Autism Services offers Applied Behavior Analysis (ABA) therapies — both “Comprehensive” (covering multiple developmental domains: cognitive, communicative, social, emotional, and adaptive) and “Focused” (targeting a limited set of behaviors) — to children with autism. They provide services in multiple settings: primarily in-home sessions, but also community outings, school shadowing, parent training, and telehealth support. The organization emphasizes individualized, supervised programs overseen by trained staff (including different levels of supervision) to ensure consistency and quality of care. *Accepts many major health insurance plans, which can help make these services accessible for families*

They offer a variety of services — including child counseling (often via play or art therapy), teen counseling, anxiety, OCD and ADHD treatment, family therapy, group therapy, medication management, and parent coaching. They use evidence-based methods like cognitive behavioral therapy (CBT), solution-focused therapy, motivational interviewing and structural family therapy depending on age and needs. Their Residential Treatment Program serves youth, ages 11 to 18, who suffer from chronic mental health challenges. The Partial Hospitalization Program (PHP) is a day program that helps youth, ages 8 to 18 better manage anxiety, emotions, behavior and mental health challenges and their Acute Crisis Stabilization Program focuses on stabilizing/caring for youth, ages 4 to 18, in acute crisis situations. You may call 24/7 to schedule a confidential assessment at no cost. Walk-ins welcome. *No referral or emergency room visit is required. *

Virginia Department of Behavioral Health and Developmental Services (DBHDS)

DBHDS provides information about behavioral health crisis support available to individuals and families across the state. It outlines Virginia's statewide crisis response system including the 988 - crisis line, mobile crisis teams, crisis stabilization units, and community-based care options.

DBHDS helps people understand when and how to access help during a mental health or developmental disability-related crisis, including through specialized programs like REACH for those with developmental disabilities. The REACH program offers 24/7 mobile crisis response and short-term crisis stabilization services for both residential and nonresidential.

*Requirements: no qualifying individual will be turned away for inability to pay for services, but the program does not serve individuals who are actively under the influence or detoxing from substances including alcohol. If you meet the eligibility criteria, you can access REACH at no cost. *

The UP Center

The UP Center offers a free adolescent substance use treatment program, New Visions. This community-based program offers free, confidential services to youth under 18 across Hampton Roads including Suffolk, Newport News, Hampton, Portsmouth, Virginia Beach, Norfolk, and Chesapeake. Support is provided in the home or another safe location, making services easily accessible and flexible. Each family receives personalized care through a dedicated clinician and a Family Support Partner. There is no waitlist, allowing families to access help immediately. The program follows the evidence-based Adolescent Community Reinforcement Approach (A-CRA), which is proven to support positive outcomes for youth and their families.

Offers trauma-informed in-home therapy, youth counseling, and violence prevention support. Focuses on strengthening families and reducing youth conflict and mental health crises. * If you require Mental Health Skill Building services or Intensive In-Home Counseling, please contact your insurance company for providers in your network, including options for counseling for youth. *

Commonwealth Challenge Youth Academy

The Virginia Commonwealth Challenge Youth Academy is a free, 29½-month program for youth ages 16 to 18 who have left or are struggling in traditional school settings. It begins with a 5½-month residential phase in a structured, military-style environment focused on academics, discipline, leadership, and life skills, followed by a 2-year mentorship to support education or career goals. Funded by state and federal governments, the program is based in Virginia Beach and has served over 5,500 cadets since 1994.

*Requirements: No pending felony charges/felony convictions, must be a resident of Virginia, and must be physically and mentally capable of participating in the program. *
