Game Notes

- The No. 17 Santa Clara men's water polo team heads to Colorado for the 2025 West Coast Conference Tournament, hosted by Air Force at the Cadet Natatorium. The sixthseeded Broncos open postseason play with a rematch versus No. 8-ranked and thirdseeded Pepperdine, whom they closed the regular season with last week.
- Pepperdine has won five consecutive matchups in the series dating to 2015, a streak that started with a neutral site win in Los Angeles on Oct. 11, 2015. Santa Clara last defeated Pepperdine at its own Sullivan Aquatic Center on Nov. 14, 2014 -- 11 years from Friday's game -- in a 16-15 victory.
- The Broncos are 0-2 all-time in the WCC Tournament (since 2023). Both losses came against California Baptist, but both were close -- by 2 goals (11-9) in 2023, and by only one goal (12-11) in 2024.

Season Notes

• <u>LAST TIME OUT</u> -- Santa Clara battled toe-to-toe with No. 8 Pepperdine on Friday, matching the Waves throughout a tightly contested first half before the Waves pulled away late in a 15–9 WCC decision on Senior Day at Sullivan Aquatic Center.

The Broncos kept pace early, pulling even at 4–4 in the second period and briefly going in front when **Imme van der Schaaf** scored late in the second to make it 5–4. Santa Clara stayed within striking distance through the third before Pepperdine capitalized on a few extra possessions in the final period to widen the gap.

A program-best four Santa Clara players earned all-WCC recognition Tuesday, led by
a first-team honor for sophomore utility Riccardo De Simon — the third straight year
the Broncos have placed someone on the first team.

Sophomore utility **Henry Engs** landed on the second team, senior center **Reese Jenican** earned an honorable mention, and freshman utility **Imme van der Schaaf** was named to the all-freshman team. The four awards are the most Santa Clara has collected in the WCC's three years sponsoring the sport (since 2023) after earning three in each of the first two seasons. It also marks the program's most all-conference honors since earning four in 2022, its final year in the Western Water Polo Association.

• Riccardo De Simon leads the WCC in steals (67) and sprint wins (49), and is ranked second in field blocks (17) heading into the postseason. He's also fifth in the conference with 66 goals. Henry Engs is third in the conference with 54 assists. Harrison Labrosse is fifth in the WCC with 161 saves and second with a 12.8 goals against average.

Season Notes

- Eight Santa Clara men's water polo student-athletes earned WCC All-Academic Honorable Mention recognition Wednesday. Julien Chow, Riccardo De Simon, Charlie Engs, Henry Engs, Reese Jenican, Harrison Labrosse, Grant Roesch and Thomas Wisdom all earned the academic accolade.
- Senior center **Reese Jenican** earned Santa Clara's third consecutive KAP7 WCC Player of the Week award on Oct. 7 after helping lead Santa Clara past No. 15 Pacific on Oct. 5 in their conference opener. Jenican delivered in the clutch, scoring a gamehigh four goals, including the decisive strike in the final minute. With the score tied 11-11 and only 54 seconds on the clock, he took an entry pass from Imme van der Schaaf at two meters, fought for position, turned, and fired home the go-ahead goal to put the Broncos ahead for good.
- Santa Clara's WCC-opening win over Pacific on Oct. 5 was its first conferenceplay-opening win since 2021, when it beat Biola, 19-7, to open Western Water Polo Association competition. The Broncos were 0-2 in their first two WCC openers (beginning in 2023), though both of those games were decided in sudden victory overtime.
- Santa Clara swept the KAP7 WCC weekly awards on Sept. 30, with **Riccardo De Simon** earning his second consecutive Player of the Week accolade, and freshman **Imme van der Schaaf** collecting his first Newcomer of the Week recognition.

The two underclassmen were key in the No. 16 Broncos' narrow defeat at the hands of then-No. 9 UC Davis Saturday. De Simon was the team's leading scorer with four goals, and van der Schaaf added three. De Simon also drew four exclusions, swiped three steals and dished two assists for six total points. Van der Schaaf dished an assist along with his three scores for four points, swiped a steal and drew an exclusion.

• De Simon's first WCC Player of the Week award came on Sept. 23 after scoring 13 goals in four games on Sept. 19-21 at the prestigious Overnght MPSF Invitational in Los Angeles. De Simon posted four multi-goal performances in four games, including a career-high six goals on Sept. 20 to beat Redlands. He scored three times on Sept. 19 in the tournament opener versus No. 5 Stanford, scored two against No. 17 UC Santa Barbara on Sept. 21 to help the Broncos beat the Gauchos for the first time in program history, and he scored two more on Sept. 20 versus No. 15 California Baptist.

The sophomore from Bologna, Italy, grabbed 11 steals and dished six assists over the three-day tournament. He was a perfect 10-for-10 in sprint victories during the weekend, and he also drew nine exclusions and recorded six field blocks.

- Senior center **Reese Jenican** was named to the 2025 Cutino Award Watch List on Sept. 25, the program's second selection in as many seasons following Zach Fales' inclusion in 2024. Jenican has appeared in 86 career games for the Broncos as a starting center, totaling 77 goals, 16 assists, 38 steals, and 127 drawn exclusions. This season, he's fourth on the team with 14 goals, and tied for the team lead with 22 drawn exclusions. He has also contributed four steals and three field blocks. He scored a season-high four goals in the Broncos' 23-13 win over Mount St. Mary's on Sept. 6 and has drawn a season-high four exclusions in three different games.
- Freshmen powered Santa Clara to its most goals in a game in at least 18 years on Opening Day at UC Merced on Aug. 29. Rookies Imme van der Schaaf, Ashton Brown, Beck Early, Jamie De Zwart and Weston Bancroft all shined in their collegiate debuts with multi-goal games, leading the Broncos to a a dominating, 26-3, victory. Van der Schaaf led SCU with four goals, Brown scored three, while Early, De Zwart and redshirt freshman Weston Bancroft all scored two each.
- Santa Clara finished fifth in the West Coast Conference a year ago, posted its first over-.500 record in five years and nearly upset eventual WCC Tournament champion California Baptist in the first round of the tourney. The Broncos won 13 games last season and have won double-digit games in four consecutive years and six straight when not including the COVID-19-shortened 2020 season.

Season Notes

- Riccardo De Simon was named to the WCC Preseason Team on Aug. 22. De Simon quickly established himself last year as one of the WCC's top all-around players. He earned All-American Honorable Mention from the Association of Collegiate Water Polo Coaches, all-WCC Honorable Mention, and was named WCC Newcomer of the Week three times in his debut season. He also excelled in the classroom, earning ACWPC All-Academic "Superior" honors and a spot on the WCC Commissioner's Honor Roll with "Bronze" accolades.
- Santa Clara returns two of its top-three point scorers from a year ago in De Simon (77 total points) and **Henry Engs** (61 total points). De Simon was the Broncos' second-leading scorer with 51 goals, while Engs was No. 2 in assists with 36.
- The Broncos also return starting goalkeeper Harrison Labrosse, who totaled 363 saves across his first two seasons. He also brought 22 career steals and 20 games of 10 or more saves into 2025. Labrosse has logged eight double-digit saves games this season and has earned six of the Broncos' nine wins in net.
- Santa Clara head coach **Keith Wilbur** reached his 300th career men's water polo win last season thanks to a 14-12 win at No. 13 UC Davis on Sept. 27, 2024. He's earned all 300 of his wins at the helm of the Broncos' program. Wilbur is in his 24th season as head coach of the program and is the winningest coach in program history. He began his tenure at Santa Clara in the fall of 2002.

- The Broncos (13-10 in 2024) finished 2024 ranked 18th in the final ACWPC poll. Santa Clara has 13 matches scheduled in 2025 against teams ranked in the CWPA preseason top-20 poll, including showdowns against top-10 teams like its battle versus No. 4 Fordham on Sept. 7, two clashes versus Stanford (No. 5) on Sept. 19 and Nov. 5, and one against Long Beach State (No. 7) on Oct. 11. They'll also face San Jose State (No. 6) and Pacific (No. 10) in conference play.
- All seven members of the WCC received votes in the CWPA preseason national poll, with six of them earning placement in the poll. WCC Preseason Coaches' Poll favorite San Jose State was tabbed No. 10. Pepperdine was the highest-ranked WCC member at No. 7. Pacific landed at No. 9, California Baptist was No. 13, LMU was placed at No. 16, and the Broncos came in at No. 18. Air Force earned two votes in the CWPA poll.
