What are Deacons?

Every year at Grace, we have the privilege and joy of recognizing new deacons and renominating those who are able to continue serving. To do this, our elders prayerfully consider members who are practically and faithfully serving our church body. Nomination as a deacon is not an appointment to a new ministry or additional responsibilities, but rather a recognition of devoted ministry as an active servant-leader.

The New Testament uses three primary words that refer to deacons: *diakonos*, which means “servant”; *diakonia*, which means “service”; and *diakoneō*, which means “to serve.” While all believers are to be characterized by service, some are appointed by leadership to the role of deacon (cf. Acts 6:2–6, Romans 12:7). And in 1 Timothy 3, there is a specific discussion of the office of deacon (vv. 8–10, 12).

From Timothy, we learn that deacons are equally qualified with elders in terms of character and spiritual life, but they are not required like elders to be able to teach. Elders oversee the work of those who serve


the Lord, and deacons come alongside the elders to assist in that work in a crucial, supporting role. The qualifications for deacons can be divided into two categories: personal character and spiritual character. These qualifications for servant-leadership apply to both deacons and deaconesses (cf. 1 Timothy 3:11).

Personal Character

He must be a man of dignity. The Greek term translated “dignity” means “worthy of respect, stately, dignified.” It denotes a seriousness of mind and character. A deacon must be worthy of respect and serious-minded, not treating serious things lightly.

He must not be double-tongued. He is always consistent and righteous in what he says. He is not someone who says one thing to one person and something else to another. He knows how to bridle his tongue and is not a malicious gossip.

He must not be addicted to much wine. He is to be characterized by clear thinking and self-control.



Deacons likewise must be dignified, not double-tongued, not indulging in much wine, not fond of dishonest gain, but holding to the mystery of the faith with a clear conscience. And these men must also first be tested; then let them serve as deacons if they are beyond reproach.

—1 Timothy 3:8–10

He must not be fond of gain. His goals in life are not to be monetary. 1 Timothy 6:9 says that a pervasive desire for financial gain corrupts a man.

Spiritual Character

He must be doctrinally sound.

1 Timothy 3:9 says that he must hold “to the mystery of the faith with a clear conscience.” “The faith” refers to the whole of Christian truth. A “clear conscience” is the result of obeying the truth. He must hold to the faith and apply the truth in his life.

He must be active in spiritual service.

Verse 10 says, “Let these also first be tested; then let them serve as deacons.” The verb translated “be tested” speaks of an ongoing test, not a single test or probationary period. The test is an ongoing general assessment by the church of his service to Christ. Before being affirmed as a deacon, he must prove himself to be faithful in serving the Lord.

He must be morally pure. His life is to be “beyond reproach” (v. 10). Verse 12 echoes the standard of moral purity,

saying, “Let deacons be husbands of only one wife.” A deacon must be totally consecrated and devoted to his wife.

He must lead a godly family. Verse 12 also says that he must be a good manager of his children and household. The proving ground for leadership is how a man manages his children and home, and the way that a man cares for his children and home is an excellent indicator of his ability to care for God’s church.

Although specific personal and spiritual qualifications must be met by those in the offices of elder and deacon, that does not mean the standard is any lower for anyone else in the congregation. Every believer should seek to have this kind of godly character—whether he is a recognized, office-holding believer or simply a servant in the body of Christ.


