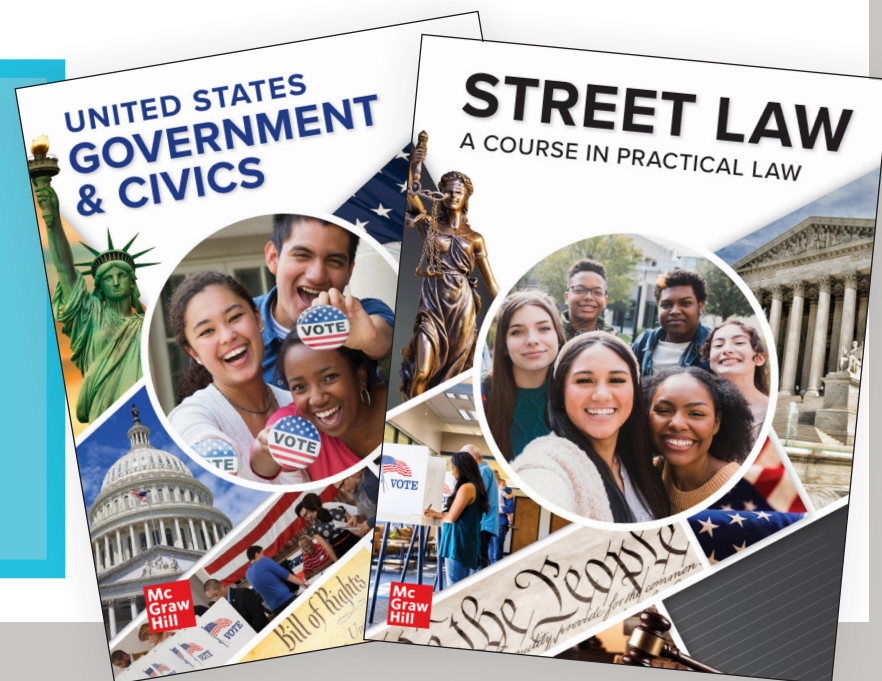
WE BUILT CIVIC AGENCY

From civic education to civic action, Street Law strengthened the ability of young people and educators to understand the law, participate meaningfully in civic life, and shape their communities.

This year we:

- **Equipped Educators to Bring Law and Civics to Life:** Through nationally recognized professional development—including the 30th year of our Supreme Court Summer Institute—we equipped 600+ teachers with interactive strategies that drive high-impact civic and law-related learning nationwide.
- **Updated Our Flagship Law Textbook for Classrooms Nationwide:** We authored the 11th edition of *Street Law: A Course in Practical Law*, providing educators with trusted, student-centered law instruction for high school law courses across the country.
- **Expanded Access to High-Quality Teaching Materials:** We developed and shared new and updated curricular resources across grade levels through our Resource Library, extending access to timely materials on Supreme Court cases, contested issues, and experiential learning tools such as mock trials and moot courts.
- **Strengthened Legal Education Beyond the United States:** We partnered with law schools in Georgia, Kyrgyzstan, and Pakistan to build durable local capacity for public legal education and to support the development and implementation of new, locally relevant curricula that advance civic engagement and access to justice.

WE EXPANDED OPPORTUNITIES

Street Law equipped people with practical legal knowledge and life skills to understand, navigate, and influence the systems that shape their lives, creating opportunities to improve their lives and strengthen their communities.

This year we:

- **Strengthened Pathways to Legal Careers:** We expanded our Legal Career Pipeline Program, partnering with corporations, law firms, and educators to open doors to the legal profession for all students, especially those historically underrepresented.
- **Refined Justice-Centered Curriculum for Broader Reach:** We updated core curricular offerings—including our Anti-Hate and Legal Life Skills materials—to ensure they are adaptable and responsive to evolving community needs.
- **Built Capacity for Justice Abroad:** We provided advocacy training to civil society organizations in Uzbekistan, with a focus on empowering women and people with disabilities to advance legal rights, equal treatment, and access to services—reinforcing the foundations of the rule of law.

WE HELPED BRIDGE DIVIDES

Street Law cultivated the skills people need to engage across disagreements, fostering civil dialogue, critical thinking, and shared problem-solving in classrooms and communities.

This year we:

- **Expanded Proven Models for Teaching Contested Issues:** We scaled our TALCCS program (Talking About Local Current and Contested Issues in Schools), bringing a proven model to educators across states to support student engagement with local and national issues through discussion, deliberation, and inquiry.
- **Developed New Tools for Civil Dialogue:** We created and shared instructional resources that help educators lead respectful, informed classroom conversations on challenging topics.
- **Extended Discussion Skills Beyond K–12:** We brought Street Law’s dialogue-centered approach to new audiences—including community and post-secondary settings—strengthening civic discussion skills and fostering engagement across differences for people of all ages.

WE FOSTERED DEMOCRATIC CULTURE

Street Law invested in the next generation of leaders and engaged citizens to become critical thinkers on issues of rule of law, democracy, and justice.

This year we:

- **Expanded Youth Leadership:** Through training and curriculum development, we supported youth-focused leadership programs in Kosovo, equipping young people with the skills, confidence, and agency to address challenges in their communities.
- **Enhanced Rule of Law Education:** We provided curricular materials to classrooms across the United States, increasing students’ understanding of rule of law concepts, including Supreme Court cases and the inner workings of the Court, with a goal of strengthening rule-of-law culture.
- **Strengthened Foundations for the Future:** We laid the groundwork for sustained impact by building partnerships, refining models, and investing in scalable approaches that can grow with the right support.

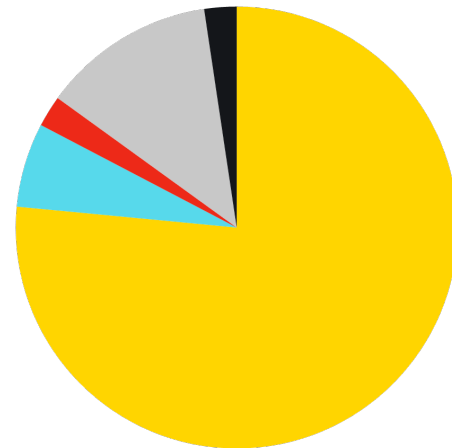

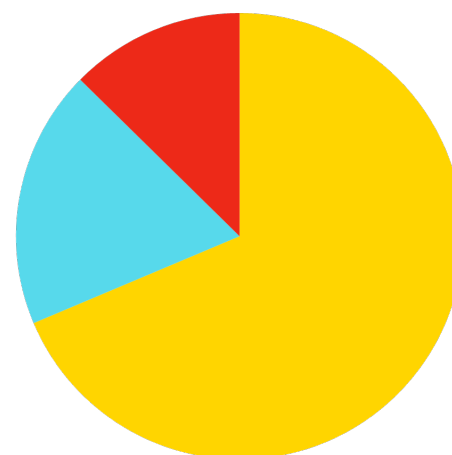
