Presidents of St. John's College

In 1696 the General Assembly of colonial Maryland established King William's School under the Petitionary Act. King William's School continued in existence through the War of Independence, and in 1784 was chartered by the General Assembly of the State of Maryland as St. John's College. The College has been in continuous operation since its founding with the exception of five years during the War between the States. The following Presidents have served St. John's College.
