MESSAGE FROM THE DIRECTOR

Greetings,

It's been another amazing year at Virginia Beach Public Library, thanks to our staff members and their



hard work, dedication and passion for serving the community. Over the last year, our team has continued to increase residents' access to library buildings and services, added new partnerships to extend the library's reach beyond branch walls, and launched new and innovative collections and programs to meet residents' needs.

Increasing Service Hours

Accessible Resources & Services for residents who are unable to read regular print due to low vision or physical disability, formerly known as Special Services, moved from the Bayside branch to Central Library, allowing VPBL to add six more hours of the service each week. VBPL also extended operating hours at most branches, returning to near prepandemic hours.

Out in the Community

VBPL continued outreach visits to schools and other organizations to bring books and programs to residents who may not otherwise be able to visit a library. New this year, VBPL partnered with Atlantis Apartments Community Center and Marian Manor Retirement Community to create on-site library collections for their residents.

VBPL also partnered with City of Virginia Beach departments to reach residents out in the community. Participants in the "History Comes Alive" book club, a partnership with Virginia Beach History Museums, read a historical title and then learned about the history while visiting a Virginia Beach historic home. Kayak Book Talks, a partnership with Parks & Recreation, saw residents reading and discussing adventure titles and kayaking in local waters.

In the summer, VBPL staff deliver Books on the Beach, riding bikes from the Oceanfront branch to points at the oceanfront, placing books and library information in the hands of residents (and visitors, too).

The First to Lend Surfboards

Like libraries around the country, VBPL has long offered unique items, from telescopes to coding robots, for residents to borrow and try out at home. With the launch of its Explore Outdoors collection in June 2023, VBPL became the first library in the U.S. to lend surfboards. Funded by a \$4,000 grant from the Virginia Beach Library Foundation, the collection includes surfboards, pickleball sets, kites and a variety of other items that residents can borrow to try a new hobby or sport before making a purchase.

I hope you enjoy reading about these and other initiatives in this report, just a few of many achievements during the last fiscal year. I also hope you get a sense of the passion and creativity that VBPL staff invest in providing high quality library services for everyone in our community – and the positive impacts these services make in residents' lives.



Virginia Beach Public Library (VBPL) celebrated Computer Science Education Week (Dec. 5 – 10) to highlight the opportunities residents have to explore computer programming and technology resources at their local public library. During the week, 127 people attended programs on topics ranging from maintaining a secure online presence to proper drone operation. VBPL offers year-round technology programming, including coding, to spark curiosity and foster an interest in 21st century job skills.








VBPL extended free full-service account access to VBCPS teachers and classroom staff in January of 2023. VBCPS and VBPL's partnership to provide public library access to all VBCPS students and educators is the latest in a long line of successful partnerships in order to maximize learning opportunities and resources for Virginia Beach children.



1,000 Books Before Kindergarten Relaunched January 2023

VBPL updated the popular reading program with a refreshed design and new incentives to help customers better connect with library resources that grow young readers and to make the challenge more accessible. Participants and families tracked progress on Beanstack, earned digital badges and stickers along the way, plus a free book of their choice and dolphin backpack upon completion.

Teen Readers Night OutMarch 2023

The Teen Readers Society (TRS) provides teen book-lovers with opportunities to connect with each other while engaging in book-related activities. Thirtyseven teens attended the first TRS after-hours event, enjoying crafts, a hot cocoa bar, an escape room, game, book trivia and "book tastings," where they sampled a variety of books. Door prizes included Barnes & Noble gift cards and copies of books autographed by the authors. The event was funded by the Friends of Virginia Beach Public Library.







Holiday Toy Drive November 2023

During November and December Teen Advisory Group members collected, sorted and delivered 600 toys to Human Services to provide holiday toys for families here in Virginia Beach. Human Services served 800-1000 families with toys and meals.





Career Exploration Series for VBCPS 7th Graders November 2022 - April 2023

Virginia Beach Public Library (VBPL) has partnered with Virginia Beach City Public Schools (VBCPS) to host a series of five career exploration programs for 7th grade students. The students identified career paths they are interested in learning about, and VBPL staff planned the programming. The series launched on Nov. 17, with 45 students from six VBCPS middle schools visiting the Virginia Beach Central Library to learn about the career experiences from individuals working in the fields of journalism and graphic design. In addition to Q&A sessions with the presenters, students participated in hands-on learning activities related to the career paths to help them identify their own strengths and interests and practice networking. After participating in the program, 90% of the students said the program helped them

explore future career options, and 75% reported feeling optimistic about their futures. VBPL will host an additional four career exploration programs in the 2023-2024 school year, highlighting another eight careers that students have expressed interest in exploring. The VBPL/VBCPS partnership is initiative 4.3C in the City of Virginia Beach's FY22-23 Strategic Plan and is funded through a \$18,000 grant from the Virginia Beach Public Library Foundation.





Accessible Resources & Services

In March 2023, VBPL's Accessible Resources & Services (ARS) unit, formerly Special Services, relocated from Bayside Area Library to the Central Library to provide customers a more central location and an additional six service hours each week. ARS is a National Library Service for the Blind and Print Disabled sub-regional library, lending audiobooks and players, electronic braille displays, large print books and descriptive DVDs. Staff provide residents with one-on-one assistance and host programs for learning and fellowship opportunities.





Adult Readers Night Out

"Readers' Night Out: Summer Edition" attracted 54 adults to Central Library on June 9 where they enjoyed literary-themed trivia and crafts, scavenger hunts, a workshop with local "Book Artist" Maggie Kerrigan, reading recommendation activities and more. The event is funded by the Virginia Beach Library Foundation.



Books on the Beach

VBPL staff braved the summer heat, pedaling bikes loaded with books to the boardwalk during weekdays in June and July of 2023. Staff chatted with more than 1,300 residents and visitors during the summer, promoting library services, sharing information and gifting books for all ages. Bike stops included Grommet Island Park, the pier area, the Old Coast Guard Station, the 17th Street park and more.



Career Coaching

VBPL's volunteer career coaches like Ralph Volk to help customers write resumes, complete online job applications, prepare for interviews and more. A career coach since 2016, Ralph has 35 years of hiring manager experience and has helped countless residents advance in their careers.

Library customer Leah S. credits
Ralph with helping her land her dream
job and making a difference in her
life. "This is the first job I have ever
landed with a company where I didn't
know anyone and had to rely on the
strength of my resume and interview,"

LIBRARIES SUPPORT LIFELONG LEARNING

Career Online High School

VBPL offers Career Online High School (COHS) for residents who wish to earn an accredited high school diploma or acquire certification in one of 10 career areas. Since COHS began in 2016, 45 students have earned their high school diploma and career certification.

This year, five graduates finished the program and earned their high school diploma and career certification.

VBPL launched a strategic marketing campaign to build awareness of the program, resulting in 46 prospective student inquiries.

Embedded Libraries

Building on the successful embedded library for children launched in 2021 at Soap-N-Suds laundromat, **VBPL's Programming & Community** Outreach (PCO) team liaised with more community partners to add embedded library sites. On May 12, 2023 an embedded library for all ages launched at Atlantis Apartments Community Center, including books for children, teens and adults, earlylearning games, and information about VBPL resources. The first embedded library for adults launched at Marian Manor Retirement Community in June 2023.

Explore Outdoors Collection Makes Big Waves

VBPL became the first library in the country to lend surfboards with the launch of the Explore Outdoors collection on June 15 at the Princess Anne Area Library. In addition to surfboards, customers were excited to be able to borrow more than 20 unique items to use for outdoor fun including kites, giant lawn games, a picnic basket and a pickleball set. Most items were checked out within a few days of the launch. VBPL saw record-setting engagement on social media related to the collection and received media inquiries and coverage from WAVY, WTKR, The Virginian-Pilot, WHRO and the Princess Anne Independent. The collection was funded by the Virginia Beach Library Foundation.





Expanded Branch Hours

VBPL increased residents' library access by extending closing time from 6 to 7 p.m., Monday through Thursday, at six branches and changing opening time from 9:30 to 9 a.m. at the three drive-up windows Monday through Saturday. The changes brought VBPL's operations closer to prepandemic hours.

VB Thrive Partnership

VBPL partnered with United Way of South Hampton Roads and provided space at Central Library to host VBThrive. Through resources and support, VBThrive helps residents who struggle to make ends meet but do not qualify for state or government assistance, and moves them on the path to self-sufficiency.

Making Improvements

Great Neck Area Library reopened March 20, 2023 after being closed seven months for renovations. Customers enjoy accessing the updated meeting and study rooms, refreshed program spaces and restrooms, and new carpeting. Great Neck is the final of eight VBPL branch renovations funded by a \$5.8 million Capital Improvement Program (CIP) awarded in 2016. Renovations were completed at Princess Anne, Bayside, Kempsville and Central libraries in 2019, at Pungo-Blackwater in 2020, at Windsor Woods in 2021 and at Oceanfront in 2022.







Winning Awards

VBPL's Marketing & Communication team received Honorable Mention in the "Library Journal" national Marketer of the Year award in October 2022 for a data-driven marketing campaign promoting Career Online High School in March 2022. For the same campaign, the team received a Pinnacle Award of Excellence from the Public Relations Society of America, Hampton Roads Chapter, in the "Most Effective Campaign on a Shoestring Budget" category, November 2022.



Friends Board Member Bob Gilson found a rare gem while sorting book donations at the Central Library. It was a dusty first edition of "Reports of Cases Determined in the General Court of Virginia from 1730 to 1740 and from 1769 to 1772," printed in 1829 in Charlottesville by Thomas Jefferson. An estimated 82 copies are known to exist. Bob and fellow Friends board members knew just the right place for such a special book. On July 22, 2022, in a ceremony at Central Library, they donated the book to a representative of the Jefferson Library at Monticello.



The Friends of Virginia Beach Public Library has been raising funds and supporting Virginia Beach Public Library since 1976. Members volunteer precious time to run the Friends Book Shop, sort and sell books, and much more. In the last decade, they've granted nearly \$1 million to support the library, including the Summer Reading Challenge, early literacy outreach and programs for all ages.
