The MBC's Fall Conference and Expo, a longstanding event with over two decades of history, continues to be a significant success in the Hampton Roads region and attracts localities and school divisions throughout the Hampton Roads region, including some federal and state agencies. Held on November 7, 2024, at the Virginia Beach Convention Center, the Expo featured more than 40 exhibitors offering valuable contracting opportunities to small businesses across the Hampton Roads community. This eagerly awaited annual gathering continues to attract many small business owners as well as prime contractors looking to engage small business owners in contracting opportunities.

Themed "Building Towards Success: Navigating Challenges, Embracing Opportunities", the Expo served as a platform for education, inspiration, and personalized interactions with Hampton Roads resource partners, procurement professionals, and business owners seeking strategic opportunities to enhance their business endeavors. The event showcased guest speakers Precious L. Williams, CEO and founder, of the Perfect Pitch Group. Ms. Williams brought unmatched energy, expertise, and authenticity to the stage as she covered the importance of being able to pitch and why its important in today's business world.

In the spring of each year, the MBC hosts its annual Roundtable event. While past Roundtables were primarily construction-focused, the 2025 Spring Roundtable shifted its emphasis to address broader resources vital to the small business community. This year's program highlighted topics such as access to capital, marketing strategies, and guidance on doing business with the City of Virginia Beach, with a special focus on upcoming subcontracting opportunities with the Windsor Woods, Princess Anne Plaza & The Lakes Drainage Improvements Project. Held on April 16, 2025, at The HIVE Small Business Resource Center, the event featured engaging breakout sessions including Access to Capital with LISC, Doing Business with the City of Virginia Beach presented by the SWaM Business Office and Flatiron, and Marketing Essentials led by Karlaa Greggory. Guest speaker Floyd Miller, President and CEO of the Metropolitan Business League, brought additional insight and inspiration to attendees as well as highlighted the resources available with the Metropolitan Business League. The Roundtable also included exhibit tables hosted by Branch Civil, Flatiron Construction, and the Commonwealth of Virginia Department of Small Business and Supplier Diversity. Since its inception, this event has proven to be a valuable platform for small businesses to connect directly with project owners, resource providers, and financial institutions, fostering relationships and access to critical tools for growth and success.

The MBC holds an annual retreat which provides an opportunity to discuss accomplishments and upcoming goals and objectives. Details of fiscal year 2025 goals and accomplishments, as well as the MBC's upcoming goals and objectives are detailed below. This year's Retreat was facilitated by, Jonathan Zur, President & CEO of the Virginia Center for Inclusive Communities. During the retreat the MBC discussed the benefits of inclusive workforces, characteristics of inclusive leaders, and approaches to courageous conversations. They also discussed the opportunities on enhancing communication within subcommittees, with associates, and the community. MBC members also elected the executive board members for the 2024-2025 year and congratulations to the new Executive Board.


