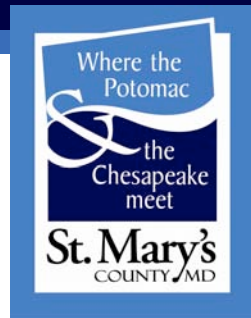

ITINERARY

DAY ONE

First Stop: St. Mary's County Welcome Center. Freshen up at our new center housed in a historic building that was once part of the Charlotte Hall Military Academy. Here you can get an overview of the sites and attractions along your trip.



Second Stop: Head south towards the **Potomac River** and visit **St. Clement's Island Museum**. From Memorial Day through September, take a ride on the **Water Taxi** to the island and tour recently rebuilt **Blackstone Lighthouse**.

Third Stop, Lunch: Enjoy lunch at a **waterside seafood restaurant** or at a restaurant in historic Leonardtown.

Fourth Stop: Head down the west side of the St. Mary's peninsula to **Piney Point Lighthouse Museum and Historic Park** on the Potomac. The museum offers a collection of historic Chesapeake Bay vessels, a museum, and of course, a lighthouse—the first one built on the Potomac River.



Fifth Stop: Dinner. Enjoy a seafood dinner at a waterside restaurant in the Piney Point-St. George Island area.

Overnight: Stay at one of our finest group-friendly hotels and enjoy the special touches that make you know you are welcome! Enjoy a complimentary breakfast before beginning a second inspiring day!

DAY TWO



First Stop: Spend the day at **Historic St. Mary's City**. Begin with an orientation at the visitor's center, and then enjoy a tour of Maryland's first capital and 17th century city. Step aboard the **Maryland Dove** anchored along the beautiful St. Mary's River with the knowledgeable and entertaining 17th century sailors.

Second Stop: Lunch. Enjoy lunch on your own in the great hall at adjacent St. Mary's College, or have a lunch created to suit your group and dine at the historic site. Then continue your exploration of Historic St. Mary's city into the early afternoon.

Third Stop: Stop and shop at **Cecil's Old Mill Historic District**. Located in one of Maryland's first Industrial Districts, the Mill was originally built as a textile factory in 1812. Today the Mill features a working water wheel and the works of local artisans. Across the street, you can visit **Cecil's Country Store and Post Office**. Board your bus for departure.



ADD A THIRD DAY

St. Mary's County is known for its fabulous events held throughout the year. Plan a tour around the seasons and the interests of your group! You might want to try summer and enjoy the Potomac Jazz & Seafood Festival in July. Or visit us in the fall for the St. Mary's County Oyster Festival, which is home to the National Oyster Shucking Championship and the National Oyster Cook Off. Whenever you choose to visit there is always something fun to do, see and eat!
