## Series History

## Match Notes

- Santa Clara and Seattle U meet for the 3rd time on Friday but the first as West Coast Conference foes as this is Seattle's inaugural season in the league.
- Two matches into the WCC schedule, Seattle sits in a four-way tie for second place with four points having gone 1-0-1 while Santa Clara is sixth with two points on a pair of ties.
- The Redhawks are undefeated in their last five matches going 3-0-2 in that span.
- Seattle U has tallied 20 goals on the season, fourth highest in the WCC, and are led by Yelder Zuluaga who has six goals and five assists, both tops on the team. His 17 points are the second highest total in the conference behind Oregon State's Arnau Farnos (20). Goalkeeper Charlie Lanphier leads the WCC with 40 saves but has conceded 19 goals.
- Head coach Nate Daligorn is in his third season at the helm and has a 24-8-7 record.

## Season Notes

- Santa Clara begins a stretch of playing three WCC matches over a span of 10 days beginning with Seattle U on Friday. The Broncos next play a midweek contest at Saint Mary's on Oct. 15 followed by a home game against San Francisco on Oct. 19.
- The Broncos are coming off a scoreless draw against Gonzaga last Saturday, their second straight scoreless draw match and fourth straight draw overall. It is the first time in program history they've played four consecutive matches ending in a tie.
- The program record for the most ties in a season is seven that occurred in 2008. In two other seasons, the Broncos had six ties, in 1986 and 2022.
- For his efforts against Gonzaga, senior goalkeeper Jackson Ozburn was [named WCC Defensive Player of the Week](#) for the second time this season. He first took the same honors back on Sept. 1.
- Ozburn has not conceded a goal in the last 218 minutes. The last goal he gave up was in the opening half against No. 16 Utah Valley (Sept. 20) before sitting out the second half.
- The Broncos have already scored more goals this season (14) than they did all last season (13). This season's balanced attack features eight players with a goal led by Niv Berkovitz with five.
- Berkovitz is fifth in the WCC with five goals.
- The back-to-back shutout wins against Sacramento State (Aug. 31) and San Diego State (Sept. 5) were their first since 2022 when they blanked Grand Canyon and Utah Tech.
- The Broncos started the 2025 campaign with a pair of 1-all draws, against Cleveland State on the road and against UC Davis in the home opener. It was the first time in program history to open the season with two draws.
- In the last two seasons, Santa Clara has been involved in four matches that was decided in the final two minutes. This season against UC Davis, the Broncos leveled the game in the 89th minute on a header by Niv Berkovitz. Last year, in the season opener, Florian Deletoglou scored the game winner in the 88th minute against UC San Diego. In September 2024, Itamar Efrat tallied the game winner with two seconds left in the match in the win over San Jose State and the Broncos gave up the go-ahead goal with 38 seconds left in the match against LMU in November.
- Freshman Ethan Martinez leads the team with 971 minutes logged (out of a possible 990 minutes). He has played the full 90 minutes in nine of the 11 matches.

Season Notes

- [Head coach Cam Rast](#) is in his 24th season at the helm where he has a career record of 209-158-73 including 106-68-38 in WCC and 103-59-41 at home.
- Santa Clara had a 5-8-3 season with a 2-4-2 West Coast Conference record in 2024 to finish sixth in the league standings among nine teams.
- The Broncos play a total of 18 regular season matches, split evenly with nine nonconference and nine conference games. Last season, the number of league game increased from the customary seven matches they played from 2014-23 to eight due to Oregon State joining the league and this season it’s up to nine matches with the addition of Seattle U.
- The Broncos face a challenging schedule playing five teams that qualified for the 2024 NCAA Tournament - UC Davis, Stanford, San Diego, Oregon State and Seattle. So far, they are 1-1-1 against those teams, getting the win over UC Davis, losing to Stanford and playing to a draw against San Diego.

2025 Team

- The 2025 squad is comprised of 30 players including 19 returners and 11 newcomers.
- Two returners were named All-West Coast Conference last year - senior Naji Elder and junior Will Wiersdorf garnered second team honors.
- Eleven newcomers dot the roster: Ezana Alemayehu, Moises Almontes, Alejandro Arenas, Alen Begovic, Niv Berkovitz, Diego Diaz, Josmar Guandique, Ethan Martinez, Gabriellus Mazonas, James Saggau and James Wangsness.
- Of the 11 newcomers, seven are freshman and four are transfers - Berkovitz (SMU), Diaz (Temple), Saggau (Cal Poly) and Wangsness (Princeton).
- Spencer Roberts returns to the team after pursuing an opportunity with the engineering department last year. He was on the team in 2023.
- The captains for this season are: senior midfielder Pierce Dyal and junior midfielder Will Wiersdorf.
- The Broncos return nine of 13 goals from last season (69.2%) led by Tyler Tipton with five. Will Wiersdorf tallied three goals and Itamar Efrat had one.
- Six of 11 assists (54.5%) returns led by Wiersdort and Andrew Sullivan with two each.
- Jackson Ozburn played in five games and posted a 2-3 record with a 1.60 goals-against-average, a .652 save percentage and recorded one shutout.
- During the offseason, goalkeeper Eddy Marin was a recipient of the [CalHOPE Courage Award](#), an award honoring student-athletes at California colleges and universities who have overcome the stress, anxiety, and mental trauma associated with personal hardships and adversity.

Preseason

- By a vote of the league’s 10 head coaches, Santa Clara was picked to finish seventh in the WCC with San Diego as the favorite to win the conference. League newcomer Seattle was picked to finish tied for fourth.

Coaching Staff

- All four members of the coaching staff played in the WCC including three at Santa Clara - head coach Cam Rast ‘91, associate head coach Eric Yamamoto ‘90 and assistant coach Jack Murphy ‘22. Assistant coach Riley Hanley ‘15 played at Saint Mary’s.
- Rast is the winningest active coach in the WCC leading his alma mater to eight NCAA tournaments and seven WCC Championships since taking over the Bronco men’s soccer program in 2002. A former All-America player on Santa Clara’s National Championship team of 1989 (along with Yamamoto) and U.S. Olympic Team captain in 1992, Rast spent eight seasons as an assistant coach at SCU from 1994-2001 and was inducted to the WCC Hall of Honor in 2018.
- Rast has been named WCC Coach of the Year seven times (2003, ‘06, ‘07, ‘10, ‘15, ‘21 and ‘23).

In the Family

- Yamamoto’s daughter, Malia, is a junior defender on the Santa Clara women’s soccer team.
- Murphy’s father, Gregg, is the associate head coach for the SCU women’s soccer team.
