#### **Match Notes**

- Santa Clara heads to Southern California this weekend for a three-game road trip that includes Golden Coast Conference matches at Azusa Pacific and No. 12-ranked LMU, as well as a non-conference tilt on Sunday at Occidental College.
- Santa Clara won seven consecutive matchups versus Azusa Pacific from 2013-16, but it's been the Cougars who have taken control of the series in recent years, winning nine straight since 2017.
- No. 12 LMU hasn't dropped a game versus the Broncos in the last 20 matchups, dating to 2010. The Broncos have played the Lions close, however, in several meetings.
   Four of the teams' last seven games have been decided by five goals or fewer.
- Santa Clara hasn't lost to Occidental in three meetings since 2010, though they haven't played each other since 2015. Sunday will be the Broncos' first true road game at the Tigers in at least the past 16 seasons (since 2010).

#### **Season Notes**

• Mia Barkett and Libby Slater both scored goals Saturday for Santa Clara (4-11, 0-2 GCC), as visiting No. 13 Harvard earned an 18-2 non-conference victory at Sullivan Aquatic Center.

Barkett notched her third goal of the season in the first period to get the Broncos on the board. **Francesca Moynihan** fed Barkett for the score at the 3 minutes, 7 seconds mark of the opening frame, making it 3-1 at the time. Slater battled down low at the two-meter spot for her goal right before the end of the first period. She turned and fired a shot into the net with eight seconds left for her 21st score of the year.

- Kate Rodman currently leads the team in scoring this season with 26 goals and 33 points, with Megan Chambliss following closely behind with 22. Syndey Maccabe leads the team in conference goals with five. The team also has a total of 95 assists this season, with the top contributing players being Francesca Moynihan (13), Maccabe (11), and Chambliss (10).
- Several Broncos rank among the GCC's top-10 in multiple defensive categories. **Sydney Maccabe** is tied for third in the conference with 12 field blocks. **Kate Rodman** is tied for sixth in the GCC with 24 steals. Goalkeeper **Haley Tassell** ranks seventh with 90 saves this season and sixth with 6.0 saves per game.
- Santa Clara's 2025 schedule includes games versus 10 different nationally ranked opponents, five games against teams it beat in 2024, and two separate in-season tournaments.
- The Broncos (7-22 in 2024) are playing 10 home games in 2025, including four during its annual Bronco Invitational, which took place on Feb. 14-16. The Broncos are 9-17 at home over the past two seasons (4-7 in 2024, 5-8 in 2023). They haven't had that many home victories in a two-year span since 2017-18, when they also had nine.
- The top four teams in the Golden Coast Conference preseason poll are ranked in both the CWPA and the ACWPC polls. Defending champion Fresno State is ranked as high as No. 9 in the Collegiate Water Polo Association poll, with LMU landing at No. 11. GCC Preseason No. 3 Pacific is ranked No. 23 and San Diego State is ranked No. 20.
- Santa Clara graduated each of its top three point scorers from 2024, but it returns each of its next three: Sydney Maccabe, Kate Rodman and Megan Chambliss.
   Maccabe and Rodman were both second on the team with 24 goals, while Chambliss was third with 16 assists. Maccabe was the team leader with 48 sprint wins and 12 field blocks.
- Kate Rodman landed on the all-Golden Coast Conference second team as a sophomore in 2023. She tied for the team lead with 42 goals that season. She tallied 15 assists for a total of 57 points on the year second-most on the team. The now-senior driver also had 26 steals and 15 drawn exclusions back in that 2023 campaign.
- Santa Clara raked in the academic awards last school year. The team landed a program-record 17 of its student-athletes on the 2024 GCC All-Academic Team, tied for second-most in the conference. The Broncos were only two student-athletes behind San Diego State (19) for the most in the conference and tied with Pacific, who also had 17. Santa Clara's previous high in GCC All-Academic Team members was 15 in 2020. The Broncos had 14 recognized in each of the previous three seasons (2023, '22 and '21).
- The Broncos then collected 15 more all-academic awards from the ACWPC. The Broncos also collected another All-Academic Team award from the ACWPC, its 14th in a row. The team has been tabbed an All-Academic Team by the ACWPC every year since 2011. The team carried a collective cumulative GPA of 3.36 in 2024.
