Season Notes

- Santa Clara (8-14) plays in the West Coast Conference Tournament as a sixth seed, facing third seed Washington State (15-7) in the the opening round on Thursday at 6 p.m. PT. It is the first time the Broncos have qualified for the WCC Tournament (tournament was canceled in 2020 and 2021 due to the COVID pandemic) since the 2017-18 season.
- The Broncos won three of four WCC matches last week to close out the regular season to earn the sixth seed with a 4-5 league record. [Lizanne Boyer and Juliette Krumholz were named WCC Doubles Team of the Week](#) after the duo won all four of their matches last week.
- Senior [Daniella Dimitrova was named All-WCC singles second team](#) on Tuesday.
- Washington State defeated SCU 4-2 last week in Santa Clara, handing the Broncos their lone loss of the week. WSU finished the regular season with a third place finish in the WCC at 7-2. The Cougars feature a nationally ranked singles player in No. 95 Eva Alvarez Sande.

- Five Bronco seniors - Boyer, Dimitrova, Tian Yu Dong, Jamie Pope and Anna Semler - were recognized in a ceremony prior to the Gonzaga match in the regular season finale.
- This spring, Dimitrova (13-6) leads the team with 13 singles wins. All of Dimitrova's wins have come atop the lineup. Ashley Katz (10-7) and Anna Rahman (10-10) are tied for second with 10 victories.
- Juliette Krumholz currently has a team-leading fourmatch win streak in singles.
- Lizanne Boyer (10-11) tops the team in doubles wins with 10. Boyer and her doubles partner Krumholz are currently riding a four match win streak.
- Madhu Satishbabu, a Redmond, Washington native, clinched the match against Seattle with her first collegiate dual match win in her home state on March 22.
- This season, the Broncos received two WCC weekly recognitions. 1) [Dimitrova was named WCC Singles Player of the Week](#) on March 3 for winning two singles matches atop the lineup, securing the match clincher against CSUN and taking the first singles match against Cal Poly. 2) Boyer and Krumholz were named Doubles Team of the Week on April 21.

2025-26 Team

- Santa Clara is led by third year head coach Allie Will-Van Alstyne and assisted by Connor Van Alstyne, also in his third season.
- In Will-Van Alstyne's first two seasons on the Mission Campus, the Broncos have improved by eight games. In her first season, she took over a team that went winless the previous season and posted a 6-12 record and followed with an 8-12 campaign last season.
- The spring roster is comprised of nine players with the addition of mid-year enrollee Lizanne Boyer from Texas A&M.
- The six returnees from last season are: seniors Daniella Dimitrova, Tian Yu Dong, Jamie Pope, Anna Semler as well as sophomores Juliette Krumholz and Anna Rahman.
- Along with Boyer, the newcomers are transfers Ashley Katz from Kansas and Madhu Satishbabu from Washington State.
- Last season, Dimitrova earned West Coast Conference honorable mention recognition in singles while Dong was named honorable mention in doubles.
- SCU lost four players - Kacey Feng, Velizara Fileva, Jillian Roa and Olivia Wiese - to graduation from last season's team.

Schedule

- The schedule features three fall tournaments and 22 spring dual matches. The spring season consists of nine home, 12 away and one neutral site matches.
