2025-26 Team

- Santa Clara is led by head coach Niall Angus who is in his 10th season at the helm and assisted by Josh Page who is in his second season.
- Angus began the 2025-26 season as the second winningest coach in Santa Clara men's tennis history with 118 wins. He surpassed Sean Burns as the Broncos all-time winningest coach with his 131st career win on March 25, 2026 against Cal Poly.
- The spring roster is comprised of nine players including eight returnees and one newcomer, Ferran Redza, who joined as a mid-year enrollee. Redza reached a career-high World Junior ITF ranking of 307 and played in the main draw of the 2025 Junior Wimbledon doubles.
- In 2024-25, the Broncos finished 15-9 overall including 5-2 in the West Coast Conference, tied for second in the WCC.
- Last season the Broncos were ranked nationally for 11 straight weeks and finished No. 73 nationally, qualifying for the WCC Tournament for the seventh straight season.
- In the mid-major rankings, they finished No. 25 and in the Northwest Regionals rankings, No. 6. Luca Bluett and Kim were ranked No. 8 in the Northwest Regional doubles list.
- Four returners garnered All-WCC recognitions: Bluett and Kim were named to the doubles second team. Bluett also made singles honorable mention along with Alex Watanabe Eriksson and Luca Lemaitre.
- The team lost just one player from last season, Payton Jim-On.

Season Notes

Coming Up:

- No. 35 Santa Clara (19-3) plays in the West Coast Conference Tournament as a third seed, facing sixth seed Saint Mary's (9-13) in the opening round on Thursday at noon PT.
- This is the eighth straight time Santa Clara has qualified for the WCC Tournament (tournament was canceled in 2020 and 2021 due to the COVID pandemic) making it every year since 2017.
- The Broncos defeated the Gaels 4-0 in the regular season in Moraga on April 14.

Last Time Out:

- Santa Clara [clinched a share of the WCC regular season championship](#) for the first time in program history with a 4-2 win over No. 16 San Diego in the regular season finale last Saturday.
- Luca Lemaitre had the match clincher and was [named WCC Singles Player of the Week](#) while Ferran Redza was [named WCC Freshman Player of the Week](#) with his win on court six.
- Santa Clara shared the championship with San Diego and Pepperdine finishing atop the league standings with identical 6-1 WCC records. Despite finishing tied atop the league standings, the Broncos got the third seed as determined by the ITA rankings.
- The previous best conference finish for the Broncos was second place, done six times with the most recent occurrence in 2025.

Seniors:

- Two Bronco seniors, Alex Watanabe Eriksson and John Kim, were recognized in a Senior Day ceremony after the San Diego match.

All-West Coast Conference:

- Five Broncos were named [All-WCC and head coach Niall Angus was named WCC Coach of the Year](#) on Tuesday. Luca Bluett and Kim were named doubles first team. Kim was also named singles second team. Alex Watanabe Eriksson and Lemaitre were singles first team while Valentin Faure was singles honorable mention.

Versus Ranked Opponents:

- The win over No. 16 San Diego was the fourth victory over a ranked opponent this season. They previously beat No. 74 UNLV (Feb. 22) No. 61 Boise State (March 14) and No. 51 LMU (April 13).

Team Rankings:

- Santa Clara is currently ranked No. 35 nationally, the 10th straight week they have been ranked. It is the highest ranking they have achieved this season topping the previous high of No. 38. The last time they were ranked this high was in 2013 when they were also No. 35.

Win Streak:

- SCU had a 13-match win streak from Feb. 8 - April 4, the longest since at least 2001-02, before it was snapped by No. 29 Pepperdine in Malibu. During the win streak, the Broncos were 56-8 in singles play.

Winningest Coach in Program History:

- Back on March 25, 2026 against Cal Poly, Broncos head coach Niall Angus became the winningest coach in program history with his 131st career victory eclipsing Sean Burns who amassed a 130-91 record from 1994 to 2002. Since the victory against Cal Poly, Angus has added six more wins to his career total.
- The 19 win total this season is tied for the most during Angus' 10 seasons as Santa Clara head coach matching the 2023-24 season total when they went 19-8.

Doubles Rankings:

- Luca Bluett and John Kim are currently ranked as the No. 63 doubles team in the nation. The tandem reached a season-high ranking of No. 17 on Feb. 4.
- The doubles team of Tiago Boschmans and Luca Lemaitre reached No. 57 in the March 17 rankings but they are currently unranked.

WCC Weekly Recognitions:

- The West Coast Conference has recognized Santa Clara five times this spring with their weekly awards: 1) Bluett/Kim - Doubles Team of the Week on Jan. 27; 2) Ferran Redza - Freshman Player of the Week on Feb. 3; 3) Faure/Redza - Doubles Team of the Week on Feb. 24; 4) Lemaitre - Singles Player of the Week on April 21; and 5) Redza - Freshman of the Week on April 21

Miscellaneous:

- Two Broncos had 3-all clinchers this season: Redza against Oregon and Kim against Washington.
- Bluett and Kim are 8-7 in doubles dual matches on the season all coming atop the lineup. Faure and Redza leads the team with 13 doubles victories winning 11 while paired together. They have won 11 of their last 12 matching that included a 10-match win streak.
- Faure (15-3) also leads the team in singles wins with 15.
- Luca Lemaitre (10-6) currently has the longest current singles win streak with eight.
- In doubles play this spring, the Broncos are 32-18 and in singles, 79-26.

Preseason Poll:

- Santa Clara was [picked to finish third in the West Coast Conference preseason poll](#) as voted by the league's eight head coaches.

NCAA Individual/Team Championships:

- During the 2025-26 fall season, Bluett and Kim became the first-ever Santa Clara men's tennis players to qualify for the NCAA Individual Championships. They were one of the 32 doubles teams that competed in the 2025 NCAA Division I Men's Tennis Singles and Doubles Championship. They fell in the opening round in three sets to the doubles team from Penn, Aaron Sandler and Manfredi Graziani.
- The last and only time Santa Clara had a qualifier at the NCAA Individual Championships was in 2014 when women's player Katie Le played in three consecutive singles championship from 2012-14.
- The 2012 SCU men's team qualified for the NCAA Team Championships.
