Series History

Series Notes

- Santa Clara heads north to face Portland in a three-game West Coast Conference series starting Thursday.
- Portland swept the teams' series in Santa Clara last season and has won 10 of the last 15 games (dating to 2019). They've won three consecutive series since 2022.
- Each of the past eight games between the two teams have been blowouts, decided by four or more runs (Portland going 5-3 in those eight). Seven of those were decided by five or more runs, and three of those were determined by 11 or more runs.
- The teams have split their last eight games played in Portland, each going 4-4 dating to 2019. Three of the Broncos' four wins came by five runs or more, and Portland has scored at least seven runs in three of its last four victories at home in the series.

Season Notes

• The offensive awakening continued Tuesday for Santa Clara (17-23), as the Broncos homered three times, scored seven runs, and tallied double-digit hits for the third consecutive game in a 7–5 win over Central Coast adversary Cal Poly in a non-conference midweek matchup at Stephen Schott Stadium.

Santa Clara hit three home runs and Cal Poly (28-15) hit two. **Dylan Joyce**'s teamleading ninth home run of the season in the bottom of the first flipped an early 1-0 deficit into a 2-1 lead for SCU, one it wouldn't surrender for the rest of the night. **Luke Devine** put up his first career multi-homer game three days after Joyce did the same thing Saturday versus Pacific. His leadoff solo shot to left field in the second made it 3-1, and his opposite field tank over the right-center field wall in the fourth made it 5-1 Broncos.

• Dylan Joyce put together a standout week at the plate for Santa Clara last week, hitting .417 (5 for 12) with a 1.250 slugging percentage and 15 total bases over three games against Pacific. He blasted three home runs and a double, drove in four runs, and scored four times. Joyce delivered multiple hits in back-to-back games, highlighted by a two-homer, three-RBI performance on Saturday. It was his first multi-home run game as a Bronco. Joyce's home run Tuesday versus Cal Poly gave him four home runs in his last four games (since Friday versus Pacific).

Season Notes

- Sophomore shortstop **Ben Cleary** had a season-long 16-game reached base safely streak snapped on April 17 at LMU, but he's still reached safely in 37 of his 39 games played this season. Cleary's on-base percentage sits just under .400 at .399. He's second on the team with 44 hits, third with 20 walks and tied for fourth with five hit-by-pitches. He's currently on a five-game hit streak, batting .333 with seven runs.
- More than half of Santa Clara's wins in 2025 (10) have been of the "come-from-behind" variety. Each of the Broncos' first four victories were comeback wins after trailing at some point. The Broncos were "comeback kids" in 2024, earning half of their 26 wins (13) in come-from-behind fashion. Santa Clara erased 23 different deficits during the 2024 campaign at any given point in a game. It has already erased 22 different deficits in 2025 through Tuesday.
- Right-handed pitcher **Max Bayles** was named on April 3 to the Golden Spikes Award Midseason Watch List, the award presented annually to the nation's best amateur baseball player. Bayles has been a dominant force on the mound for the Broncos this season. He's racked up 82 strikeouts in only 50 1/3 innings. That's good for a 14.66 strikeouts-per-nine-innings rate, ranked No. 3 in the country through Tuesday. His 82 total strikeouts are ranked 16th in the nation and No. 1 in the WCC. Twice this season he's set new career highs for strikeouts in a game, first against CSUN on Feb. 16 with nine, then again on Feb. 22 at UC Davis, where he struck out a career-best 12.
- Thomas Ferroggiaro has continued to get better offensively over the past five weeks. He's raised his batting average 201 points in five weeks after starting the season with an .063 batting average. He's logged eight multi-hit games during that stretch with three doubles and 11 RBIs. He's also drawn five walks and four hit-by-pitches over the last five weeks for an on-base percentage of .409. He's only struck out seven times in 78 at-bats across 20 games since March 27.
- Santa Clara is now 3-4 in WCC openers since head coach Rusty Filter's first season in 2018 (no WCC games were played in 2020). It has lost its last two openers after falling on March 21 versus San Francisco and dropping its 2024 opener versus Portland. The Broncos had previously won consecutive openers against San Francisco and Saint Mary's in 2022 and '23, respectively.
- Koen Carston had a heck of a week for the Broncos on March 17-23, posting three multi-hit games, batting .667 and slugging .778 in three games. Carston reached base nine times with six hits and three hit-by-pitches, posting a .750 on-base percentage. He hit a double on March 23 versus San Francisco and had two RBIs during the week. He also played flawless defense behind the plate, posting a 1.000 fielding percentage in 28 total chances and throwing out a would-be base stealer.
- Sophomore infielder **Ben Cleary** was named on Feb. 6 to the 2025 Preseason all-WCC team, as announced by the conference. Cleary is leading a veteran returning infield this season while moving over to shortstop after starting 49 games at second base as a true freshman in 2024. He was named to last season's WCC All-Freshman Team after batting .264 with eight doubles, a triple, 17 RBIs, 20 walks, four stolen bases and a .360 on-base percentage. He was an anchor in 2024 for the Broncos on defense, only committing three errors all season in 231 total chances (.987 fielding percentage) while helping turn a team-high 29 double plays.
- Head Coach Rusty Filter, entering his eighth season at the helm, has guided the Santa Clara University baseball team back to a tradition of winning not seen in decades.

Santa Clara's 26-26 record in 2024 marked the first time in 18 years it posted back-to-back .500-or-better seasons. The 26 wins gave the program three consecutive seasons of 24-or-more victories for the first time in 16 years. And Santa Clara's consecutive appearances in the West Coast Conference Tournament (2023, '24) marked the first time in 27 years it made the postseason in back-to-back seasons.

• Santa Clara had two players (Robert Hipwell, Blake Hammond) chosen in the 2024 MLB Draft. Hipwell (sixth round) marked the Broncos' second pick among the top-10 rounds in two years, following Skylar Hales' fourth-round selection in 2023.

Season Notes

• Santa Clara traveled all the way to Austin, Texas, on March 7-9, for the first time in program history to face the then-No. 12-ranked Texas Longhorns. The Broncos were swept in the three-game series, though they were competitive througout. Santa Clara brought the tying run to the plate in the ninth in Friday's opener, had three extra-base hits in Saturday's game two, and gave up five runs with two outs in the finale.

What did in the Broncos were 26 total free passes issued by the pitching staff -- 22 walks and four hit-by-pitches. 11 of the free passes would come in to score over the three games, accounting for more than half of the Longhorns' 18 runs in the series

- After its trip to Austin, Santa Clara is now 9-13 playing in the state of Texas since 2010. That includes a 7-0 mark at two different tournaments -- the 2012 Bobcat Invitational (3-0 in San Marcos, Texas) and the 2014 Irish Baseball Classic in San Antonio (4-0).
- Sophomore relief pitcher **Max Bayles** made it 2 for 2 on Feb. 24, earning his second Rawlings WCC Pitcher of the Week award in as many weeks on the young season, this time for the week of Feb. 17-23 after leading the Broncos to another victory behind yet another career high in strikeouts.

Santa Clara came from behind and won in extra innings on Feb. 22 at UC Davis, but the win wouldn't have been possible if not for the herculean relief effort on the mound by Bayles. Bayles entered in the fifth inning and pitched through the 10th, earning his first victory of the season with 5 1/3 innings thrown – one out short of tying his career high. He allowed only one run on three hits, and most of all – he struck out a careerhigh 12, just six days after he struck out a then-career-high nine in his last outing versus CSUN (Feb. 16). Bayles retired 16 batters – 12 of them by strikeout.

- Bayles earned the season's first WCC Pitcher of the Week award on Feb. 17 for the week of Feb. 10-16 after helping the Broncos clinch a series victory. Bayles struck out a career-high nine in only 4 2/3 innings of work on Feb. 16, leading Santa Clara to a series-clinching, 8-3, win over CSUN. Bayles entered in the fourth inning and got stronger as he went along, retiring eight of the last nine he faced with five strikeouts. He only allowed one hit and one run to a lineup that had collected 21 hits and scored 15 runs in the series' first two games. The outing was only one inning short of his career long (5 2/3), typically serving as the Broncos' closer/end-of-game pitcher.
- Max Bayles was named on Feb. 12 to the 'Stopper of the Year' Award Watch List by the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association.

The Stopper of the Year award is given to the top relief pitcher in the NCAA Division I Baseball. Bayles made an immediate impact for the Broncos as a freshman in 2024, earning a spot on the WCC all-Freshman Team. He posted a 3.40 ERA over 42 1/3 innings pitched, striking out 50 batters while limiting opponents to a .205 batting average. His dominant performances out of the bullpen also earned him WCC Freshman of the Week honors twice.

- The 2025 Broncos return 21 letterwinners from a year ago, including 2024 WCC All-Freshman Team honorees Max Bayles and Ben Cleary. The team also introduces 17 newcomers (nine freshmen, eight transfers) and welcomes back two redshirt freshmen.
- Santa Clara was among the nation's best in ERA (75th), defense (76th), and base stealing (78th, SBs per game) in 2024.
