2024-25 Team

- Santa Clara is led by head coach Niall Angus who is in his ninth season at the helm and assisted by Josh Page who is in his first season.
- The Broncos roster is comprised of nine players this fall with four returnees and five newcomers.
- The returnees are: junior Alexander Watanabe Eriksson, sophomores Tiago Boschmans, Luca Lemaitre and Lukas Maskow.
- This is the first fall season for Boschmans and Lemaitre who were mid-year enrollees last year.
- The newcomers are: transfer John Kim from Cal, freshmen Luca Bluett, Valentin Faure, Mahir Khurana and Payton Jim On.
- The Broncos lost five players Sebastian Buxman, Guillaume Dalmasso, Arjun Honnappa, Christian Lerby and Matthew Rodriguez to graduation who helped the team finish No. 59 in the final ITA rankings, the highest year-end ranking since 2014, with a 19-8 record last season. They advanced to the semifinal rounds at both the WCC tournament and the UTR Sports NIT Championship.
- The 19 win total in 2023-24 was the most since 2011-12. The Broncos were nationally ranked in 12 straight weeks reaching a high of No. 53, the highest since 2014-15, defeating four nationally ranked teams along the way. The last time the program has been ranked this many times in a season was the 2013-14 campaign when they were ranked 15 times.
- Buxman currently serves as a student assistant coach while he completes his Master of Science degree in computer science and engineering.

Match/Season Notes

Coming Up:

• No. 71 Santa Clara begins a stretch of playing four WCC matches over a nine day span starting with Saturday's WCC opener on the road at No. 7 San Diego, followed by a Sunday match at LMU. San Diego features a pair of nationally ranked singles players and doubles teams. Oliver Tarvet is ranked in the top-10 in both disciplines at No. 7 in singles and No. 2 in doubles paired with Stian Klaassen.

San Diego Connection:

• SCU assistant coach Josh Page who is in his first year with the program played at San Diego captaining the squad his senior year in 2016-17. Page overlapped playing one season with Bronco head coach Niall Angus' younger brother, Jordan.

Last Time Out:

• Santa Clara lost to No. 38 Boise State 4-1 in a match that took over 24 hours from first serve to completion. The match started at 11 a.m. PT on Monday at Santa Clara. SCU claimed the doubles point and just as singles play started, play was halted several times due to off and on rain. With Boise State's schedule of playing at Cal Poly on Wednesday, the SCU-Boise State match resumed down in San Luis Obispo on Tuesday where Boise State won the first four singles matches to clinch the match.

National Ranking:

• Santa Clara is ranked for the fifth straight week coming in at No. 71 nationally this week. They have been ranked No. 60, 60, 67 and 72 the previous four weeks.

Court 3 through 6 Dominance:

• The Broncos have won eight of their last 11 matches. In the eight wins, they are 29-1 at the No. 3-6 spots in the singles lineup.

WCC Accolades:

- Luca Bluett and John Kim were named West Coast Conference Doubles Team of the Week on Feb. 11.
- Watanabe Eriksson was named <u>WCC Singles Player of the Week</u> on March 4.

Stats:

- Tiago Boschmans leads the team with eight singles wins.
- Boschmans and Valentin Faure leads the team with eight doubles wins this spring.

2025 Preseason

• Santa Clara was picked to finish fourth in the 2025 West Coast Conference preseason poll, as voted by the league's nine head coaches. The Broncos garnered 28 points, behind perennial national power houses San Diego (48 points including six first place votes), Pepperdine (44 points, two first place votes) as well as Pacific (36).
