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2. APPROVAL OF MINUTES: OCTOBER 23, 2023, MEETING

A motion made by Francis Drumm and seconded by William Fleming to approve the Minutes from the October 23rd meeting was passed unanimously.

3. NEW BUSINESS

- a. P&R maintenance of various site types Michael Kirschman, Director Mr. Kirschman gave a high-level overview of the various types of maintenance performed by Parks and Recreation as they relate to current and future purchases of open space properties. All properties incur an expense based on the amount of maintenance required.
- b. P&R FY25 CIP Budget submitted Chad Morris, PDD Administrator Mr. Morris reviewed the CIP budget timeline, recent accomplishments, projects/programs within target, and projects/programs requested above target for the FY25 budget submitted. He also confirmed the budget request includes \$2.5M earmarked for open space acquisitions. A copy of the presentation is attached.
- c. Urban Forest Management Plan Status & Open Survey Brooke Costanza Ms. Costanza gave a very informative overview of the urban forest management plan reviewing the calculated value of each ecosystem service, measuring the tree canopy, and the goal for Virginia Beach. She also provided the link for members to complete the survey. A copy of the presentation is attached.

4. OLD BUSINESS

- a. Dominion Energy Coastal Virginia Offshore Wind (CVOW) Project Tree Mitigation Mr. Morris advised the City received approximately \$1.1M to mitigate the trees impacted by the Coastal Virginia Offshore Wind project. Tree clearing will initiate in January and must be completed by April 15, 2024.
- b. OSAC vacancy Chair Bernick advised there is currently one vacancy, and he is working with the City Clerk's Office to provide a recommendation to Council Liaison, Ms. Barbara Henley.
- c. ITA Open Space Strategies Chair Bernick presented the findings and recommendations of the ITA Working Subgroup from meetings held in October and November. Mr. Bernick reviewed the purpose, history, and the exhaustive list of documents reviewed, including development plans and proposals. Finally, he presented the preliminary recommendations and asked the members to provide feedback. Member Vincent Bowhers, a former naval aviator, offered his expert perspective for meeting the requirements to land on an aircraft carrier and the flight pattern between Naval Auxiliary Landing Field Fentress in Chesapeake and Naval Air Station Oceana in Virginia Beach.
- d. Property under review for purchase
 - The owner of Saville Garden Way off Holland Road contacted the City directly to request the property be considered for purchase as open space. This 25-acre parcel located in District 2 is part of the Southern Rivers Watershed and has 24.29 acres of Forested Areas established as a Carbon Project. Carbon credits sold to City Forest Credits and is regulated by the Tree Preservation Protocol. Francis Drumm made a motion to purchase the property, seconded by William Fleming seconded, and passed on a 7-2 vote.

 - o Tree replacement in Green Run and Ocean Lakes to replace lost trees
 - Overall loss was only 3%, even with very minimal maintenance
- d. Active Transportation Advisory Committee Maury Hill/ATAC Chair Camp
 - Holiday Lights Bike Ride
 - Over 3,000 participants on November 16th bike ride
 - Resort Management Office plans to partner/promote regular bike rides on Wednesdays in the summer, Bike Month activities in May, and the overall tourism experience as it relates to biking
 - January 1st Bike Ride at the Holiday Lights on the boardwalk
 - Va School Crossing Guard Day February 7, 2024
 - Working with VBPD and Virginia Beach School Board to support and highlight safety in school zones
 - VB Trail City Council approved \$902K to fund 100% of the engineering of the VB Trail
 project from Newtown Road to just east of Town Center. This was part of a larger roadway
 and transportation funding secured by sale proceeds from the Dominion offshore wind
 easements. It will also aid in establishing design and cost certainty which will help increase
 future grant scoring.
 - Bus tour on Monday, December 11th, 2pm 4:30pm Start and finish at Bayside Recreation Center, touring 32 miles of Shore Drive corridor
 - Comprehensive Plan five major themes have arisen for the City's future
 - 1. Environmental sustainability creating green space for well-being and recreation
 - 2. Balanced growth support the agriculture and rural heritage of City via the Green Line
 - 3. Economic, cultural, and civic diversity includes diverse city landscape
 - 4. Sense of community
 - 5. Bike, walking and transit accessibility making these viable transit options
