Match Notes

- Santa Clara travels to Los Angeles for the 2025 Golden Coast Conference Championship Tournament, hosted by LMU at the Burns Aquatic Center. The Broncos open the tournament at 4 p.m. Friday versus regular season champion, No. 1 seed, No. 12-ranked and host LMU.
- The Lions defeated the Broncos, 17-7, in Los Angeles during their regular season meeting on March 29. It marked LMU's 23rd straight victory in the series since 2010.
- This year's first-round meeting in the GCC Tournament marks the third time in the past four seasons the Broncos and Lions have met in the first round, with LMU winning in 2022 and 2023.
- The Lions got a real scare from the Broncos in the first round of the 2023 GCC Tournament, barely holding on for a 12-10 win after Santa Clara scored seven unanswered goals in the fourth period before time ran out.

Season Notes

• The Broncos (6-17, 0-7 GCC) split their last road trip of the regular season last weekend, falling in their final GCC game at Concordia University Irvine, 9-8, on Thursday, before beating Chapman, 14-13, in a non-conference matchup on Friday.

AT CONCORDIA IRVINE -- Santa Clara led into the fourth period Thursday at CUI, but the Golden Eagles got two unanswered goals and held on for a 9-8 GCC win. **Megan Chambliss** put SCU back ahead by one at 8-7 after CUI's Sierrah Ferguson had tied it at 7-7. It was Ferguson who put the Golden Eagles ahead for good at 9-8 with a goal at the 2 minutes, 31 seconds mark of the fourth period. The Broncos took five shots in the game's final four minutes after CUI tied it at 8-8, but couldn't find the back of the net. Two of the shots hit the post, and another was saved by CUI goalkeeper Jaden Soto.

AT CHAPMAN -- Santa Clara started the game on a 6-0 run that carried into the second period. It got goals from four different players to start, including two each from **Sydney Maccabe** and **Libby Slater**. Chapman finally got its first goal of the game with only 42 seconds left in the first half on a penalty shot. It took a power play to get the Panthers their second goal, and it wasn't until the third period when they finally scored their first full-strength goal.

Season Notes

• Santa Clara earned two all-GCC honors Tuesday, as voted on by the conference's eight head coaches, with senior driver **Kate Rodman** earning honorable mention distinction and freshman driver **Chloe Rizof** being placed on the GCC All-Freshmen team.

It's Rodman's second career all-GCC nod after also being named to the second team as a sophomore in 2023. Rodman is second on the team with 37 goals and 49 points. Her 12 assists are fourth on the team. She leads the Broncos and ranks ninth in the GCC with 29 steals this season, and ranks 10th in the conference with 15 sprint wins.

Rizof's debut season includes 19 goals, five assists and 24 total points – sixth on the team. She's also collected 11 steals and 15 drawn exclusions in her true freshman season. Rizof tallied six multi-goal games in the regular season, including a run of three in a row from Feb. 16-28. She scored a season-high three goals twice, first at Claremont-Mudd-Scripps on March 1, and then again at Azusa Pacific on March 28.

- Chambliss currently leads the team in scoring this season with 38 goals and holds the team points lead with 53. Rodman follows closely behind with 37. Maccabe and Slater are tied for the team lead in conference goals with 10. The team also has a total of 141 assists this season, with the top contributing players being Moynihan (22), Maccabe (18), and Chambliss (15).
- Several Broncos rank among the GCC's top-10 in multiple defensive categories. Maccabe is tied for seventh in the conference with 14 field blocks. Rodman is ninth in the GCC with 29 steals. Goalkeeper **Haley Tassell** ranks sixth with 134 saves this season and sixth with 5.8 saves per game.
- The Broncos honored six seniors on April 13 before their non-conference game versus Fresno Pacific, their final home game of the season, and the six seniors' final home game as members of the program. **Nina Damjanac, Sophia Harvey, Francesca Moynihan, Stephanie Nelson,** Slater and Rodman were all honored in a pregame ceremony. The six have combined to play in 452 games for the Broncos and score 225 goals.
- In their domination of Occidental on March 30, the Broncos jumped out to an early lead with seven goals in the first period alone. They'd nearly double that with six more in the second period while blanking the Tigers to take a 13-3 lead into halftime. The Broncos scored four goals in both the third and fourth periods, while limiting Occidental to only one goal in the third and three in the fourth.

Chambliss led the Broncos with four goals in that game, while Rodman tallied three goals. It was Chambliss' second multi-goal game in as many days after scoring two on March 29 at LMU. **Makenna Genco**, Maccabe and Slater each scored twice. **Annika Burks, Evelyn McLaughlin**, Moynihan, **Avary Torres**, **Khloe Tarbet**, **Mia Barkett**, Rizof and Harvey all scored once.

- Santa Clara's 2025 regular season schedule included games versus 10 different nationally ranked opponents, five games against teams it beat in 2024, and two separate in-season tournaments.
- The Broncos (7-22 in 2024) played 10 home games in 2025, including four during its annual Bronco Invitational, which took place on Feb. 14-16. The Broncos went 2-8 at home this season after going 9-17 over the 2024 and 2023 seasons (4-7 in 2024, 5-8 in 2023). They haven't had that many home victories in a two-year span since 2017-18, when they also had nine.
- The top four teams in the Golden Coast Conference preseason poll are ranked in both the CWPA and the ACWPC polls. 2024 champion Fresno State is ranked as high as No. 8 in the Collegiate Water Polo Association poll, with this year's champion, LMU, landing at No. 9. GCC Preseason No. 3 Pacific is ranked No. 21 and San Diego State is ranked No. 22.

Season Notes

- Santa Clara graduated each of its top three point scorers from 2024, but it returns each of its next three: Sydney Maccabe, Kate Rodman and Megan Chambliss. Maccabe and Rodman were both second on the team with 24 goals in 2024, while Chambliss was third with 16 assists. Maccabe was the team leader with 48 sprint wins and 12 field blocks.
- Kate Rodman landed on the all-Golden Coast Conference second team as a sophomore in 2023. She tied for the team lead with 42 goals that season. She tallied 15 assists for a total of 57 points on the year second-most on the team. The now-senior driver also had 26 steals and 15 drawn exclusions back in that 2023 campaign.
- Santa Clara raked in the academic awards last school year. The team landed a program-record 17 of its student-athletes on the 2024 GCC All-Academic Team, tied for second-most in the conference. The Broncos were only two student-athletes behind San Diego State (19) for the most in the conference and tied with Pacific, who also had 17. Santa Clara's previous high in GCC All-Academic Team members was 15 in 2020. The Broncos had 14 recognized in each of the previous three seasons (2023, '22 and '21).
- The Broncos then collected 15 more all-academic awards from the ACWPC. The Broncos also collected another All-Academic Team award from the ACWPC, its 14th in a row. The team has been tabbed an All-Academic Team by the ACWPC every year since 2011. The team carried a collective cumulative GPA of 3.36 in 2024.
