## **PARENTING: Wisdom for Mothering**

- I. Two Common Questions
  - A. What does it mean to be a **wise woman** in my generation?
  - B. How can I be a godly wife and mother when there's so much **conflicting information** in today's culture?
- II. Performance-based mothering: the human-nature driven response
  - A. I always have to **choose** the right thing.
  - B. I am **perfect** in my choices.
  - C. Examples of a mother's trust of choices:
    - 1. She is trusting in **her ability** to make her child good, by keeping evil away.
    - 2. She is trusting in her ability to keep her **child healthy** by keeping germs and disease away.
    - 3. She is trusting in her ability to give her child the **ideal life**, according to *her* definition.
- III. Wise mothering: giving careful thought to living as a woman who fears God
  - A. Our parental choices are made in the context of **trust** and **fear**. In other words, the decision will be made based on who we trust and fear.
  - B. There is **rest** and **refreshment** in fearing the Lord. (Prov. 3:7-8)
- IV. What exactly does it mean to fear the Lord? (Proverbs 31:10-31)

## A. Two approaches to Proverbs 31

- 1. The woman who trusts in her **performance** to "save" her children and thus see this as a **checklist**.
- 2. The woman who trusts in the Lord and lives in the fear of the Lord, and thus see this as a **gentle guide** for living **wisely**.
- B. In Proverbs, the pursuit of wisdom and the pursuit of the fear of the Lord are 2 sides of the **same coin**. Therefore, in being a God-fearing woman, everything the P31 woman did was a **pursuit** of **wisdom**.
- C. The similarities between "wisdom" and the "P31 woman."

## P31 Woman Wisdom

She is an excellent wife. Pr. 31:10	Is not wisdom excellent? (Pr. 3:13-18)
Her worth is far more precious than jewels. (Pr. 31:10)	Is not wisdom more precious than jewels? (Pr. 3:15; 8:11)
Her husband's heart can trust in her because she will do him good and not harm all the days of her life (Pr. 31:11-12)	Will not wisdom do you good and not harm all the days of your life? (Pr. 4:6)
This woman will work for you, feed you, clothe you, working into the night to make sure you are provided for (Pr. 31:13-21)	Will not wisdom do all these things and more for you if you embrace her? (Pr. 4: 8-9)
She will be beautiful, clothed in fine linen and purple; her family will be well respected because of her (Pr. 31:22-31)	Wisdom is beauty personified, and others will listen to you will respect because of her. (Pr. 3:13-18)

- D. If you search for wisdom and find it, you will find yourself **bearing** the **characteristics** of this amazing woman.
- V. More implications for living in the fear of the Lord

- A. You will live in a proper fear of the Lord **as opposed** to living in the fear of the unknown future that lies before you and your children. (Ps. 40:1-4)
- B. God's Word becomes that which you believe **more** than you believe your fears. You demonstrate that belief in His Word through obedience to it.
  - 1. Deut. 10:12-13
  - 2. Ps. 128:1
  - 3. Ps. 112:1

## VI. Practical application

In chapter 11 of *Courage: Fighting Fear with Fear*, Wayne and Josh Mack describe how people who fear God in the biblical sense also trust Him.

- People who fear God trust His **omnipotence**—that He is all-powerful
- People who fear God trust His **omniscience**—that He is all-wise and all-knowing
- People who fear God trust His **omnipresence**—that He is present everywhere and they can never be out of His presence
- People who fear God trust His **goodness**—that He is loving, gracious, merciful, patient and willing to forgive
- People who fear God trust His **truthfulness**—that He will not and cannot lie. He will keep all His promises, and whatever He says in His Word is true.
- People who fear God trust in His **faithfulness** and **changelessness**—that He isn't one thing one day and something else the next.
- People who fear God trust in **His interpretation of reality**—that He knows exactly what is happening, why it happens, and what to do about it to make it right.
- People who fear God trust what He has to say about the way they should live, about what is right and wrong; that His ways are best.
- People who fear God trust His Word so completely that they make it the standard by which they evaluate all things and believe that any idea that does not line up with Scripture is wrong.
