Titan Talk

UW-Oshkosh hosts Rockford University (Ill.) in the UW-Oshkosh Rec Plex Dome on Thursday in its second home game.

Women's flag football played its inaugural game under the dome on Wednesday, February 25 against Aurora University (Ill.) in the first-ever game for both programs. The Spartans won, 34-0.

The Titans hit the road for their first games away from Oshkosh on Sunday, March 22 for Marian University's first triangular of the year. They lost to Marian (22-0) and Illinois Wesleyan University (53-0).

Adding to the excitement around flag football is the addition of the sport to the 2028 Summer Olympics schedule. The 2028 Games will be held in Los Angeles.

The Titans will also host Rockford University (Ill.) under the dome on Saturday, April 4, at 4 p.m. and play their first game at J. J. Keller Field at Titan Stadium on Sunday, April 12, as they welcome Bryant & Stratton College to Oshkosh for a 4 p.m. game.

Flag football teams compete 7-on-7, with average rosters of about 25 players.

Games are played in four 12-minute quarters on a field 80 yards long by 40 yards wide. The offense has four downs to cross each 20-yard line for a first down, with an option to punt on fourth down.

Failure to advance results in a change of possession. Teams score six points for a touchdown and may attempt an additional one- or two-point play from five or 10 yards out.

Unlike tackle football, there are no field goals or point-after kicks. Instead of tackling, competitors wear flag belts with two pop-flags fixed at their hips; play ends when a flag is pulled.
