The Future of Croquet

Of all the issues at stake for Americans today, there are few as important or as divisive as the future of croquet. "When people think of America, they think of croquet," noted sports historian Jiff Teddy told reporters, "That and Twinkies. I'm telling you, this is the bald eagle of sports: the future of croquet is the future of America, and the future we'll be handing to our children. Now is the time to really invest in the game."

Despite the push to invest, many teams have found this difficult. It's no secret that the median salary of professional croquet players has dropped from \$2.8 million in 2005 to a bare \$96,500 in 2015. Competition from the emerging cornhole and bocce ball leagues have forced many croquet teams to make cutbacks, replacing their traditional wooden mallets with mailboxes filled with sand, and substituting beluga caviar with the less expensive salmon roe as the centerpiece of their mid-practice hors d'oeuvres.

But competition accounts for only some of the croquet industry's losses. As the tastes of fans edge towards more physical, fast-paced, poorly refereed sports, the quiet dignity of croquet has been pushed by the wayside. "I think people want to see blood," said retired Imperial Wicket Davis Slendermack, speaking from his Malibu home, "Not necessarily physical blood, you understand. Though that was the way in Roman times. What the savage masses want is to see people like them: savages. They want to see athletes collide like trucks and argue like barroom brawlers. And that's not what we croquet players are about. Mostly, we're about good sportsmanship, sun hats, and stiff handshakes."

In response to the pressures of the modern audience, the Council of Wickets convened for the first time in over a century. In October, three hundred Grand Imperial Wickets from all over the world met in Reynolds Tavern in Annapolis, MD. Although they spent over four and a half hours in negotiation, and consumed two pots of tea apiece, they ultimately reached the verdict that the sport was "quite alright after all," and took no new action to secure its future.

However, there still seems to be hope that croquet will be rescued: stockholders plan to hold a meeting next month in Las Vegas, NV, and bring about the changes that the Council of Wickets neglected.

But according to E.R. Dunham, controversial croquet theorist and speculative science fiction writer, the sport will have to become a very different game from the one we know and love today if it is to survive. "Mallets will be supercharged, moving at relativistic speeds" he told reporters, "So the balls will only be able to take one or two hits before they shat-

too, lasting between two and three hundred nanoseconds. That's still longer than most football plays. That'll leave plenty of time for ads, or for players to stage arguments with the refs."

Whatever the future of the sport holds, it is clear that Annapolis will continue to be the Silicon Valley of croquet technology development, and the heart of what sports historian Jiff Teddy calls, "America's other pastime."




Fig. 1: Croquet mallet c. 2100. Handle is made of an aluminum-carbon composite alloy. The head is made of depleted uranium, with striker plates made of a non-Newtonian substance called super graphene, which returns three thousand percent energy efficiency on blunt force compression.
