

#### THE GAME

Stonehill College returns to its home turf to host Duquesne University, receiving votes in this week's American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Division I FCS coaches poll, for a Homecoming Weekend Northeast Conference clash against the Conference leaders at Timothy J. Coughlin, '80 Memorial Field at W.B. Mason Stadium this afternoon. The Skyhawks are aiming to get on track heading down the stretch after three-straight setbacks, the last two on the road, including a 48-28 decision to in-state rival Merrimack College in North Andover last weekend. The Dukes won four-straight against FCS competition heading into last week's bye, after opening with a pair of losses to FBS programs, following their 38-7 triumph over in-state NEC rival Saint Francis University two weeks ago.

## **LAST TIME OUT**

## **MERRIMACK 48, STONEHILL 28**

**NORTH ANDOVER, Mass. (October 19, 2024) -** Merrimack rushed for 375 yards and built a 27-point halftime lead on its way to a 48-28 triumph over Stonehill in a non-conference matchup at Duane Stadium.

Brendon Wyatt and Jermaine Corbett combined for 271 of Merrimack's 375 yards on the ground and three touchdowns, as the Warriors finished with 479 total yards for the afternoon. Corbett tallied 257 all-purpose yards, with 170 yards and two touchdowns on 23 carries, to go with a 16-yard reception and 71 yards on three kickoff returns, while Wyatt added 101 yards on eight carries and a score.

Ayden Pereira contributed a pair of touchdown passes, finishing 8-for-14 for 94 yards through the air to go with another 51 yards on 15 carries. Josh Addo paced a Merrimack defense that limited Stonehill to just 49 yards and one first down in the first half in building a 27-point lead with seven tackles (four solo), including 1.0 for a loss of a yard, while senior Nate Palanica, Jr. contributed three tackles (two solo), a key second half interception and two pass breakups.

Stonehill gained 272 of its 321 total yards and 20 of 21 first downs in the second half, scoring three touchdowns in the third quarter to close the 27-point halftime gap to 13-points (34-21) heading into the final quarter. Junior quarterback **JACK O'CONNELL** (North Andover, Mass.) made his second career start in front of a hometown crowd and delivered touchdowns with his arm and legs in finishing with 215 total yards by completing 12-of-24 passes for a career-high 166 yards and a touchdown to junior tight end **CODY RUFF** (Saco, Maine), while adding another 49 yards on 11 carries with his first career rushing touchdown.

Senior **Jarel Washington** (White Plains, N.Y.) and junior **ZAVION WOODARD** (Baltimore, Md.) each added touchdown runs for Stonehill in the third quarter rally. Washington posted a team-high 81 all-purpose yards with 13 carries for 56 yards and the score, while adding ten yards on two receptions and a 15-yard kickoff return.

Junior **Mo SEIDE** (Malden, Mass.) paced the Stonehill defense with a career-high seven tackles (five solo), including 2.0 for a loss of eight yards, 1.0 sacks for a loss of seven and a pass breakup. Classmate **ZACK ATHY** (Holliston, Mass.) added six stops (three solo), including 0.5 for a loss of four yards.

Merrimack would score on its first five possessions in building a 27-0 halftime lead. Pereira connected with Jalen McDonald for a 51-yard touchdown with 5:40 left in the first quarter and then Corbett rushed for scores of six and two yards around the quarter break. Davis capped the first half scoring with a 53-yard field goal 2:40 before halftime.

Stonehill emerged from the intermission with touchdowns on its first four possessions of the second half, scoring 21 points in the third quarter alone to get back into the game. Washington got the Skyhawks on the scoreboard with a 24-yard touchdown run just two minutes into the third quarter. After junior linebacker **TYLER BANNON** (North Attleboro, Mass.) recovered a fumble on a bad Merrimack snap at the Warriors 39-yard line, O'Connell connected with Ruff for a 14-yard touchdown with 6:14 remaining in the third quarter that had the Skyhawks back within two scores (27-14).

Merrimack would hold there, providing an answer for Stonehill's scores to follow, starting with a 37-yard touchdown run by Wyatt two plays after the Ruff score. The Skyhawks closed again with Woodard's four yard power run up the middle, but Merrimack responded when Pereira connected with Seth Sweitzer for a nine-yard touchdown toss.

O'Connell again pulled Stonehill back within two scores (41-28) with a four-yard touchdown run with 3:08 to play. Merrimack recovered the onside kick and then sealed the win with Malakai Anthony's 42-yard run with 2:11 to go, before a late interception from Palanica, Jr.

# LAST TIME THEY MET STONEHILL 33, OUQUESNE 28

**PITTSBURGH, PA. (November 11, 2023) –** Stonehill handed Duquesne its first Conference loss of the season and delayed clinching the Northeast Conference championship outright for at least a week with a 33-28 triumph at Arthur J. Rooney Field.

Justin Waters led the Stonehill defensive effort which largely produced an early 17-0 lead just seven minutes into the game with six tackles (two solo), two fumble recoveries that led to scores, including a 17-yard scoop and score of his own with eight minutes remaining in the first quarter. Anthony LaMonica contributed five tackles (four solo) and a key fourth quarter interception for the Skyhawks who forced four turnovers in the contest.

Chris Domercant racked up 184 all-purpose yards, scoring the winning touchdown with a 21-yard end around rush with 50-seconds to play to cap off a wild back and forth battle. He finished with 51 yards and the score on six carries, caught four passes for 66 yards and tallied 67 yards on three kickoff returns for the afternoon.

Keshawn Brown totaled 243 all-purpose yards for Duquesne with 103 yards and a touchdown on just two receptions, while adding 140 yards on six kickoff returns. Darius Perrantes passed for 298 yards on only nine completions on 25 attempts with an 89-yard touchdown to Brown, while adding another on the ground.

Jayden Johnson was among three Duquesne defenders with double-digit tackles, finishing with a game-high 13 (two solo), while Gianni Rizzo totaled 11 stops (five solo), including 2.5 for a loss of 12 yards, and 1.5 sacks for a loss of 11.

Stonehill scored 17 points over the first seven minutes of the game, including 14-points off turnovers as **Jake Newsham** (Paxton, Mass.) hauled in a ten-yard touchdown pass from **Ashur Carraha** (Cambridge, Mass.) three plays after Waters recovered a Perrantes fumble on Duquesne's first play from scrimmage. Waters struck again on the Dukes next play from scrimmage, scooping up a fumble caused by Matt Beekey at the Duquesne 17 and running in untouched for the first touchdown of his career and a 17-0 lead before even half of the first quarter had expired.

Duquesne chipped away, producing a scoring drive on its next possession that was capped by a two-yard touchdown up the middle by Clements with 3:14 to play in the first quarter. Duquesne scored a pair of touchdowns in the second quarter to take a one-point lead (21-20) into halftime, starting with Brown's 89-yard catch and score six and a half minutes into the frame. Perrantes pushed Duquesne in front on its next possession with a 34-yard touchdown run three plays after a punting miscue by Stonehill set the hosts up with great field position on the Skyhawks 37.

Stonehill scored the lone touchdown of the third quarter when **JA-VION WOODARD** (Baltimore, Md.) punched the ball in from a yard out at the end of a 12-play, 63-yard drive with 1:12 remaining. Duquesne reclaimed the lead with a two-yard touchdown run from Edward Robinson with 2:45 remaining.

Stonehill marched down the field on the ensuing possession with Domercant's 21-yard rushing touchdown with 50-seconds remaining. Brown gave the Dukes a chance returning the kickoff to the Dukes 42 and the offense moved the ball to the Stonehill 33, but couldn't complete a pass from there with **Jahnez Williams** (Chicago, III.) breaking up a Perrantes pass on the second to last play.

#### **AGAINST THE DUKES**

This afternoon marks the third meeting all-time between these two programs. Stonehill has won each of the first two encounters between the two programs with the Skyhawks the only team to defeat Duquesne twice over the last two season - coming in Stonehill's first two years at the NCAA Division I FCS level. Stonehill won the only other prior meeting here at W.B. Mason Stadium when it posted a 24-20 victory in its first evern Northeast Conference contest on October 1, 2022. The Skyhawks dealt the Dukes their lone NEC setback on its way to the Conference title last year in Pittsburgh with a 33-28 victory last November 11. Stonehill head coach *ELI GARDNER* is 2-0 in his career against the Dukes, while Duquesne head coach *JERRY SCHMITT* is 0-2 over his career against the Skyhawks.

#### **FAMILIAR FACES**

Duquesne's roster includes two former Stonehill Skyhawks in postgraduate linebacker **STEVEN CMIELEWSKI** and senior tight end **NOAH CANTY**. Cmielewski played 23 games over three seasons at Stonehill, with 58 tackles (19 solo), including 3.0 for a loss of nine yards, 1.5 sacks and two forced fumbles as a Skyhawk from 2019-2022. Canty was an All-NEC performer for the Skyhawks who appeared in 24 games over three seasons in Easton with 44 receptions for 465 yards and three touchdowns from 2021-2023.

#### PRIME PERFORMER

Junior defensive back **Mo SEIDE** (Malden, Mass.) was named a Northeast Conference Prime Performer for the first time in his career on Monday. He posted a career-high seven tackles, including a career-best five solo, at Merrimack last week, adding 2.0 tackles for a loss of eight yards, including 1.0 sacks for a loss of seven, while adding a pass breakup. Seide joins the running back tandem of senior **Jarel Washington** (White Plains, N.Y.) and junior **ZA-VION WOODARD** (Baltimore, Md.) as well as senior quarterback Ashur Carraha (Cambridge, Mass.) in earning Prime Performer honors this season - giving them all two Prime Performer selections over their career.

#### JERRY RICE AWARD WATCH LIST

Stonehill sophomore linebacker CHARLES BATTAGLIA (Massapequa, N.Y.) has been named among 30 NCAA Division I Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) players to the watch list for the 2024 Stats Perform Jerry Rice Award, presented to the national freshman of the year. Battaglia is the lone representative of the NEC selected to the watch list, joining senior quarterback **ASHUR CARRAHA** (Cambridge, Mass.) as one of two from Stonehill to be named to the watch list over the program's first three years at the NCAA FCS level. The Jerry Rice Award, now in its 14th year, is named after the legendary Hall of Fame wide receiver Jerry Rice. Past recipients include Cooper Kupp (Eastern Washington), Chase Edmonds (Fordham) and Trey Lance (North Dakota State). Battaglia, named the NEC Rookie of the Week on September 23, has started five of the seven games he has played for Stonehill in his first year on the field and is second on the team with his 33 tackles (16 solo), including 1.0 tackles for a loss of two yards. He ranks 20th among NEC leaders for tackles and solo tackles, while his 5.5 tackles per game are good for 14th. To be eligible for the Jerry Rice Award, a player must be considered a freshman by his conference in his first academic year or second if he did not surpass four regular-season games played in the true freshman season (the NCAA redshirt rule). The 2024 Jerry Rice Award recipient will be announced on December 4 and honored at the Stats Perform National Awards Banquet on January 4 in Frisco, Texas.

#### **GAME 350**

This afternoon marks the 350th game in the Stonehill football program's varsity era (1988-pres.). Stonehill has posted 157 wins, with three ties, over the last 37 years.

#### POLLING INFORMATION

Stonehill is ranked No. 15 in the New England Football Journal weekly rankings for the second-straight week. The Skyhawks, ranked No. 12 in the first ranking of the year, are second among the two Northeast Conference entities in the rankings (Central Connecticut State, No. 9) and ranked ahead of FBS member UMass (16th). Rhode Island (6-1) holds the top spot in the rankings for the third-straight week, with Harvard (4-1) up two spots to No. 2 and Dartmouth (5-0) also up two spots to No. 3, followed by No. 4 UConn (4-3) and No. 5 Boston College (4-3) to round out the top five. The Skyhawks are 1-2 so far this season against teams appearing in the rankings after last week's setback to No. 11 Merrimack, also dropping a road decision at No. 6 New Hampshire to go with a home win over No. 14 Sacred Heart. Stonehill face four teams ranked in the poll overall, with a future meeting with No. 9 Central Connecticut State up next in the Skyhawks final home game of the year in two week on Nov. 9.

#### RISING TO THE OCCASION

Stonehill posted a 3-2 record last season against teams with winning records, including its 33-28 win at 6-4 Duquesne, handing the NEC Champion Dukes (6-1) their lone NEC loss of the season. The Skyhawks have split their two games against teams that entered with a winning record (New Hampshire & Sacred Heart), with Stony Brook (0-1 at the time of their meeting) off to a 5-2 start to their season and ranked 24th in this week's AFCA poll.

#### **FIRST STARTS**

Stonehill has seen 21 players earn their first career starts during the 2024 season, including six new starters at LIU weeks ago, after freshman offensive lineman **PETER Flumara** (Foxboro, Mass.) posted his first collegiate start at Merrimack last week. Junior quarterback **Jack O'Connell** (North Andover, Mass.) earned his first career start at LIU as senior **Ashur Carraha** (Cambridge, Mass.) saw his team-leading run of consecutive starts end at 23 games. Only 19 returning Skyhawks had started a game over their careers prior to the season.

#### **NEW IRON MEN**

After senior quarterback **ASHUR CARRAHA** (Cambridge, Mass.) had his team-leading run of consecutive starts end at 23 games against LIU, postgrad offensive lineman **ERIC MESLIN** (Ringwood, N.J.) carries the longest run of consecutive starts into today's game after making his 16th-straight start last week (20th career overall). Junior defensive back **JORDAN IRVINE** (Beverly, Mass.) is the only other Skyhawks with a double-digit start streak at 13-straight, while Meslin and Carraha are the only two current Skyhawks with 20-plus career starts this afternoon.

Stonehill senior linebacker **MATTHEW DEVIRGILIO** (Dedham, Mass.) is one of 22 student-athletes named to the 2024 Allstate Good Works Team® by the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) the organizations announced in September. DeVirgilio, selected to the Good Works Team® from a record 178 nominees and representing players and coaches from colleges and universities across the country for their unwavering commitment to community service and their "good works" off the field, is the second Stonehill football player in program history to earn the recognition. Nick Chiocco, '16, currently Philanthropy Engagement Officer in the Development Office at Stonehill, was honored on the 2015 Good Works Team®. DeVirgilio, the lone NEC student-athlete named to the Good Works Team®, is a Stonehill Team IMPACT fellow, collaborating with the athletic department to facilitate signing day events and raising awareness

across campus. He is also a member of the football program's Team IMPACT leadership team for teammate Brayden Tyron. DeVirgilio has expanded his volunteer work to include the nearby House of Possibilities in Easton that provides services to adults and children with disabilities. He regularly visits the facility with teammates to engage with its members, offering friendship through playing basketball and enjoying regular conversations through its Coffee Talk time, facilitating an opportunity for the two communities to blend and form friendships. DeVirgilio's volunteer work is rooted in his hometown with the Dedham Athletics and Pop Warner Football program. He serves as the football team's representative on the Stonehill Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC), organizing events and fundraisers around campus. He was selected to attend the NCAA Student-Athlete Leadership Forum in Baltimore, Maryland, during his junior year as one of three student-athletes from the NEC. Allstate will host DeVirgilio and the 21 other football student-athletes named to the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team® in New Orleans for the Allstate Sugar Bowl on January 1.

#### **MAKE A PASS**

Stonehill is second among NEC leaders for passing defense, yielding 181.7 yards per game through the air. However the Skyhawks have faced the fewest pass attempts in the NEC with 122 - with Duquesne next lowest at 159. Stonehill opponents have completed 56.6-percent of their passes, which is the lowest in the NEC. Opponents have passed for 14 touchdowns, which is tied for the second-highest total in the NEC.

#### DISCIPLINE

Stonehill has been flagged for a Northeast Conference low 28 penalties so far this season, costing the Skyhawks 43.5 penalty yards per game, which is second fewest in the NEC this season. Conversely, the Skyhawks opponents are averaging 67.8 penalty yards per game - most in the NEC.

#### RED DEFENSE

Stonehill is ranked third in the NEC in Red Zone defense, with the opposition scoring on 73.9-percent (17-for-23) scoring when closing inside the 20-yard line. The defense has forced a turnover on downs as well as a **Mo Seide** (Malden, Mass.) interception in the end zone against Wagner among the defensive holds this season.

#### **CONVERSION RATE**

**BIG RETURNS** 

Stonehill ranked second in the NEC on third downs last season after leading the Conference in 2022 (43.7%), converting on 37.8-percent (59-for-156) of its third downs last fall. The Skyhawks are fourth in the NEC this season, converting at 38.2% (29-76), while ranking fourth on fourth down at 46.2% (6-13).



#### MO SEIDE

Stonehill junior **KYREE DRAKE** (Neptune, N.J.) is ranked third in the NEC, averaging 24.5 yards on 11 kickoff returns this season, including a 70-yard kickoff return to set up their first touchdown of the season at Stony Brook. Sophomore **Joshua Roberson** (Townsend, Del.) is ranked sixth in NEC, averaging 19.8 yards per return.

#### A RUSH TO START

Stonehill is ranked third in the NEC for rushing offense, averaging 150.8 yards per game on the ground. The Skyhawks led the Conference with 225 rushing yards per game after totaling a season-high 354 yards in their win over Sacred Heart on September 21, but averaged just 37.0 per game over the next two weeks after LIU held them to a season-low 23 two weeks ago. Senior running back **JAREL WASHINGTON** (White Plains, N.Y.) ranks fourth in the NEC with his team-leading 64.5 yards per game, while junior running back **ZAVION WOODARD** (Baltimore, Md.) is tenth with 44.7 yards per game.

#### POSSESSED

Stonehill dropped from first to last in the NEC for time of possession after LIU held the ball for 41:28 two weeks ago in New York. The Skyhawks finished with over 30-minutes of possession over the first three games of the

season, are averaging 27:53 in possession time this season overall.

Junior quarterback **JACK O'CONNELL** (North Andover, Mass.) made the most of his first career touchdown pass, connecting with fellow junior CHASE MILLER (Baltimore, Md.) for a 66-yard touchdown that knotted the score at 7-7 near the end of the first quarter at LIU. It marks the sixth-longest completion in the NEC this season and is the Skyhawks longest touchdown pass since a 65-yard touchdown pass by senior ASHUR CARRAHA (Cambridge, Mass.) in 2023.

#### **MILLER TIME**

Junior wide receiver **CHASE MILLER** (Baltimore, Md.), a transfer the the University of Illinois, and junior tight end CODY RUFF (Saco, Maine) share the team lead for Stonehill with their two touchdown receptions Ruff collected a 14-yard touchdown at Merrimack last week. Miller posted his 66-yard

touchdown catch and run from JACK O'CONNELL (North Andover, Mass.) and LIU. The duo are tied for tenth among NEC leaders for touchdown receptions, while Miller's 15.6 yards per reception ranks fifth in the Conference, while Ruff is ranked seventh at 14.5 yards per catch.

#### PASSING ASHUR

Senior quarterback **ASHUR CARRAHA** (Cambridge, Mass.) ranks seventh in program history with his 3,643 yards in 23 career games. He is currently 133 yards behind Cruz Parsons, '09 for sixth all-time, while also ranking fifth all-time in completions (316) after passing Anton Stoneking, '21 (316) against Wagner, now ten behind Mark Drake, '92 (333) for fourth and 14 behind Tony Dello Iacono, '95 (337) for third all-time. Carraha also ranks seventh in touchdown passes (29), two behind Stoneking (31) for sixth.

#### MOVIN' ON UP!

Stonehill head coach **ELI GARDNER** took sole possession of second place in the program's varsity era (1988-pres.) with his 37th career win against Sacred Heart in week three. He moved past Connie Driscoll who posted a 36-24 mark at the College from 1993 to 1998, and now trails just Robert Talley with 48 wins (48-46) from 2007-2015. Gardner's nine years as head

coach matches Talley as the longest tentured head coach in the program's varsity era.

#### RUSH TO THE ZONE

Senior quarterback Ashur Carraha's (Cambridge, Mass.) 17-yard touchdown against Wagner was the second rushing touchdown of his career - and first since a 30-yard score in the Skyhawks 24-20 win over Duquesne in their NEC debut on October 1, 2022 - to go with 29 career touchdown passes.

#### YOU COMPLETE ME

Senior quarterback **ASHUR CARRAHA** (Cambridge, Mass.) became the sixth guarterback in Stonehill history to reach 300 career completions at New Hampshire in week two. His 323 career completions ranks fifth all-time - ten behind Mark Drake, '92 (333) for fourth all-time and just 14 behind Tony Dello Iacono, '95 (337) for third.

#### TOTAL YARDS

Senior quarterback ASHUR CARRAHA'S (Cambridge, Mass.) ranks fifth in the NEC with 164.5 total yards per game in four games played. He has compiled 658 total yards on 135 plays, including a career-high 306 total yards at Stony Brook in week one on 236 passing and 70 rushing. It marked the Skyhawks first 300-yard game since former quarterback Anton Stoneking, '21 posted 332 total yards (337 passing, -5 rushing) against rival Bentley on October 19, 2019. He was the first NEC quarterback to surpass 300 total yards since former Saint Francis quarterback Cole Doyle registered 412 yards in the air against Merrimack on Nov. 19, 2022.

#### BIG BOOT

Junior punter **NICK TANZOLA** (Mickleton, N.J.) is averaging 40.6 yards on his 27 punts through five games this season, delivering a booming 76-yard punt in the first half at Stony Brook in week one, which marks the second-longest punt in the NEC so far this season. He has five punts of 50-plus yards and ranks fourth in the NEC with eight punts inside the opponent's 20-yard line.

#### FIRST PICKS

Junior defensive backs JAHNEZ WILLIAMS (Chicago, III.) and Mo SEIDE (Malden, Mass.) provided Stonehill with its first two interceptions of the season against Wagner on October 5. It marked the first career interception for Williams, while Seide collected his second career pick, returning it 16 yards.

#### HOME COOKIN'

PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Stonehill had won three-straight games at W.B. Mason Stadium dating back to late September of last season before Wagner handed the Skyhawks a 28-7 loss in Easton three weeks ago.

JAREL WASHINGTON

Senior running back **JAREL WASHINGTON** (White Plains, N.Y.) was named the Northeast Conference Offensive Player of the Week for his efforts in Stonehill's 35-21 victory over Sacred Heart at W.B. Mason Stadium. Washington, named an NEC Rookie of the Week as a sophomore in 2022, posted his first career 100-yard game with a career-high 184 yards on 23 carries and two first half touchdowns. He opened the scoring with a 26-yard touchdown on the game's first possession 2:19 into the contest and then provided an instant answer to the Pioneers second quarter touchdown that sliced the Skyhawks lead to 14-7 with a career-best 72-yard touch-

down that helped the hosts stretch their lead to 28-7 at the half. Washington finished with 173 yards on 19 carries in the first half alone. Washington is just the second Stonehill student-athlete to earn Offensive Player of the Week honors, joining Jermaine Corbett who collected the award five times, with the Skyhawks collecting the honor six times in all over three seasons.

#### ROOKIE OF THE WEEK

Sophomore linebacker CHARLES BATTAGLIA (Massapegua, N.Y.) earned Northeast Conference Rookie of the Week honors for the first time for his efforts on the defensive side of the ball in Stonehill's 35-21 win over Sacred Heart. Battaglia led the Stonehill defense with a seven tackles (six solo), including 1.0 tackles for a loss of two yards. He has had an impact for the Skyhawks after sitting out the 2023 campaign, ranking second on the team with 33 tackles (16 solo), with the 1.0 tackle for loss, ranking 15th in the NEC with his 5.5 tackles per game. Stonehill has collected four NEC Rookie of the Week honors over its first three years in the Conference, with

Battaglia being the third Skyhawk to earn the recognition, joining teammates JAREL WASHINGTON (9/5/22), ASHUR CARRAHA (10/3/22) and NIGEL HENDERson (9/18/23).

#### **GETTING GRADED**

Postgraduate right guard ERIC MESLIN (Ringwood, N.J.) was the No. 2 graded right guard in NCAA Division I FCS football by PFF.com and Hero Sports after week for following Stonehill's 35-21 win over Sacred Heart in which the Skyhawks rushed the ball for 354 yards and accumulated 418 yards of total offense in the contest. Meslin received an 80.4 grading in the contest, trailing just Delaware right guard Bradly Anyanwu (81.3), while Kadin Lynch of William & Mary (78.6), Montana State's Connor Moore (77.2) and Robert Morris' Hayden Baron (76.1) rounded out the top five for the week. PFF offers a different look at the top-performing FCS players

outside of just the statistical leaders. The website provides a more analytical look, providing grades for each player based on film. The PFF grading system evaluates every player on every play. Each position has its own grading rubric.

#### DUDES OF THE WEEK

Senior running back **JAREL WASHINGTON** (White Plains, N.Y.) and junior running back **ZAVION WOODARD** (Baltimore, Md.) earned "Dude of the Week" status from New England Football Journal for their efforts in Stonehill's week three win over Sacred Heart. The duo spearheaded Stonehill's offense that racked up 354 of the Sky-

hawks 418 yards of total offense on the ground in the 35-21 win over Sacred Heart as both surpassed 100 yards rushing with career-best performances. Washington totaled 184 yards on 23 carries and two touchdowns, including a career-long scoring run of 72-yards in the second quarter. Woodard added a 110 yards on 19 carries and a fourth quarter 31-yard score to seal the win.



#### **CENTURY MARKS**

Junior running back **ZAVION WOODARD** (Baltimore, Md.) notched his second career 100-yard game with his career-high 110 yards on 19 carries and a score in Stonehill's 35-24 win over Sacred Heart three weeks ago. He posted his first 100-yard game of his collegiate career in his first career start at Merrimack last October, rushing the ball a career-best 20 times for 103 yards and two touchdowns for the first multi-touchdown game of his career. Senior running back **JAREL WASHINGTON** (White Plains, N.Y.) reeled off a career-high 184 yards on 23 carries with two touchdowns against the Pioneers, surpassing 100-yards rushing for the first time in his career.

#### **TWIN 100s**

Senior **Jarel Washington** (White Plains, N.Y.) and junior **Zavion Woodard** (Baltimore, Md.) both surpassed 100 yards in Stonehill's win over Sacred Heart on September 21, marking the first time Stonehill has featured two running backs reaching the century mark in its NCAA I FCS era and first time overall since All-American Justin Felder (177) and Brian Kearns, Jr. (103) accomplished the feat in a 35-13 win over Bloomsburg (Pa.) University on September 4, 2021.

#### WHO BUT?

Stonehill's 354 rushing yards against Sacred Heart in week three are the fourth-highest single game total in W.B. Mason Stadium history and the third-best by the Skyhawks who rushed for a Stadium record 399 yards against Wagner College in 2022 and 376 yards against Pace in 2011. Senior running back *Jarel Washington's* (White Plains, N.Y.) 72-yard touchdown run in the second quarter is the eighth-longest run in W.B. Mason Stadium history – the fourth-longest by a Skyhawk.

#### **CENTURY CHARM**

Stonehill is 27-6 during head coach **ELI GARDNER's** nine-year tenure at the helm when having a 100-yard rusher after senior **JAREL WASHINGTON** (White Plains, N.Y.) and junior **ZAVION WOODARD** (Baltimore, Md.) posted the Skyhakws first two 100-yard games of the season against Sacred Heart. Stonehill was 4-1 with a 100-yard rusher last season.

#### **PLAYING CLEAN**

Despite the wet and rainy conditions at W.B. Mason Stadium against Sacred Heart in week three, neither team committed a turnover in the game. While Sacred Heart recovered its two fumbles committed in the game, neither team handed the ball over to the other side in 123 combined offensive plays. Stonehill is 14-3 under head coach **ELI GARDNER** when it doesn't turn the ball over.

#### **FAST STARTS**

Stonehill is 29-10 under head coach **ELI GARDNER** when scoring first after its 35-21 win over Sacred Heart in which the Skyhawks took the opening kickoff and marched 75 yards in six plays, capped by senior **Jarel Washington's** (White Plains, N.Y.) 26-yard touchdown. The Skyhawks have scored on their first offensive possession in two of their four games after **ZAVION WOODARD** (Baltimore, Md.) answered an opening drive touchdown by New Hampshire in week two with a score.

#### LONG SCENIC DRIVES

Stonehill produced two scoring drives of ten-plus plays at Sacred Heart in week three, with **Chase Miller's** (Baltimore, Md.) first career touchdown capping a 12-play, 80-yard drive on the Skyhawks second possession which consumed 6:18 off the clock. The Skyhawks first points of the 2024 season came with a ten play, 71-yard drive that produced a 21-yard field goal by senior **Danny Hurley** (Wakefield, Mass.). Stonehill produced 16 double-figure play scoring drives last season, including drives of 16 (TD) and 14 plays (GW FG) at Georgetown.

#### **WINNING FORMULAS**

Stonehill improved to 26-3 all-time under head coach **ELI GARDNER** when scoring 30-plus points after its 35-21 win over Sacred Heart. The Skyhawks are also a perfect 6-0 when rushing for 300-plus yards, including a 20-3 clip when rushing for 200-plus since Gardner took over as head coach. Stonehill is 19-4 all-time under coach Gardner when accumulating 400-plus yards of total offense.

#### **HALF WAY THERE**

Stonehill is 26-4 under head coach **ELI GARDNER** when holding a halftime lead after its week three win over Sacred Heart in which it took a 28-7 lead at the intermission. The Skyhawks are 30-3 under Gardner when leading after three quarters.

#### **20-20 VISION**

Stonehill is 32-15 overall in nine seasons under head coach **ELI GARDNER** when scoring 20-plus points after last week's 48-28 setback at Merrimack.



#### **GOOD CATCH**

Junior tight end **Copy Ruff** (Saco, Maine) made the most of his first career start at Stony Brook in week one by catching six passes for 105 yards. It marks the highest receiving yardage total in Stonehill's three-year NCAA FCS era and is the first 100-yard receiving game since former wide receiver Chris Domercant caught four passes for 109 yards against New Haven on October 23, 2021. It's the first 100-yard game by a Skyhawks tight end since Kaleb Lutton caught seven passes for 125 yards in a 21-17 win over New Haven on October 15, 2016.

#### **RECEIVING THE PASS**

Junior tight end **COLE CLARKE** (Lake George, N.Y.) made a splash in his collegiate debut at Stony Brook, catching Stonehill's first touchdown of the season. Clarke has moved to tight end this season after serving as a backup quarterback for the first two seasons of his collegiate career.





#### **BLOCK PARTY**

Senior defensive lineman **VAHN FRIDAY** (Suffern, N.Y.) delivered a blocked extra point in the second quarter of Stonehill's week one matchup with Stony Brook. It marks Stonehill's first block since Michael Lewis had a blocked extra point in a 41-20 win over Southern Connecticut State at W.B. Mason Stadium on November 2, 2019.

#### **SPLIT ALLEGIENCES**

The family of Stonehill junior defensive back **Mo SEIDE** (Malden, Mass.) was divided in its support in the Skyhawks week two matchup with New Hampshire as his older brother **ISAAC SEIDE** is a senior running back for the Wildcats. Mo has appeared in 18 games over his first two seasons at Stonehill and totaled 28 tackles (17

solo), including 1.0 for a loss of a yard, with an interception and eight pass breakups over his career. The two brothers met head to head on the field once during last year's inaugural meeting with UNH as Mo posted one of his four stops on his older brother on a two-yard rush. The pair didn't have a head-to-head play this season.

#### TWO OUTTA THREE AIN'T BAD

Stonehill dropped its NEC opener for the first time since joining the Conference prior to the 2022 season with its 28-7 setback to Wagner. The Skyhawks opened their 2023 NEC season with a 33-30 win at Central Connecticut State in week two last fall after opening its inaugural NCAA I FCS season in the NEC with a 24-20 victory over Duquesne University at W.B. Mason Stadium in 2022, in a game televised on ESPN3.

#### PRESEASON PROGNOSTICATIONS

Stonehill was picked fifth in the preseason coaches' poll the Conference announced at its Social Media Day on July 24. The coaches poll is led by reigning NEC Champions and NCAA I FCS Championship participant Duquesne University with five of seven first place votes. Saint Francis University is second with a first place vote, while Robert Morris University is picked third as the Colonials return to the NEC after a five-year hiatus, with Long Island University fourth and receiving the remaining first place vote. Wagner College and Central Connecticut State University follow Stonehill in the poll in sixth and seventh, respectively.

#### PRESEASON ALL-NEC

Stonehill junior defensive back **JORDAN IRVINE** (Beverly, Mass.) was selected to the preaseon All-NEC media day by the Conference's head coaches the league announced at its Social Media Day at MetLife Stadium on July 24. The Skyhawks are represented on the All-NEC preseason team for the second-straight year with Irvine's selection for the first time in his career after a breakout sophomore season for the Skyhawks in 2023. Irvine started seven of the eight games he played during the 2023 season, finishing fifth on the team with 30 tackles, 20 solo, including 0.5 for a loss of a yard, an interception, pass breakup and fumble recovery.

Postgrad **ERIC MESLIN** (Ringwood, N.J.), seniors **ASHUR CARRAHA** (Cambridge, Mass.), **VAHN FRIDAY** (Suffern, N.Y.) and **JERMAINE WILLIAMS** (Stamford, Conn.), along with juniors **JORDAN IRVINE** (Beverly, Mass.) and **CODY RUFF** (Saco, Maine) were voted to lead

the team by their teammates at the conclusion of Spring Ball, which was endorsed by Gardner and the coaching staff.

#### DIG

The Stonehill captains select a teammate to carry a team shovel to each practice and game over the course of the week. The Ames Shovel symbolizes the team's motto DIG - Discipline, Intellect and Grit. The shovel was chosen from the Ames shovel collection at Stonehill. The land that now holds the College was purchased by the Congregation of Holy Cross from the Ames Family hat operated a world-class shovel factory known for their quality that helped supply many of America's major construction events. Known as the founder of the Ames Shovel Company, Oliver Ames was the youngest child of Captain John Ames and his wife Susanna Howard of West Bridgewater, Massachusetts. John Ames was the village blacksmith and made shovels in addition to a wide variety of other iron products. Oliver married Susana Angier in 1803, and that same year moved to Easton where he bought a defunct nail making shop and began the production of shovels. In 1807, Oliver and his family moved to Plymouth where he supervised the shovel making plant of the Plymouth Iron Works. Shovel Production continued at his own North Easton factory. The Ames brand became known for its quality and the company became the key supplier to America's major construction events. Stonehill is home to the Ames Shovel Museum.





#### IN MEMORIAM

Stonehill honored the passing of football alum **DAN GAM-ACHE** (guh-MAWSH), Class of 1995 and member of the Stonehill Athletic Hall of Fame Class of 2014, during its bye week with a moment of silence prior to its NEC opener against Wagner. The former defensive lineman was an important piece of four winning seasons for the football program in the infancy of its varsity era and remains as the program's all-time leader with 34.0 career sacks, including a program record 14 his senior season.

Gamache played 37 games over his collegiate career and finished with 207 career tackles as a defensive end. He earned All-Eastern Collegiate Football Conference honors, also being named ECFC Lineman of the Year as a junior before serving as captain his senior year. #### **CELEBRATING THE 1989 NEFC CHAMPIONS!**

Stonehill welcomed the 1989 football team that captured the first championship in the program's varsity era back to campus to celebrate the 35th anniversary of the New England Football Conference title for its NEC opener against Wagner. Captains **Dan Smith**, **Jeff Reil-Ly** and **Kevin Webb** joined the

Skyhawks current captains for the opening coin toss and the entire team was introduced at halftime. In just its second varsity season in 1989, under the direction of head coach **CLIFF SHERMAN**, the team emerged from an 0-2 start with setbacks to MIT and Merrimack to win six of its last seven to claim the first championship in the program's varsity era (1988-present). After edging Western New England (14-8), Stonehill avenged the week two setback to MIT with a 42-20 triumph. Stonehill fell to Stony Brook in week five, but reeled off wins over its final four games to clinch the title. The season was capped by wins over Western New England (28-11), Merrimack (7-0), Assumption (40-20) and rival Bentley (24-12). Running back **FRANK STRACHAN** earned NEFC MVP honors and was joined on the All-NEFC team by **BRIAN DRISCOLL, TODD OLIVERIA** and **MARC VECCHIO**.



#### BRIGHT LIGHTS

Stonehill once again hosted a national broadcast audience with its Northeast Conference football opener against Wagner College at W.B. Mason Stadium, as part of the NEC's 2024 Television Package. Stonehill's NEC opener against Wagner aired on ESPN+, marking the third-straight year the Skyhawks have been featured on the network through the Conference's football broadcasting package, with regional coverage also available through NESN 360, YES Network and SportsNet Pittsburgh, along with NEC Front Row. The Skyhawks are 3-3 all-time in games broadcast on the ESPN family of networks after being defeated by Wagner. Stonehill also owns a 21-17 triumph over the University of New Haven in 2016 as part of the Division II Football Showcase at W.B. Mason Stadium. The Skyhawks also faced New Haven in a game televised on CBS Sports Network in 2012 (L, 45-41).

#### **COLLEGE GRADS**

Four members of the Stonehill football program are among a record 3,568 student-athletes who have already earned their undergraduate degrees and will be playing college football this fall while pursuing additional diplomas. This season marks the seventh year the National Football Foundation has compiled the list of graduated players. #### HEAD COACH ELI GARDNER

Eli Gardner is in his eighth year as head coach of the football program at Stonehill, having been promoted after serving seven seasons on former head coach Robert Talley's coaching staff.

Gardner, the 2019 D2Football.com Northeast-10 Coach of the Year and Gridiron Club of Greater Boston's 2015 Division II Assistant Coach of the Year, steered the football program to a 37-39

(.487) record as a head coach, including an 8-2 mark in 2021. The Skyhawks won five of their last six games, including its final three games, to finish 6-2 and in third place in its final NE10 season.

earned a spot on the American Football Coaches' All-America Team.

Gardner was selected to participate in the 2018 AFCA 35 Under 35 Coaches Leadership Institute, presented by the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) and NCAA Leadership Development, during the 2018 AFCA Convention. Five Skyhawks earned NE10 Academic All-NE10 honors over his first three seasons, including quarterback Matt Foltz '18 who received the National Football Foundation Jack Grinold/Eastern Massachusetts Chapters' Jack Daly Award for Academics, Citizenship and Football. Donovan Phanor '18 also earned a spot on the CSC Academic All-District I first team in 2017 and the football program received the NE10 Team Academic Achievement



Gardner oversees the program's transition to NCAA Division I FCS membership, with the program showing a two win improvement in the Northeast Conference from year one to year two, resulting in a tie for second place in the NEC standings in 2023 at 4-3 in Conference play. The Skyhawks were the lone NEC member to knock off Conference Champion and NCAA FCS Playoff participant Duquesne - doing so on the road in November. Nine Skyhawks have earned All-NEC honors over their first two seasons, with offensive lineman David Satkowski named the NEC's Scholar-Athlete of the Year two-straight years while also being named a finalist for the Doris Robinson FCS Scholar-Athlete Award. The program also received the NEC Team Sportsmanship Award in 2022.

Satkowski also made headlines for Stonehill by receiving an invitation to rookie mini-camp by the Chicago Bears before signing with the DC Defenders in the XFL. 47 Stonehill student-athletes have earned All-Conference honors over his eight seasons at the helm, including a record 14 in 2019. That season, Justin Felder became the program's first Harlon Hill Trophy Candidate and

Gardner came to Stonehill prior to the 2009 season as special teams







coordinator and linebackers coach under former head coach Robert Talley. He would be promoted to defensive coordinator in 2011 and associate head coach in 2014. He transformed the Skyhawks defense into one of the premier units in not just the NE10 Conference, but within all of Division II since taking over as defensive coordinator. He directed a Stonehill defense which ranked second in the NE10 and 11th nationally in Division II for total defense last season, allowing just 279.2 yards per game, and second in the Conference for passing defense (17th nationally) at 158.5 yards per game. The Skyhawks led the NE10 (23rd) in rushing defense (120.6 yds/gm) and ranked fourth (34th) for scoring defense (20.9 ppg). The defense also ranked eighth nationally for first down defense (14.4 allowed per game) and 15th for third down conversion defense (30.6%).

16 Stonehill defensive players earned All-10 honors in Gardner's six seasons as defensive coordinator, with four also collecting All-Super Region 1 accolades and Jareed Gaines, '13, and Brian Harrington, '15 earning All-America status. Harrington had a record-breaking season for the Skyhawks in 2013 and was a finalist for the inaugural Cliff Harris Award for the top small college defensive player in the country, while also earning the Joseph

Gardner helped guide the Skyhawks to a share of the NE10 regular season championship for the first time in program history in 2013 as the team posted its first winning season (8-3, 8-1 NE-10) since 1996.

Roland Dempster paced a Stony Brook rushing effort that posted 260 of its 421 yards of total offense with 160 yards on 19 carries with three touchdowns. Sebastian Regis paced the Stony Brook defense with three tackles (two solo), a sack for a loss of ten yards and a 69-yard fumble return for a touchdown that extended the Seawolves lead to 34 points. Senior ASHUR CARRAHA (Cambridge, Mass.) led Stonehill with a career-high 306 total yards, completing 18-of-36 passes for 236 yards and a touchdown, while adding another 70 yards on ten carries on the ground. Junior CODY RUFF (Saco, Maine) caught six of those passes for a career-best 105 yards, while junior **COLE CLARKE** (Lake George, N.Y.) caught the Skyhawks first touchdown of the season in his Skyhawks debut. Stonehill got on the scoreboard with a tenplay, 71-yard drive on the opening possession of the second half, capped by a 21-yard field goal by senior **DANNY HURLEY** (Wakefield, Mass.). Stony Brook broke the game open from there with Dempster's third touchdown of the afternoon on a three-yard run with 7:52 left in the quarter prior to Regis' 69yard fumble return two minutes later. Clarke's first career touchdown on a three-yard toss from Carraha capped the scoring on the afternoon with 4:04 to play in the third.

Seth Morgan tossed six touchdown passes to fire New Hampshire, receiving votes in the AFCA Division I FCS poll, to a 45-6 victory over Stonehill at Wildcat Stadium. Morgan matched the UNH program-record set by his head coach Rick Santos with the six touchdown passes, completing 22-of-30 passes for 387 yards, finishing just a yard shy of 400 total yards by adding 12 yards on two carries. Three of Morgan's touchdown passes went to junior Joey Corcoran who finished with 129 yards on five receptions, while classmate Caleb Burke also surpassed 100 receiving yards with three catches, two touchdowns, for 134 yards. Junior **ZAVION WOODARD** (Baltimore, Md.) scored his first touchdown of the year for Stonehill, finishing with 24 yards on 12 carries. Senior **Ashur Carraha** (Cambridge, Mass.) finished with 148 total yards, including a career-high 71 on the ground on ten carries. **JORDAN IRVINE** (Beverly, Mass.) led the Stonehill defense with a season-high eight tackles (all solo), while juniors **ZACK ATHY** (Holliston, Mass.) and **BROCK BUT-**LER (Bowie, Md.) each chipped in with 1.0 tackles for loss and three solo stops. New Hampshire grabbed the lead on the opening possession of the game with Morgan connecting Corcoran for the first time for an 11-yard touchdown toss 4:38 into the contest. Stonehill had an immediate answer, covering 70-yards on nine plays on the ensuing possession before Woodard scored from two yards out. New Hampshire provided an answer of the Stonehill momentum with a quick touchdown of its own as Morgan and Corcoran connected for a touchdown again on a 56-yard pass just 2:07 later. That would spark the Wildcats to 38-unanswered points to win going away. Morgan hit Burke for a 36-yard score one play after Carraha was intercepted five minutes into the second quarter and then added a touchdown pass to Colby Ramshaw with just five seconds remaining in the first half for a 28-6 halftime lead. Morgan tacked on two more touchdown passes in the third, starting with a 68-yard pass to Burke and then connecting with Corcoran for a third time with a 32-yard score midway through the frame.

Stonehill rode a pair of 100-yard rushers, in posting 354 yards on the ground, to its first win of the season with a 35-21 triumph over Sacred Heart as the Skyhawks opened their home slate in style on Family Weekend at W.B. Mason Stadium. JAREL WASHINGTON (White Plains, N.Y.) surpassed the 100yard mark for the first time in his career with a career-best 184 yards on 23 carries and a pair of touchdowns, while **ZAVION WOODARD** (Baltimore, Md.) added a career-high 110 yards on 19 carries and a score, reaching the century mark for the second time in his career. Stonehill posted 354 of its 418 yards of total offense on the ground in the rainy conditions at W.B. Mason Stadium, averaging 6.9 yards per carry as a team, with Washington collecting 8.0 yards per touch, including scoring runs of 26 and 72 yards. Cody Ruff and Chase Miller each collected their first career touchdown receptions in the win for Stonehill. Jalen Madison led the Sacred Heart offense with 110 yards on 20 carries with a touchdown, adding another 24 yards on four catches to finish with 134 all-purpose yards. John Michalski added 151 total yards, completing 16-of-28 passes for 143 yards and a touchdown through the air, while rushing for another score on five carries for eight yards on the ground. Washington capped the opening drive of the game with a 26-yard score to the right side just 2:19 into the contest. Stonehill doubled its lead by covering 80 yards in 12 plays and consuming 6:18, capped by a seven-yard touchdown toss by Carraha to Miller with 4:17 remaining in the first quarter. Washington was again the spark in the drive, carrying the ball eight times for 40 yards during the possession. Sacred Heart got on the scoreboard with a lengthy drive of its own with a 23-yard touchdown run by Madison with 8:57 to play in the half, but Washington had an immediate response, taking Stonehill's next play from scrimmage 72 yards down the right sideline for his second touchdown of the day just 18-seconds later. Sacred Heart pulled back within a score (28-21) when Michalski connected for a 17-yard touchdown pass with 1:44 to play, but was unable to convert on the ensuing onside kick, and Woodard delivered three plays later with a 31-yard touchdown run to seal the Skyhawks first win of the season.

Jake Cady tossed three touchdown passes and Rickey Spruill scored touchdowns on the ground and via the air to lead Wagner to the victory. Spruill finished with a game-high 132 all-purpose yards, including 103 rushing yards on 14 carries and a touchdown while adding 29 yards on two catches with a score. Three of Cady's six completions on the night went for touchdowns, totaling 208 total yards with 168 passing yards on 6-of-14 attempts and the three scores. Justin Reilly paced a Wagner defense that limited Stonehill to 192 yards and just the one touchdown with a game-high 12 tackles (ten solo), including a sack for a loss of ten yards. Merrimack rushed for 375 yards and built a 27-point halftime lead on its way to a 48-28 triumph over Stonehill at Duane Stadium. Stadium, was formally dedicated on September 10, 2005. The playing field at the stadium, Timothy J. Coughlin, '80 Memorial Field, was also dedicated on September 10th in memory of Tim Coughlin, a former football standout of Stonehill's Class of 1980, who had his life tragically cut short during the attack on the World Trade Center on September 11, 2001. W.B. Mason President and CEO Leo Meehan, who is also a Stonehill trustee and alumnus, announced that the Company and its alumni employees have committed \$1.5 million toward cost of the almost \$4 million project. The 2,400-seat W.B. Mason Stadium is a multi-purpose outdoor facility with a 400-meter, eight-lane track, FieldTurf (which was completely refinished in 2018), specialty areas for track and field events, and lighting for evening use. The facility is also home to field hockey and women's lacrosse. W.B. Mason Stadium served as host of the 2009 and 2016 NCAA Division II Field Hockey Championships, the 2010, 2014 and 2017 Northeast-10 Track & Field Championship and 2013 New England Track & Fleld Championships. The stadium will serve as host of the 2025 Northeast Conference Outdoor Track & Field Championships for the first time in May.
