### 2024-25 Team

- Santa Clara is led by second year head coach Allie Will-Van Alstyne and assisted by Connor Van Alstyne, also in his second season.

- The roster is comprised of 10 players this fall with four returnees and six newcomers.
- The returnees are: seniors Kacey Feng, Velizara Fileva and Olivia Wiese as well as junior Anna Semler.
- The newcomers are: transfers Daniella Dimitrova from Baylor, Tian Yu Dong and Jamie Pope both from Saint Mary's, Jillian Roa from Nebraska plus freshmen Juliette Krumholz and Anna Rahman.
- Dimitrova sat out the fall campaign and will be making her Bronco debut in the spring.
- SCU lost five players - Maria Antonova, JennaMarie Gordon, Finley Kalinic, Gabriela Tevez and Varya Zlotnik - from last season's team.

## Match/Season Notes

### Coming Up:

- Santa Clara heads to the Evergreen State to face Gonzaga on Friday and No. 61 Washington State on Saturday in the final regular matches of the season.
- The Broncos are 2-2 in West Coast Conference action and is tied for fifth with Gonzaga in the league standings.
- At 4-2 in league play, Washington State sits in a third place tie with LMU.
- The top six teams qualify for the WCC Tournament that takes place from April 24-26 at the Aztec Tennis Center on the campus of San Diego State.

### Last Time Out:

- Santa Clara beat Pacific 4-3 on a 3-all clincher by Juliette Krumholz last Sunday. It was also Senior Day where four seniors - Kacey Feng, Velizara Fileva, Jillian Roa and Olivia Wiese - were recognized in a pre-match ceremony.

### Win Totals:

- The Broncos are 8-10 on the season. They picked up their seventh win of the year defeating Saint Mary's on April 3, eclipsing last season's win total of six. Head coach Allie-Will Van Alstyne continues to put the program on an upward trajectory winning six matches last season in her first year after inheriting a program that went winless the year prior in 2022-23.

### Winning Records on Courts 3, 4 & 5:

- Singles No. 3, 4 & 5 have been the strength of the team this season as the Bronco players are a combined 32-19. Fileva is 10-3 at No. 3, Jillian Roa is 10-5 at No. 4 and Anna Rahman is 9-5 at No. 5.

### Doubles Play is Key:

- In six of the eight wins this season, SCU has won the doubles point.
- In each of the 10 losses, the Broncos have dropped the doubles point. Five of those losses have been by a 4-3 score.

### Stats:

- Fileva leads the team with 11 singles wins.
- Daniella Dimitrova has a team-high three match win streak in singles.
- Roa had a nine match win streak at No. 4 earlier in the season.
- Dimitrova and Tian Yu Dong leads the team with eight doubles wins this spring. They've won four of them while paired together.

### Unlucky Weather:

- The weather affected the match times for four straight scheduled matches (Jan. 25 - Feb. 1) including one postponement and cancelation each along with pushing up the start time in two others. It also impacted the match against Stanford (Feb. 19) with a couple of rain delays but was eventually completed after five and a half hours. The match against Long Beach State on April 1 was canceled due to rain.
