Meet Notes

- The Santa Clara University men's cross country team drives to the capital for Friday's 2025 NCAA Division I West Region Championship, hosted by Sacramento State at the Arcade Creek Cross Country Course.
- The Broncos placed 13th at the 2024 NCAA West Regional meet, beating 18 other teams and finishing fourth among West Coast Conference teams. The Broncos earned a top-10 team finish in 2023, finishing ninth.
- **Nicholas Russell** was the Broncos' most recent qualifier for the NCAA Championship meet, placing fifth as an individual at the 2023 NCAA West Regional race and earning a trip to Charlottesville, Va., where he placed 57th in the national championship.
- The Broncos earned three consecutive top-10 team finishes at the NCAA West Regional Championship from 2021-23 and had individuals qualify for the NCAA Championship race in 2020 (held in 2021), 2022 and 2023.

Shuttle Service: Runs from 6:30 a.m. until 30 minutes after the awards ceremony.

Continuous loop between the parking lot and the venue (approx. 7–10 minute drive).

Upon Arrival: Check in with parking attendants to receive your wristband and parking pass.

Season Notes

• Santa Clara finished sixth as a squad at the 2025 WCC Championship on Nov. 1 at The Course in Spokane (Wash.), led by a top-30 finish from **Daniel Trampe**.

Trampe placed 29th in 24 minutes, 24.6 seconds and anchored a tightly clustered scoring group for the Broncos. Freshman **Zafer Courcelle** followed in 32nd at 24:38.9, with **Paul Beaven** (36th, 24:54.4), **Kyle Berg** (38th, 25:03.4), and **Jacob McManus** (42nd, 25:11.3) rounding out the scoring five.

Santa Clara completed Saturday's race with a team score of 158, placing sixth among the 10-team field. The Broncos were only 20 points behind fourth-place San Francisco (138 points). Washington State captured the team title with 26 points, followed by Portland (50) and Gonzaga (58) to close out the top three.

• The Broncos split their squad on Oct. 17 and 18 for the second time in the month, sending a team to face some of the nation's best at the Pre-Nationals Invitational on Oct. 17 in Columbia, Mo., and posting a steady team performance at its own Bronco Invitational on Oct. 18 in Sunnyvale, Calif.

Daniel Trampe paced the Broncos at the Pre Nationals Invitational, placing 86th in 24:31.3 over the 8-kilometer course as Santa Clara's lone top-100 finisher. Freshman **Zafer Courcelle** followed close behind, taking 108th in 24:49.6. **Liam Papavasiliou** led the Broncos with a 23rd-place finish at the Bronco Invitational in 24:32.4, followed by **Jacob McManus** (31st, 24:43.2) and **Evan Charkut** (32nd, 24:44.2).

• Santa Clara split its squad for the first time this year on Oct. 3, grabbing a meet victory and also facing some of the country's best on the same day. The Broncos took home the trophy at the Pacific Invitational in Lodi, Calif., while another group competed in the morning at the 46th annual Sean Earl Lakefront Invitational in Chicago.

Santa Clara landed three runners in the top-four and five in the top-11 at the Pacific Invitational, piling up 28 points to claim the team championship at Micke Grove Golf Course. **McCoy Brooks** spearheaded SCU's victory with a runner-up finish, clocking 24:56.1 over the 8-kilometer course. Right on his heels was **Kaden Helder** in third at 25:04.9. **Jack Tobin**, competing unattached, crossed in fourth with a 25:13.0 effort. **Evan Charkut** provided the Broncos' third scoring mark by securing seventh in 25:32.3.

Senior **Daniel Trampe** set the tone for Santa Clara in the Tom Cooney men's 8-kilometer championship race at Loyola Chicago's 46th annual Lakefront Invitational at Sydney R. Marovitz Golf Course on Chicago's North Side. He dipped under 25 minutes for the first time this season, placing 60th in 24:46.85.

 Santa Clara earned its second top-five team finish in as many races on Sept. 13, placing fifth at the Kim Duyst Twilight, hosted by Stanislaus State at River Oaks Golf Course.

Kyle Berg was the Broncos' top finisher that day, grabbing a 13th-place individual showing with a time of 24 minutes, 8.6 seconds over the 8-kilometer course. Freshman **Zafer Courcelle** finished close behind Berg in 19th place in 24:24.8.

• Santa Clara opened its season on Aug. 29 with three top-25 individual finishes at the 32nd annual USF Invitational en route to a fourth-place team showing at the Speedway Meadows in Golden Gate Park.

Inbaa Chennai led the Broncos individually, grabbing a top-10 finish with a 10th-place performance in 25 minutes, 3.6 seconds over the 8-kilometer course. Fellow underclassman **Evan Charkut** was among the top-15 in 13th place, running a time of 25:06.1. Senior **Andrew Ho** gave SCU three among the top-25 with a 22nd-place finish in 25:14.2.

• The Broncos return 22 student-athletes who competed in 2024-25, either during the fall cross country season or track in the winter/spring. The returners are led by **Paul Beaven**, who was the Broncos' top finisher at the 2024 NCAA Cross Country Division I West Regional in Colfax, Wash., placing 59th overall in 30:31.5 over the 10 km course.

Season Notes

- Santa Clara also welcomes seven newcomers in 2025-26 -- six freshmen and a junior college transfer. **James Estrella** is the veteran of the newcomer group after competing for two years at De Anza College. The San Jose, Calif., native was a California Community College Athletics Association Northern California champion in the 3,000-meter steeplechase and the 5,000 in May, and he helped lead the Lions to a Coast Conference title in cross country last fall.
- The six rookies on the roster this fall all hail from the Pacific Northwest and include: Will Carroll (Tacoma, Wash.), Zafer Courcelle (Portland, Ore.), Jacob McManus (Vancouver, Wash.), Connor Rickey (Issaquah, Wash.), Coen Strub (Portland, Ore.) and Jack Tobin (Boise, Idaho).
- The Broncos were picked fourth out of 10 teams in the preseason's West Coast Conference Preseason Poll, voted on by the conference's head coaches. Portland (six first-place votes), Washington State (3) and Gonzaga (1) were the three teams ahead of Santa Clara in the poll. SCU earned 53 points in the poll, one of only four teams to earn 50 or more vote points.
