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### 2. APPROVAL OF MINUTES: SEPTEMBER 25, 2023, MEETING

A motion made by Francis Drumm and seconded by Vice Chair Katzer to approve the Minutes from the September 25<sup>th</sup> meeting was passed unanimously.

#### 3. NEW BUSINESS

- a. Dominion Energy Coastal Virginia Offshore Wind (CVOW) Project Tree Mitigation Mr. Chad Morris provided an overview of the CVOW Tree Mitigation project. The City will receive approximately \$1.4M to mitigate the trees impacted by the project.
  - 1. State Military Reservation (SMR) Underground Route
    - Cable Landing Location to Harpers Switching Station
    - Transition from 9 to 27 cables
    - 4.1 miles underground route
  - 2. New Harpers Switching Station
    - 230kV GIS
    - 9 Shunt Ractors
    - 3 StatComs
  - 3. Overhead Transmission Routes to Fentress
    - 3 Transmission Lines
    - 14-18 miles
  - 4. Fentress Substation Expansion
    - 500kV GIS
    - Three (3) new 500kV TX's plus spares

#### 4. CLOSED/OPEN SESSION

#### **Closed Session**

Chair Bernick called for motion to convene a closed session at 3:30pm to discuss properties in Voting Districts 2, 4, 6, and 8. Motion made by Francis Drumm, seconded by Vice Chair Jarrod Katzer and unanimously approved to convene into closed session.

#### **Open Session**

Chair Bernick reconvened the open meeting and called for a motion to certify the closed meeting at 4:40pm. Motion made by Vincent Bowhers, seconded by Francis Drumm and unanimously approved to certify the closed meeting.

# 5. OLD BUSINESS

- a. Update P&R Commission vacancy and student representatives Student Representatives on OSAC Request to Council Chair Bernick advised City Council appointed four new members: Mr. Phillip Hines (P&R Commission Liaison), Ms. Marguerite Alley, and two new student members, Ms. Cecilia Kocan and Mr. Gavin Wehr.
- b. ITA Open Space Strategies Subcommittee members are pulling together all available reports/background materials as they relate to the ITA to support suggestion of moving forward. Vice Chair Katzer is also available to help review the documents/reports.
- c. Properties under review for purchase
  - Per City Council's request for the Open Space Advisory Committee to provide a recommendation based on three scenarios regarding the purchase of a portion of the Wycliffe Church Property. After reviewing the scenarios in detail, members noted the following concerns:



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Issues regarding the maintenance of existing stormwater structures in response to its potential value as an expanded stormwater asset; Relatively low number of households served by a 10-minute walk, as has become a municipal and national standard; Low social vulnerability quotient regarding the surrounding area; and Lack of direct contact between the Committee and seller, as is customary. Vice Chair Katzer made a motion to not purchase the Wycliffe Church Property based on the three scenarios presented, seconded by Francis Drumm, and passed on a 7-2 vote, with member Richard "Tuck" Bowie abstaining.

- 2. The owner of 400 Baker Road contacted the City directly to request the property be considered for purchase as open space. This 5.7-acre property extends into the lake but there are legal agreements prohibiting the use of the lake, is encumbered by easements, and cannot be developed. John Olivieri made a motion not to purchase the property located at 400 Baker Road, seconded by Bill Fleming, which passed unanimously.
- 3. The owner of 2080 Princess Anne Road contacted the City directly to request the property be considered for purchase as open space. This two-acre property is located across the street from Three Oaks Park, which was previously purchased for open space, and has not received funding for development. The property presented has structures on it but are not of any use to the City. Maury Hill made a motion not to purchase the property at 2080 Princess Anne Road, seconded by Phillip Hines, which passed unanimously.

#### 6. REPORTS

- a. Virginia Beach Parks and Recreation Foundation (VBPRF) Karen Beardslee Kwasny
  - Mary Prier's Bike Buddy rack was installed at 17th Street, along with another sponsored
    rack this month. There are still three (3) Bike Buddy racks available for sponsorship and
    are working with the CVB to involve more oceanfront businesses.
  - From the FB page:
    - We have a new Autumn in the Air T-shirt available. You can check it out at our online store. Proceeds from all shirt sales benefit the foundation, helping us continue supporting programs like Students on the Swim and Community Cares.   - 11 Community Communication Boards have been installed at parks and recreation centers throughout the city, with the first, sponsored by Solobo, being unveiled a few weeks ago at Beach Garden Park.   - Communication Boards promotions kicked off with a WTKR News interview on September 26 (aired on September 30) and a Virginian-Pilot article on September 30. Sponsor photos were taken at Mount Trashmore, Bayville Farms Park, and Red Wing Park, with additional photos scheduled for October 27 and November 10. Photos will be posted on VBPRF social media and provided to sponsors to share with their audience.
  - Currently, two board member vacancies when Susie Walston and Mindy Hughes terms ended and working to fill those seats through a recent membership in Volunteer Hampton Roads.
  - Elected a new President Barbara Duke

  - Briefing by Melissa Lindgren, Public Works, on update to Stormwater Master Plan. The Design standard is for a 10-year storm. Bond freed up funds for maintenance.
  - Comprehensive Plan update Focus group meetings now and into the new year
  - Stormwater maintenance discussion to continue at next meeting on October 26th

  - Chad Morris presented the P&R Capital Improvement Projects budget proposal, focusing his presentation on projects related to Bikeways and Trails.
    - Highlights include:
      - Funding of kayak launches at Kempsville and Pleasure House Point
      - Funding for Preliminary Engineering Report for Greenwich Trail
      - Request for \$20M for VB Trail Phase I
  - Road Projects Update
    - o City has a portfolio of \$900K to \$1.3M projects in progress at any time
    - o Projects going forward will contain numerous multi-use paths and bike lanes
  - Discussions continue with Dominion Energy regarding plans for trails along the easements for the wind energy transmission lines.
