16 Utah Valley as well as No. 11 San Diego.
- Freshman midfielder Ethan Martinez was <u>ranked the 19th best freshman</u> in the nation by TopDrawer Soccer in their midseason rankings. Martinez leads the team with 1,331 minutes logged (out of a possible 1,350 minutes). He has played the full 90 minutes in 13 of the 15 matches.
- The Broncos have a shutout in four of the six WCC matches and seven total on the year. They opened league play with three straight shutouts and spanned 363 minutes without conceding a goal. During that stretch, Ozburn had a streak of 318 minute shutout streak.
- The last time SCU opened WCC play with three straight clean sheets was in 2004, when they had four straight.
- SCU had four straight draws prior to beating Seattle U on Oct. 10. It was the first time in program history they played four consecutive matches ending in a tie.
- Santa Clara currently has played in six draws this season, tied for second most in program history (1986 and 2022). The program record for the most ties in a season is seven that occured in 2008.
- Ozburn leads the WCC with seven clean sheets. The Broncos keeper is fourth in save percentage (.755) and fourth in GAA with 0.91. He has been named WCC Defensive Player of the Week three times this season, on <u>Sept. 1</u>, <u>Oct. 6</u> and on <u>Oct. 27</u>.
- Simon Diagana leads the team in assists with four, the latest one coming on Berkovitz's game winner against Portland on Oct. 25.

Season Notes

- The Broncos started the 2025 campaign with a pair of 1-all draws, against Cleveland State on the road and against UC Davis in the home opener. It was the first time in program history to open the season with two draws.
- In the last two seasons, Santa Clara has been involved in four matches that was decided in the final two minutes. This season against UC Davis, the Broncos leveled the game in the 89th minute on a header by Niv Berkovitz. Last year, in the season opener, Florian Deletioglu scored the game winner in the 88th minute against UC San Diego. In September 2024, Itamar Efrat tallied the game winner with two seconds left in the match in the win over San Jose State and the Broncos gave up the go-ahead goal with 38 seconds left in the match against LMU in November.
- Head coach Cam Rast is in his 24th season at the helm where he has a career record of 211-160-73 including 108-70-38 in WCC and 105-60-41 at home.
- The Broncos play a total of 18 regular season matches, split evenly with nine nonconference and nine conference games. Last season, the number of league game increased from the customary seven matches they played from 2014-23 to eight due to Oregon State joining the league and this season it's up to nine matches with the addition of Seattle U.
- The Broncos play five teams that qualified for the 2024 NCAA Tournament UC Davis, Stanford, San Diego, Seattle and Oregon State. So far, they are 2-1-1 against those teams, getting wins over UC Davis and Seattle, losing to Stanford and playing to a draw against San Diego.

2025 Team

- The 2025 squad is comprised of 30 players including 19 returners and 11 newcomers.
- Two returners were named All-West Coast Conference last year senior Naji Elder and iunior Will Wiersdorf garnered second team honors.
- Eleven newcomers dot the roster: Ezana Alemayehu, Moises Almontes, Alejandro Arenas, Alen Begovic, Niv Berkovitz, Diego Diaz, Josmar Guandique, Ethan Martinez, Gabrielius Mazonas, James Saggau and James Wangsness.
- Of the 11 newcomers, seven are freshman and four are transfers Berkovitz (SMU), Diaz (Temple), Saggau (Cal Poly) and Wangsness (Princeton).
- Spencer Roberts returns to the team after pursuing an opportunity with the engineering department last year. He was on the team in 2023.
- The captains for this season are: senior midfielder Pierce Dyal and junior midfielder Will Wiersdorf.
- The Broncos return nine of 13 goals from last season (69.2%) led by Tyler Tipton with five.
 Will Wiersdorf tallied three goals and Itamar Efrat had one.
- Six of 11 assists (54.5%) returns led by Wiersdort and Andrew Sullivan with two each.
- Jackson Ozburn played in five games and posted a 2-3 record with a 1.60 goals-against-average, a .652 save percentage and recorded one shutout.
- During the offseason, goalkeeper Eddy Marin was a recipient of the <u>CalHOPE Courage Award</u>, an award honoring student-athletes at California colleges and universities who have overcome the stress, anxiety, and mental trauma associated with personal hardships and adversity.

Coaching Staff

- All four members of the coaching staff played in the WCC including three at Santa Clara
 head coach Cam Rast '91, associate head coach Eric Yamamoto '90 and assistant coach
 Jack Murphy '22. Assistant coach Riley Hanley '15 played at Saint Mary's.
- Rast is the winningest active coach in the WCC leading his alma mater to eight NCAA tournaments and seven WCC Championships since taking over the Bronco men's soccer program in 2002. A former All-America player on Santa Clara's National Championship team of 1989 (along with Yamamoto) and U.S. Olympic Team captain in 1992, Rast spent eight seasons as an assistant coach at SCU from 1994-2001 and was inducted to the WCC Hall of Honor in 2018.
- Rast has been named WCC Coach of the Year seven times (2003, '06, '07, '10, '15, '21 and '23).

In the Family

- Yamamoto's daughter, Malia, is a junior defender on the Santa Clara women's soccer team.
- Murphy's father, Gregg, is the associate head coach for the SCU women's soccer team.
