Series Notes

- Santa Clara hits the road for the first time since opening weekend, traveling 1,400 miles to face No. 10/14 Oklahoma of the SEC in a four-game series starting Thursday.
- The Broncos and Sooners have only met twice in their history, and haven't faced each other in 12 years. Both meetings were single games. The Broncos beat Oklahoma, 7-6, in 1991 in the South Bay, and the Sooners beat Santa Clara, 8-4, in the Sanderson Ford College Baseball Classic in Surprise, Ariz.
- The Broncos' only two previous road games this season were also played at a Power-4 program -- East Bay neighbor California on Feb. 14.
- Santa Clara is just 4-21 since 2015 when traveling beyond the Rocky Mountains. The Broncos went to Oklahoma's arch rival Texas on the exact same weekend last season (March 7-9, 2025) and were swept in a three-game series.

Season Notes

- **LAST TIME OUT:** UNLV came to Stephen Schott Stadium for a three-game series and took two of three from the Broncos. That included the Rebels (9-3) stealing a win in Friday's opener. The Broncos (5-6) carried a two-run lead into the ninth inning on Friday, but UNLV got two clutch, two-out at-bats in both the ninth and 10th innings to steal a 5-4 win in extras. UNLV scored early on Saturday and held off three different Santa Clara rallies to take game two, 8-5, and clinch the series. True freshman starter **Jackson Cook** delivered on Sunday with five no-hit innings and classmate **Nick Chow** carried the no-hitter into the seventh, as the Broncos earned the 5-3 victory.
- Junior infielder **Will Anderson** continues to be one of the Broncos' best offensive weapons through the season's first three weeks. Anderson had hits in all three of Santa Clara's games versus UNLV over the weekend, batting .400 and slugging .500 in the series. He knocked in four RBIs, hit a double, scored a run and stole a base against the Rebels while only striking out once in 12 plate appearances. Anderson went 2 for 4 with a double, two RBIs, a run scored and a stolen base in Friday's opener. He also played a flawless first base, posting a 1.000 fielding percentage in 16 total chances.

- The freshmen pitchers in the Broncos' bullpen are already making an impact three weeks into the season. **Jackson Cook** has entrenched himself into the weekend rotation in his first month of college baseball, and after Sunday's five no-hit, shutout innings performance versus UNLV, has dropped his ERA to 4.82. **Trevor Banning**, **Nick Chow**, **Cook**, **Max Reimers** and **Chase Ruden** have combined to go 2-1 with a 3.86 ERA and record 28 total strikeouts while holding opponents to a .159 average.

Season Notes

• Senior infielder **Thomas Ferroggiaro** and junior right-hander **Max Bayles** earned the first West Coast Conference Rawlings Player and Pitcher of the Week awards of the season on Feb. 16 after leading the Broncos through their first three games of the season on the road at California.

Ferroggiaro reached base nine times, scored six runs and stole two bases with two multi-hit performances in three games in Berkeley, Calif., over the weekend. He reached base four times on Friday, going 2 for 3 with two walks and scoring three runs. He went 3 for 4 in game one of Saturday's doubleheader with another walk, two runs scored, and a career-high-tying two stolen bases. He extended his active hitting streak to seven games -- a carryover of his four-game streak to end the 2025 season -- with a double and run scored in Saturday's doubleheader nightcap. Bayles threw four shutout innings with five strikeouts on the road Friday, earning the victory and leading Santa Clara to a blowout, 13-2, run-rule win. Bayles only allowed one runner to reach third base and only two others past first in his four innings of work.

• Santa Clara is already back to its come-from-behind ways three weeks into this season after spending the last two years as "comeback kids." The Broncos already have two come-from-behind wins and have erased eight total deficits in 2026.

The team totaled 26 come-from-behind wins in 2024 and '25. More than half of Santa Clara's wins in 2025 (13) were of the "come-from-behind" variety. The Broncos were also "comeback kids" in 2024, earning half of their 26 wins (13) in come-from-behind fashion. Santa Clara erased 23 different deficits during the 2024 campaign at any given point in a game. It erased 27 different deficits in 2025.

• Several Broncos are carrying active hitting streaks and reached base safely streaks they ended 2025 with. The largest is **Thomas Ferroggiaro's** now-29-game reached base streak, started on April 15, 2025, at Cal Poly. He also had a 12-game hitting streak that extended back to 2025, but it ended Friday. **Ben Cleary** has reached base in 12 consecutive games -- all 11 in 2026 and the last game of 2025. He's also currently on a six-game hitting streak he started Feb. 20 versus UC Davis.

• Santa Clara returns 24 letterwinners -- including seven positional starters and three starting pitchers -- in 2026. The returners include all-West Coast Conference second team honoree **Max Bayles** and all-WCC Honorable Mentions **Ben Cleary** and **Cooper Lanz**. The Broncos return no less than 65% of every offensive statistical category from last season, and they bring back at least 60% if not more of every pitching stat category outside of saves, where only four of 11 saves last year return.

• The Broncos also welcome 16 newcomers to the roster in 2026, composed of five transfers (four four-year college transfers, one junior college transfer) and 11 true freshmen. 10 of the 11 freshmen are from California, with six of those from Northern California, and even four of those come specifically from the South Bay and Santa Clara County. Three of the five transfers (**Will Anderson**, **James Bose**, **Bryant Viskovich**) also have South Bay roots.

• Santa Clara junior right-hander **Max Bayles** raked in the preseason honors heading into the 2026 season. He was named to the Perfect Game West Coast Conference Preseason Team, then was named the WCC Preseason Pitcher of the Year by D1Baseball.com. He also landed on the official WCC Preseason Team, as voted on by the league's coaches. He was ranked the top 2026 MLB Draft Prospect in the WCC by D1Baseball.com after spending time this summer in both the Cape Cod League and at the USA Baseball Collegiate National Team training camp

• Santa Clara won 20 games in 2025, marking its fourth consecutive 20-or-more wins season, the first time the Broncos have done that in 17 years. The Broncos posted back-to-back .500-or-better seasons for the first time in 18 years in 2023 and '24, and made the postseason in back-to-back seasons for the first time in 27 years in 2023 and '24.

• Santa Clara had 12 players play professional baseball in 2025, including **Tommy Nance** (at Santa Clara in 2012-13), who posted a 1.99 ERA in 30 relief appearances for the AL champion Toronto Blue Jays, and **Steven Wilson** ('18), who made 59 appearances for the Chicago White Sox and carried a 3.42 ERA.

Season Notes

- Senior right-handed pitcher **Cooper Lanz** was named to the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association Preseason "Stopper of the Year" Watch List on Feb. 10. Lanz, who joined the Broncos in 2025 after previous stops at Pacific and Modesto Junior College, earned all-WCC Honorable Mention recognition in his first season at Santa Clara after appearing in 13 games and moving into the starting rotation late in the year. He led the team with four wins and posted a 3.75 ERA across 36 innings pitched, striking out 28 while holding opponents to a team-best .148 batting average. Lanz went 4-1 against WCC opponents with a 2.92 ERA and a .132 opponent batting average in 24 2/3 innings.
