2025-26 Team

- Santa Clara is led by head coach Niall Angus who is in his 10th season at the helm and assisted by Josh Page who is in his second season.
- Angus, who began the 2025-26 season as the second winningest coach in Santa Clara men's tennis history with 118 wins surpassed Sean Burns as the Broncos all-time winningest coach with his 131st career win on March 25, 2026 against Cal Poly.
- The spring roster is comprised of nine players including eight returnees and one newcomer, Ferran Redza, who joined as a mid-year enrollee. Redza reached a career-high World Junior ITF ranking of 307 and played in the main draw of the 2025 Junior Wimbledon doubles.
- In 2024-25, the Broncos finished 15-9 overall including 5-2 in the West Coast Conference, tied for second in the WCC.
- Last season the Broncos were ranked nationally for 11 straight weeks and finished No. 73 nationally, qualifying for the WCC Tournament for the seventh straight season.
- In the mid-major rankings, they finished No. 25 and in the Northwest Regionals rankings, No. 6. Luca Bluett and Kim were ranked No. 8 in the Northwest Regional doubles list.
- Four returners garnered All-WCC recognitions: Bluett and Kim were named to the doubles second team. Bluett also made singles honorable mention along with Watanabe Eriksson and Luca Lemaitre.
- The team lost just one player from last season, Payton Jim-On.

Season Notes

- No. 44 Santa Clara hosts No. 16 San Diego on Saturday with an opportunity to clinch a share of the West Coast Conference regular season title for the first time in program history. A win by the Broncos would secure a share of the title as San Diego has already clinched at least a share of it. A win by USD would secure an outright title for the Toreros.
- San Diego is atop the WCC standings at 6-0 followed by Santa Clara and Pepperdine at 5-1 with LMU in fourth at 4-2. No other teams have more than one conference wins.
- Two Bronco seniors, Alex Watanabe Eriksson and John Kim, will be recognized in a Senior Day ceremony after the match. At the conclusion of the match, the championship celebration will be held followed by the Senior Day ceremony.
- Santa Clara played a pair of ranked opponents in matches that were originally scheduled for last week. They had their 13-match win streak snapped at No. 29 Pepperdine on Thursday but bounced back to defeat No. 51 LMU on Monday after the match was postponed a day earlier.
- The 13-match win streak was the longest since at least 2001-2. During the win streak, they were 56-8 in singles play.
- Back on March 25, 2026 against Cal Poly, Broncos head coach Niall Angus became the winningest coach in program history with his 131st career victory eclipsing Sean Burns who amassed a 130-91 record from 1994 to 2002. Since the victory against Cal Poly, Angus has added five more wins to his career total.
- Santa Clara is currently ranked No. 44 nationally, the ninth straight week they've been ranked. They have been ranked as high as No. 38 this season, the highest ranking the program has achieved since 2013 when they were No. 37.
- The Broncos have beaten three ranked opponents this season: No. 74 UNLV (Feb. 22) No. 61 Boise State (March 14) and No. 51 LMU (April 13).
- Luca Bluett and John Kim are currently ranked as the No. 64 doubles team in the nation. The tandem reached a season-high ranking of No. 17 on Feb. 4.
- The doubles team of Tiago Boschmans and Luca Lemaitre reached No. 57 in the March 17 rankings but they are currently unranked.
- The West Coast Conference has recognized Santa Clara three times this spring with their weekly awards: 1) [Valentin Faure and Ferran Redza were named WCC Doubles Team of the Week](#) on Feb. 24; 2) [Luca Bluett and John Kim also took home the WCC Doubles Team of the Week honors back on Jan. 27](#); and 3) [Redza also was named the WCC Freshman Player of the Week on Feb. 3](#).
- Two Broncos have had 3-all clinchers this season: Redza against Oregon and Kim against Washington.
- SCU has three wins against nationally ranked doubles opponents this spring - Bluett and Kim beat No. 2 Petar Jovanovic and Benito Sanchez Martinez from Mississippi State and downed No. 12 Jacob Olar and Andrii Zimnokh from Alabama. Tiago Boschmans and Luca Lemaitre defeated No. 80 Miguel Avendano and Lucca Liu of UC Santa Barbara.
- Bluett and Kim are 8-5 in doubles dual matches on the season all coming atop the lineup. Faure and Redza leads the team with 11 doubles victories including a current 10 match win streak.
- Faure (14-3) leads the team in singles wins with 14.
- Lukas Maskow (13-4) currently has the longest current singles win streak with eight.
- In doubles play, the Broncos are 32-16 on the year.
- The Broncos are a combined 75-25 in singles this spring.
- Santa Clara was [picked to finish third in the West Coast Conference preseason poll](#) as voted by the league's eight head coaches.
- During the 2025-26 fall season, Bluett and Kim became the first-ever Santa Clara men's tennis players to qualify for the NCAA Individual Championships. They were one of the 32 doubles teams that competed in the 2025 NCAA Division I Men's Tennis Singles and Doubles Championship. They fell in the opening round in three sets to the doubles team from Penn, Aaron Sandler and Manfredi Graziani.
- The last and only time Santa Clara had a qualifier at the NCAA Individual Championships was in 2014 when women's player Katie Le played in her third consecutive singles championship from 2012-14.
- The 2012 SCU men's team qualified for the NCAA Team Championships.
