### Tournament Notes

- Santa Clara will play in the third of seven spring events this week with a quick trip over to Fresno for the Nick Watney Invitational.
- The event will be hosted by Fresno State and played at the Sunnyside Country Club, set up as a 6,938 par-71.
- Matt Robles will once again tee off No. 1 followed by Calder Overfelt, Emil Nielsen, J.P. Odland and Alvaro Muller. Jolo Magcalayo and Jack Hayden will also play as individuals.
- 13 teams are set to make up the field - Santa Clara, Fresno State, Air Force, CSUN, Cal Poly, Idaho, Pacific, Sacramento State, San Diego, USF, Southern Utah, UC San Diego and Utah Valley.

### Season Notes

- Santa Clara is coming off one of their top finishes of the season with a third-place finish at the John Burns Intercollegiate. The Broncos defeated five teams head-to-head that were ranked inside the top 40 of the Scoreboard Rankings. Freshman Matt Robles led the way individually for the second-consecutive tournament, finishing 4-under 206 to tie for eighth.
- The Broncos opened the spring with a sixth-place finish at the N.I.T. in Tucson, carding a 19-under 845 two-day total. Robles turned in the second top-five finish of his young career, tying for fifth at 11-under 205.
- Robles shot in the 60s in all three rounds of the N.I.T. - 69-67-69. His 205 total is the second-best by a Bronco this season behind J.P. Odland's 198.
- Santa Clara opened the season with a bang, capturing both the team and individual title at the Myrtle Beach Golf Trips Intercollegiate. The team turned a three-day total of 21-under 843 to capture the tournament championship.
- Sophomore J.P. Odland won the first event of his young Bronco Career, and became the first Bronco to win medalist honors since Nolan Forsman in 2021. He finished the event 9-under 67-71-69--207 and was part of a three-way tie for first place.
- Through seven events, Robles leads the team in scoring average at 71.20 strokes, followed by Odland (71.43), Calder Overfelt (71.52), Alvaro Muller (72.24) and Emil Nielsen (72.29).
- Robles and Odland are tied for the team lead with six rounds in the 60s while Nielsen leads the way in rounds under par with 10.
- Overfelt leads the team in top-20 finishes with four on the season. His best was a tie for 14th at the John Burns Intercollegiate (3-under 207).
- Odland made program history at the Alister MacKenzie Invitational, tying the program record of 15-under par (67-66-65--198) to finish in seventh.
- Jack Hayden also won medalist honors for the first time of his career with a 5-under 211 tally at the 2024 Otter Invitational where he played as an individual participant.
- Nielsen couldn't have asked for a much better debut, turning in an 8-under 208 to finish in fourth at the Myrtle Beach Intercollegiate.
- The Broncos are in the fourth year under the direction of head coach Andrew Larkin.
