

ARP Interest Payments

The next interest payment processing date for current ARP participants will be around June 5, 2023. Keep in mind that payments are processed in batches at USBank in Minnesota and it could take 7-10 business days for your payment to process.

If you need to make any changes to your personal payment information (beneficiaries, mailing address or bank account information) please contact Julia Hillegass at 757-385-8697 as soon as possible to have your request completed no later than May 1st.

ARP Final Payments and Your Taxes

All program participants who received their final payments of principal in 2022 should have also received a 1099-B from US Bank for tax purposes. If you have not received this form, you should contact US Bank Corporate Trust Bondholder Services directly at BHScorporatetrust@usbank.com or 1-800-934-6802.

You will need to supply them with a CUSIP and certificate number for your Installment Purchase Agreement as well as your tax identification number or social security number under which the agreement was registered.

Interest Rates

Interest rates for the first quarter of 2023 have remained steady at above 3.5-3.75% for TSTRIPS with regular spikes to 4.0%. Investors continue to keep an eye on anticipated rate increases by the Federal Reserve.

The first 3 months of the year may be the slowest we have at the Virginia Beach Farmers Market, but we've kept busy getting the Rural Heritage Center ready for the Spring Season. We've cleaned and organized, de-cluttered, ordered new material for crafts and projects, and come up with new lesson plans and activities. Here we are, Spring at last and our Fun on the Farm Field Trips for Pre-K through Fifth grade, groups of 10 or more, have begun. March 10th was our first tour and we are booked solid through April. May Calendar is booking fast, so teachers and parents, call the Farmers Market at 757-385-4388 and let's get your field trip on the books! The children love learning about Agriculture through hands on, interactive experiences and once they've experienced it, they want to come back.

Our Children's Educational Garden, planted and maintained by the Virginia Beach Master Gardeners, is already looking lovely. Flowers are in bloom, herbs and lettuces are green and bushy. The winter brown is all but a memory.

If you're visiting our Farmers Market, please come visit the garden behind the Rural Heritage Center (RHC). Our resident hens, Penelope and Lil' Kim, have been with us since last Spring and will continue their adoration tour this Spring. They are a crowd favorite. You may spot them clucking about the garden in search of worms and other delicious treats and they are very excited for Grasshopper season!





FARMERS MARKET - COME OUT AND SEE US!

We are part of the **4-H Embryology Project** again this year. March 2, we picked up 12 fertilized eggs for our incubator. When I wrote this, we were on day 15 and my, how the embryos had grown. By candling the egg (putting a light source underneath it) you can see movement of the embryo, blood vessels, eyes and feathers have formed and within the next week, we may start hearing the peeping of chicks. The hatching starts by Day 21! It's such an exciting and excellent way to teach basic biology and life science to our students.

Our children will learn about vermiculture with hands on examination of our tenants, the Red Wigglers, who live out back in their bin. Pollination is seen in action in the garden and followed by a butterfly, bee or bat life cycle craft which solidifies that lesson. Farm chores, like washing clothes on the washboard with a handpump, milking Beachy, our life-size fiberglass Holstein Cow, and grinding kernels of corn down to corn meal are happily accomplished. If only chores around the house would be as joyfully completed!

It is remarkable to see the excitement and curiosity in these children when learning about composting, recycling, honey bees, healthy food and all the contributions of Agriculture. Agriculture is the number one private industry in Virginia by far and they soon realize that without farmers, without proper stewarding of our land, water and animals, without the impact Agriculture has on our economy, we would not have the food we eat nor the clothes we wear. That's pretty impactful.

Well, I have great news to help you with getting your life back in balance and reduce some of the stresses associated with burnout.



Garden Vegetable Wrap

Prep Time: 10 minutes Total Time: 15 minutes









Ingredients

- 1½ ounces reduced fat cream cheese
- 2 carrots, shredded
- 1 cup spinach, chopped
- 1 tomato, diced
- 1 bell pepper, chopped
- ½ cup reduced fat cheddar cheese. shredded
- 4 whole-wheat tortillas



Directions



1. Spread cream cheese evenly onto each tortilla.



2. Place carrots, spinach, tomato, bell pepper, and cheese on top of cream cheese.

3. Roll up tightly and secure with a toothpick, if needed.

Quick Tips

- Try using different vegetables, such as avocado, zucchini, cabbage, cauliflower, onion, and beans to make this wrap.
- Try roasting the vegetables before making these wraps.
- Substitute the cream cheese for strained yogurt or hummus.

Students witnessed the Mace being removed to begin the session in the House of Delegates.



Embryology Updates

1,140 lives in the hands of VA Beach classrooms

Record-breaking numbers for the 4-H Embryology Project this year. There are 1,140 eggs incubating this year with educators. New to the program is weekly live video lessons with the 4-H Agent, Ms. Jonette Mungo. Students and teachers get to ask questions and participate in demonstrations that support students learning during this Eggs go to local farms that project. supply eggs to local restaurants and food

Rabbits in the Classroom

Creme Brulee visits Princess Anne Elementary and teaches students how to build trust while providing lessons on habitats, ecosystems, and food webs

Do you know how to create a safe and inviting environment for a rabbit? 4th-grade students at Princess Anne Elementary have learned how after a week of hosting 4-H rabbits, Creme Brulee.

Students completed a series of lessons focused on Virginia native ecosystems and habitats. They learned about the special animals and organisms that live here and how important they are to maintain balance in the food chain.

Teachers reported that their students gained better self-awareness as they coached each other on maintaining a quiet and gentle environment for the rabbits so they would not be afraid. Students took turns reading and completing assignments on the carpet with the rabbits. As long as they were calm and spoke quietly, the rabbits would come up to them and allow them to be petted. After trust was established, Creme Brulee would approach to get a closer look at what students were

working on.

4-H STEM Challenge

The Oceanfront Library will be working with 4-H in May to bring STEM fun to youth and families

On May 18th we will be doing an "Egg Walk" where youth and families can test the strength of an egg. Surprisingly it is possible to stand on an egg without breaking it. We will also build straw baskets to protect the eggs from cracking when we drop them from various heights at the library.

On May 10, 22, & 23 we will be working through Explorers of the Deep 4-H STEM Challenge where youth will explore submarines and ocean life. On the 23rd Seatack Rec Center is bringing youth in to test their submarine glider in the pool. All are invited to participate.

Virginia Dare Soil and Water Conservation District Tire Recycling Day 2023

The Virginia Dare Soil and Water Conservation District (VA Dare SWCD) held our Annual Tire Recycling Day for the cities of Chesapeake and Virginia Beach at Brickhouse Farms on March 16, 2023, at Brickhouse Farms.

The District recycled two full tractor trailers and had an estimate of <u>650+</u> Agriculture car/pickup tires and <u>250+</u> Agriculture tractor trailer tires. The benefit of our Tire Days is to clean up our watershed, agriculture land, keep tires out of the landfill and to recycle tires into material that can be used for various products.


