JAMES 1:19-27

¹⁹This you know, my beloved brethren. But everyone must be quick to hear, slow to speak and slow to anger; ²⁰for the anger of man does not achieve the righteousness of God. ²¹Therefore, putting aside all filthiness and all that remains of wickedness, in humility receive the word implanted, which is able to save your souls.

²²But prove yourselves doers of the word and not merely hearers who delude themselves. ²³For if anyone is a hearer of the word and not a doer, he is like a man who looks at his natural face in a mirror; ²⁴for once he has looked at himself and gone away, he has immediately forgotten what kind of person he was. ²⁵But one who looks intently at the perfect law the law of liberty and abides by it, not having become a forgetful hearer but an effectual doer, this man will be blessed in what he does.

²⁶If anyone thinks himself to be religious, and yet does not bridle his tongue but deceives his own heart, this man's religion is worthless. ²⁷Pure and undefiled religion in the sight of our God and Father is this: to visit orphans and widows in their distress, and to keep oneself unstained by the world.

JAMES 1:18

¹⁸In the exercise of His will He brought us forth by the word of truth, so that we would be a kind of first fruits among His creatures.

- In the exercise of His will "He decided;" God is the active agent in regeneration; He initiates the work of salvation
- By the word of truth "the gospel" See Col. 1:5; Eph. 1:13.

JAMES 1:22-25

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A. THE COMMAND: BECOMING A FAITHFUL DOER v.22

But prove yourselves doers of the word . . .

But – this conjunction functions as a continuative; there is more to say on the topic he was just discussing



Two types of people:

Word-doers and Self-deluders.

1) Word-doers

NASB95 But **prove** yourselves doers of the word

LSB But **become** doers of the word

ESV But **be** doers of the word

Not a one-time or even frequent act of doing the word, but continually being a person who does the word.

John MacArthur: "He is describing characteristic behavior, not occasional activity. It is one thing to fight; it is something else to be a soldier. It is one thing to build a shed; it is something else to be a builder. James is not merely challenging his readers to do the Word; he is telling them real Christians are doers of the Word. That describes the basic disposition of those who believe unto salvation."

Same truth in Romans:

Romans 2:13 – for it is not the hearers of the Law who are just before God, but the doers of the Law will be justified.

Same truth taught by Christ:

Luke 11:28 – "... blessed are those who hear the word of God and observe it."

John 13:17 – "If you know these things, you are blessed if you do them.

2) Self-deluders

- ... and not merely hearers who delude themselves.
- Hearer as each person in the early church did not have their own copies of the Bible, they intake of God's Word was always through hearing the Word read and taught
- Merely this was the problem, the hearing was not coupled with doing
- Delude themselves "to deceive, to defraud, to cheat"
- These self-deluded people are hearing the word. This means that they are people who are regular church attenders!

B. The Illustration: Being a Foolish Observer v.23-24

James 1:23-24 – For if anyone is a hearer of the word and not a doer, he is like a man who <u>looks</u> at his <u>natural face</u> in a <u>mirror</u>; ²⁴for once he has looked at himself and gone away, he has immediately forgotten what kind of person he was."

1) Faithful Observation

- Mirror usually polished bronze
- Natural face "face of genesis;" his own physical face
- Looks to closely perceive or carefully look

James 1:23-24 – . . . for once he has looked at himself and gone away, he has immediately forgotten what kind of person he was."

2) Forgetful Implementation

- Forgotten to fail to act on knowledge received
 - Proverbs 3:1 My son, do not <u>forget</u> my teaching, but let your heart keep my commandments.
 - Psalm 119:16 I shall delight in Your statutes; I shall not <u>forget</u>
 Your word.
- Matthew 7:21–23 "Not everyone who says to Me, 'Lord, Lord,' will enter the kingdom of heaven, but he who does the will of My Father who is in heaven will enter..."

C. THE PROMISE: BLESSING A PERSEVERING DOER v.25

James 1:23-24 – But one who looks intently at the perfect law, the law of liberty, and abides by it, not having become a forgetful hearer but an effectual doer, this man will be blessed in what he does.

1) Faithful Observation

- Look intently "to stoop and look, exert effort to see something by bending down"
- Abides "to continue or remain"
- Law- still referring to "the word" which is gospel truth, but points to authority of the Scripture
- Perfect law, the law of liberty the fulfilled law through Christ

James 1:25 – . . . not having become a forgetful hearer but an <u>effectual</u> doer."

2) Faithful Implementation

- Effectual doer a person who acts on knowledge received
- Matthew 7:24-27

"Therefore everyone who hears these words of Mine and acts on them, may be compared to a wise man who built his house on the rock. "And the rain fell, and the floods came, and the winds blew and slammed against that house; and yet it did not fall, for it had been founded on the rock.

"Everyone who hears these words of Mine and does not act on them, will be like a foolish man who built his house on the sand. "The rain fell, and the floods came, and the winds blew and slammed against that house; and it fell—and great was its fall."

James 1:25 – . . . this man will be blessed in what he does. ."

3) Blessed Conclusion Implementation

Blessed – God's favor upon you
