### Tournament Notes

- Santa Clara has not one but two events on tap for the week, beginning with a quick drive north to Napa Valley to take part in the Bridgestone Collegiate Invitational hosted by Central Michigan. Following that, the Broncos will play in the Goodwin hosted by Stanford in Palo Alto, March 27-29.
- The lineup remains unchanged once again as freshman Matt Robles will continue to play in the No. 1 slot followed by J.P. Odland, Alvaro Muller, Emil Nielsen and Calder Overfelt. Jack Hayden will join them on the course as an individual.
- A total of 15 teams are set to compete in the event: Santa Clara, Central Michigan, San Francisco, BYU, North Carolina A&T, Howard, Michigan State, San Jose State, North Alabama, Florida A&M, Cal Poly, UC Davis, Texas Southern and a pair of Japanese Universities - Nihon University and Tohoku Fukushi University.

### Season Notes

- Santa Clara is coming off a tie for sixth at the Lamkin where they shot 11-under 853.
- Freshman Matt Robles had a fantastic February with three top-eight finishes. He averaged 68.4 strokes with seven rounds in the 60s across the three tournaments.
- Robles continues to lead the team in scoring 71.00 through 21 rounds.
- The Broncos finished third at the Nick Watney Invitational, carding a 17-under 835 as Robles picked up his best collegiate finish with a tie for fourth at 8-under 205.
- Prior to the Nick Watney, The Broncos finished third at the John Burns Intercollegiate where they defeated five teams head-to-head that were ranked inside the top 40 of the Scoreboard Rankings. Robles led the way individually for the third-consecutive tournament, finishing 4-under 206 to tie for eighth.
- The Broncos opened the spring with a sixth-place finish at the N.I.T. in Tucson, carding a 19-under 845 two-day total. Robles turned in another top-five finish, tying for fifth at 11-under 205.
- Santa Clara opened the season with a bang, capturing both the team and individual title at the Myrtle Beach Golf Trips Intercollegiate. The team turned a three-day total of 21-under 843 to capture the tournament championship.
- Sophomore J.P. Odland won the first event of his young Bronco Career, and became the first Bronco to win medalist honors since Nolan Forsman in 2021. He finished the event 9-under 67-71-69--207 and was part of a three-way tie for first place.
- In addition to Robles, Odland (71.56) and Calder Overfelt (71.97) are both averaging under 72 strokes while Emil Nielsen (72.03) and Alvaro Muller (72.20) are just above it.
- Robles and Odland are tied for the team lead with eight rounds in the 60s while Nielsen leads the team with 13 rounds under par.
- Overfelt and Robles are tied for the team-lead in top-20 finishes with four on the season.
- Odland made program history at the Alister MacKenzie Invitational, tying the program record of 15-under par (67-66-65--198) to finish in seventh.
- Jack Hayden also won medalist honors for the first time of his career with a 5-under 211 tally at the 2024 Otter Invitational where he played as an individual participant.
- Nielsen couldn't have asked for a much better debut, turning in an 8-under 208 to finish in fourth at the Myrtle Beach Intercollegiate.
- The Broncos are in the fourth year under the direction of head coach Andrew Larkin.
