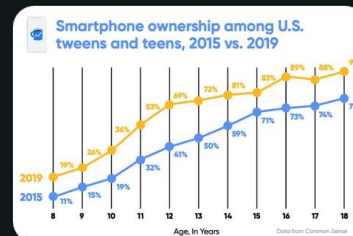
## Tech is everywhere

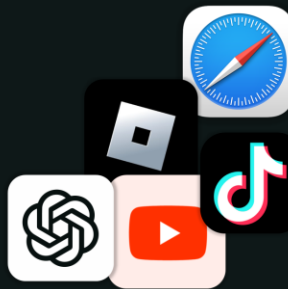


## Why is this important

# Securing Devices (Slides)

## Home Network

Access to the internet starts with your home network

The internet is what makes our devices ‘smart’

Internet connects the devices in our homes, with the outside world



## Home Network

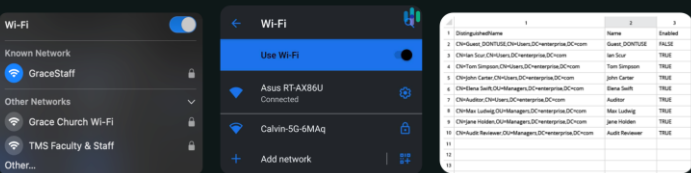
Home routers often come with a default name (SSID) and default password



## Home Network

Your home Wi-Fi name (SSID) matters

By default these can display your router model, and putting personal information like your last name can also be a security risk



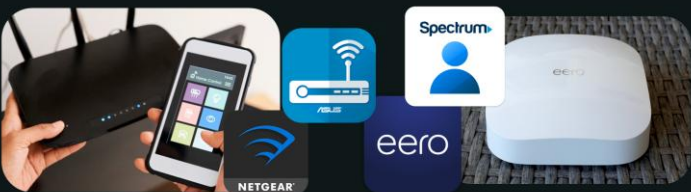
## Home Network

To secure your home Wi-Fi network, change the default router username and password upon setup.

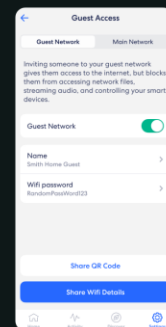
Many newer router models have integrated safety and security features, which can be accessed through an app



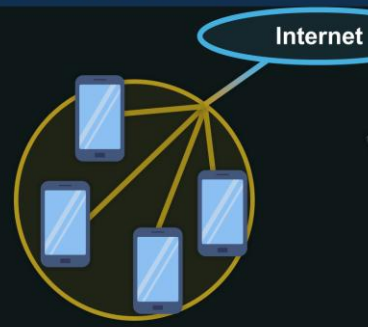
## Guest Network

If you have people over, you might want to look into a Guest Network

- Still gives internet access
- Easily change the password
- Doesn't give access to other devices on your private network, like your TV

## Other Home Network Tips

Everything you access through the internet is still visible to your Internet Service Provider (ISP)

Turn off WPS, it can open the door to hackers remotely configuring your router

Anyone connected to your network can scan and collect data your router sends/receives





# Securing Devices (Slides)

## Public Network

Public networks with no password, often are setup with little to no encryption

Free Wi-Fi in Airports is More Dangerous Than You Think: What to Do When Hackers Use It as a Trap to Steal Data

WA man set up fake free wifi at Australian airports and on flights to steal people's data, police allege



Beware of what public networks you connect too, and what information you are sending and receiving through that network

## Cellular/Data Network Tips

Hotspots and cellular data are more secure than public Wi-Fi networks, but can have spotty connection, data limits and more data, can be expensive

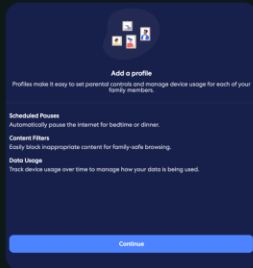

## App Store

Don't share your app store password with young children

App stores have a setting to turn on to ensure that it asks for a password even when installing free apps

Some phones also allow for fingerprint or face scan to download apps so beware of what child can do



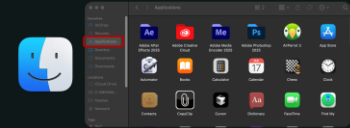

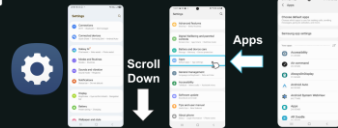

# Securing Devices (Slides)

## Apps

Giving access to the wrong apps, can expose your child to harmful content, bad influences, and addicting habits

## Apps and Features that help secure

There are also apps and features designed to help maintain control, protect from harmful content and can help prevent phone addiction

### Built-In Controls (Android)

On android Google Family Link can help parents keep control and keep their children safe online



### Built-In Controls (Android)

On android Google Family Link can help parents keep control and keep their children safe online



### Built-In Controls (Windows)

Parental Controls can be set through a Microsoft account

Create a Microsoft account for your child, and add them to you Microsoft family



### Built-In Controls (Windows)

Once their Microsoft account is in your family you can manage parental control settings

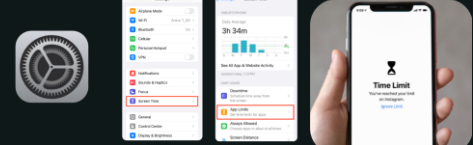
Add a new user on your Windows devices, using your child's Microsoft account



### Built-In Controls (iPhone)

On iPhone 'Screen Time' can be enabled in settings

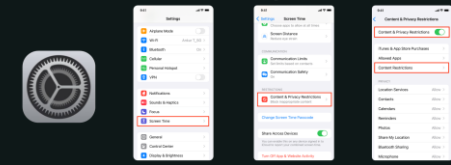
This can help lock apps, limit usage, and track screen time



### Built-In Controls (iPhone)

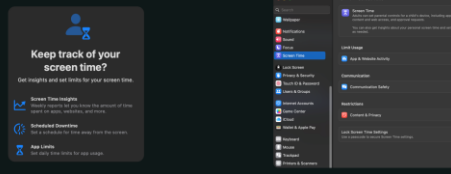
Also in the 'Screen Time' section

### Built-In Controls (Mac)

Mac computers, similar to iPhones, have parental controls within Screen Time

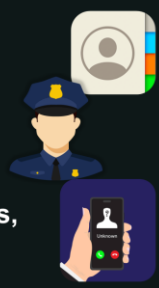

## Good Phone Uses

Phones can be used to contact parents or emergency services at any time

Make sure your child knows how to contact key trustworthy people on their phone

Teach your child how to use these features, and to be critical and not trust everything



## Phones are Communicators

Help your children understand how technology can be used to keep them safe and keep parents in the know

Teach them about avoiding strangers, giving out personal information, overall to be critical and to not trust all they see or hear

Technology can also be used to teach responsibility

## Maturity and Age

For younger children it is recommended to have more control and tight watch over what they have access to

As children get older it is important to introduce them to technology and the internet, and as a parent you can do that at your own pace depending on the maturity of your child

Don't spend the opportunities of the day behind a screen

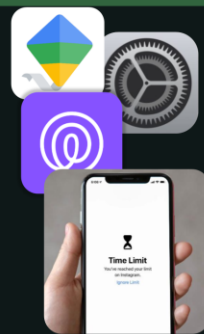


## Use the Good Apps

Many web-filtering and time limit features are built-in, and are free

They often take minutes to set-up and can save hours of wasted time

It's gonna take time, and some learning on your part to use these features for good



## Use the People Around You

Have another family member setup your time limit passcode

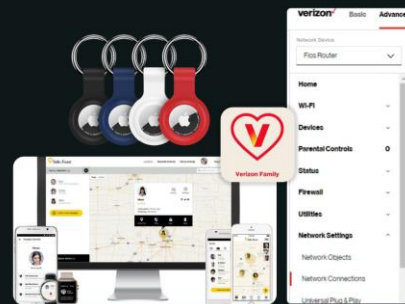
Have alternatives ready when there's downtime

Ask other families how they address technology, downtime, and raising children



## More tools you can utilize
