#### **Series Notes**

- Santa Clara wraps up the 2025 regular season with a three-game West Coast Conference series on the road at East Bay rival Saint Mary's.
- The Broncos have dominated the series of late, winning nine of the last 13 games and four consecutive series dating to 2021 That includes taking two of three in Moraga in 2023, capping the series win with a blowout, 11-0 victory.
- The Broncos won two of three over the Gaels last season in Santa Clara, but it took a walk-off, come-from-behind, 6-5 effort in game two and a slim, 8-7, win in game three to clinch the series.
- Five of the last eight meetings between the two teams have been decided by two or fewer runs, including all three games last season in the South Bay. In 13 straight games, at least one of the teams has scored five or more runs, and both have done it in a game four different times during that stretch.

#### **Season Notes**

- Santa Clara sophomore right-hander Max Bayles was named the West Coast Conference Pitcher of the Week Monday for the week of May 5-11 – his third such award of the season - after striking out nine Saturday and shutting down first-place San Diego. Bayles struck out nine while only allowing one run on three hits in 6 1/3 innings Saturday versus the Toreros, leading the Broncos to a 10-1 victory. It was a bounce-back performance for Bayles, who had allowed nine earned runs in his last nine innings pitched (two appearances), but Saturday shut down a lineup that ranked among the WCC's top-four in batting average and slugging percentage. The secondyear righty settled in after the first inning and retired 11 of the next 12 batters he faced, including nine in a row from the second to the fifth.
- Santa Clara (20-27, 7-14 WCC) dropped its sixth consecutive weekend series last weekend and seventh in its last eight by falling twice at home to first-place San Diego. The Toreros used five unearned runs to escape with a 7-4 win in Friday's opener after the Broncos put the tying run on deck in the ninth. Santa Clara blew out San Diego on Saturday, 10-1, to even the series. But USD returned the blowout favor on Sunday, winning the finale, 25-9, behind a 13-run, 10-hit third inning.
- · More than half of Santa Clara's wins in 2025 (13) have been of the "come-frombehind" variety, including Tuesday's win over Stanford. Each of the Broncos' first four victories were comeback wins after trailing at some point. The Broncos were "comeback kids" in 2024, earning half of their 26 wins (13) in come-from-behind fashion. Santa Clara erased 23 different deficits during the 2024 campaign at any given point in a game. It has already erased 26 different deficits in 2025 through Sunday.

#### **Season Notes**

- **Dylan Joyce's** recent hot streak continued over the weekend, reaching base 10 times in three games versus the first-place Toreros. Joyce is slashing .375/.492/.917 in his last 13 games (since April 18) with seven home runs, five doubles and 18 RBIs. He's tallied seven multi-hit games in that stretch and has seven home runs in his previous 11 games alone going into the weekend. Joyce also made his Division I pitching debut on May 2, throwing a scoreless sixth inning at Portland.
- Sophomore shortstop **Ben Cleary** had a season-long 16-game reached base safely streak snapped on April 17 at LMU, but he's still reached safely in 44 of his 46 games played this season. Cleary is third on the team with a .409 on-base percentage. He's second on the team with 53 hits and third with 25 walks. He's currently on a five-game hitting streak, batting .389 during that stretch with four extra-base hits.
- Right-handed pitcher **Max Bayles** was named on April 3 to the Golden Spikes Award Midseason Watch List, the award presented annually to the nation's best amateur baseball player. Bayles has been a dominant force on the mound for the Broncos this season. He surpassed the 100 strikeouts mark for the season Saturday with his seventh strikeout of the day. His 102 strikeouts in 2025 lead the WCC and rank No. 9 in the nation. His 14.89 strikeouts per nine innings rate is No. 3 in the country. He's also ranked among the nation's best in a number of advanced statistical categories. Bayles' 3.42 xFIP (expected fielding independent pitching) is No. 4 in the nation. His 37.2% strikeout rate is No. 5 in the country (through Sunday). Twice this season he's set new career highs for strikeouts in a game, first against CSUN on Feb. 16 with nine, then again on Feb. 22 at UC Davis, with a career-best 12.
- Thomas Ferroggiaro has continued to get better offensively over the past seven weeks. He's raised his batting average 195 points in seven weeks after starting the season with an .063 average. He's logged 10 multi-hit games during that stretch with three doubles, his first two career home runs and 17 RBIs. He's also drawn eight walks and seven hit-by-pitches in that time for an on-base percentage of .398. He's only struck out 14 times in 108 at-bats across 27 games since March 27.
- Santa Clara is now 3-4 in WCC openers since head coach Rusty Filter's first season in 2018 (no WCC games were played in 2020). It has lost its last two openers after falling on March 21 versus San Francisco and dropping its 2024 opener versus Portland. The Broncos had previously won consecutive openers against San Francisco and Saint Mary's in 2022 and '23, respectively.
- Koen Carston had a heck of a week for the Broncos on March 17-23, posting three multi-hit games, batting .667 and slugging .778 in three games. Carston reached base nine times with six hits and three hit-by-pitches, posting a .750 on-base percentage. He hit a double on March 23 versus San Francisco and had two RBIs during the week. He also played flawless defense behind the plate, posting a 1.000 fielding percentage in 28 total chances and throwing out a would-be base stealer.
- Sophomore infielder **Ben Cleary** was named on Feb. 6 to the 2025 Preseason all-WCC team, as announced by the conference. Cleary is leading a veteran returning infield this season while moving over to shortstop after starting 49 games at second base as a true freshman in 2024. He was named to last season's WCC All-Freshman Team after batting .264 with eight doubles, a triple, 17 RBIs, 20 walks, four stolen bases and a .360 on-base percentage. He was an anchor in 2024 for the Broncos on defense, only committing three errors all season in 231 total chances (.987 fielding percentage) while helping turn a team-high 29 double plays.
- Head Coach Rusty Filter, entering his eighth season at the helm, has guided the Santa Clara University baseball team back to a tradition of winning not seen in decades.

Santa Clara's 26-26 record in 2024 marked the first time in 18 years it posted back-to-back .500-or-better seasons. The 26 wins gave the program three consecutive seasons of 24-or-more victories for the first time in 16 years. And Santa Clara's consecutive appearances in the West Coast Conference Tournament (2023, '24) marked the first time in 27 years it made the postseason in back-to-back seasons.

• Santa Clara ranks among the nation's best this season in getting hit by pitches (53rd), strikeouts per nine innings (59th), double plays turned per game (63rd), and fielding percentage (79th).

#### **Season Notes**

• Max Bayles was named on Feb. 12 to the 'Stopper of the Year' Award Watch List by the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association.

The Stopper of the Year award is given to the top relief pitcher in the NCAA Division I Baseball. Bayles made an immediate impact for the Broncos as a freshman in 2024, earning a spot on the WCC all-Freshman Team. He posted a 3.40 ERA over 42 1/3 innings pitched, striking out 50 batters while limiting opponents to a .205 batting average. His dominant performances out of the bullpen also earned him WCC Freshman of the Week honors twice.

• Santa Clara traveled all the way to Austin, Texas, on March 7-9, for the first time in program history to face the then-No. 12-ranked Texas Longhorns. The Broncos were swept in the three-game series, though they were competitive througout. Santa Clara brought the tying run to the plate in the ninth in Friday's opener, had three extra-base hits in Saturday's game two, and gave up five two-out runs in the finale.

What did in the Broncos were 26 total free passes issued by the pitching staff -- 22 walks and four hit-by-pitches. 11 of the free passes would come in to score over the three games, accounting for more than half of the Longhorns' 18 runs in the series

- After its trip to Austin, Santa Clara is now 9-13 playing in the state of Texas since 2010. That includes a 7-0 mark at two different tournaments -- the 2012 Bobcat Invitational (3-0 in San Marcos, Texas) and the 2014 Irish Baseball Classic in San Antonio (4-0).
- Sophomore relief pitcher **Max Bayles** made it 2 for 2 on Feb. 24, earning his second Rawlings WCC Pitcher of the Week award in as many weeks on the young season, this time for the week of Feb. 17-23 after leading the Broncos to another victory behind yet another career high in strikeouts.

Santa Clara came from behind and won in extra innings on Feb. 22 at UC Davis, but the win wouldn't have been possible if not for the herculean relief effort on the mound by Bayles. Bayles entered in the fifth inning and pitched through the 10th, earning his first victory of the season with 5 1/3 innings thrown – one out short of tying his career high. He allowed only one run on three hits, and most of all – he struck out a careerhigh 12, just six days after he struck out a then-career-high nine in his last outing versus CSUN (Feb. 16). Bayles retired 16 batters – 12 of them by strikeout.

- Bayles earned the season's first WCC Pitcher of the Week award on Feb. 17 for the week of Feb. 10-16 after helping the Broncos clinch a series victory. Bayles struck out a career-high nine in only 4 2/3 innings of work on Feb. 16, leading Santa Clara to a series-clinching, 8-3, win over CSUN. Bayles entered in the fourth inning and got stronger as he went along, retiring eight of the last nine he faced with five strikeouts. He only allowed one hit and one run to a lineup that had collected 21 hits and scored 15 runs in the series' first two games. The outing was only one inning short of his career long (5 2/3), typically serving as the Broncos' closer/end-of-game pitcher.
- The 2025 Broncos return 21 letterwinners from a year ago, including 2024 WCC All-Freshman Team honorees Max Bayles and Ben Cleary. The team also introduces 17 newcomers (nine freshmen, eight transfers) and welcomes back two redshirt freshmen.
- Santa Clara had two players (**Robert Hipwell**, **Blake Hammond**) chosen in the 2024 MLB Draft. Hipwell (sixth round) marked the Broncos' second pick among the top-10 rounds in two years, following Skylar Hales' fourth-round selection in 2023.
