## Beach Management Plan Discussion

- Individualized encroachment policies will be created for different beach sections, allowing city officials to make decisions on the spot without council approval.
- The encroachment policy is being developed based on the 2007 city resolution.
- Commission members urged to engage with civic leagues for approval.
- Commission members want to ensure that the affected residents are informed about the public comment process.
- Signage options for public awareness about upcoming changes along the beaches were discussed.
- The commission agrees to follow the city media department's standard practices for public engagement.
- 1900 feet of the beach is private property, complicating management and federal funding.
- The city is considering taking over the management of the private beach to ensure consistency in the Virginia Coastal Storm Risk Management plan.
- Encroachment issues at Bay Lake Beach need to be addressed.
- There was a discussion on the need for innovative solutions to improve beach aesthetics and functionality.
- The beach management plan is expected to be between 62 and 74 pages, depending on content adjustments.
- The next draft of the Beach Management Plan is recommended to be more technical and resemble a final copy.
- The city to work with Communications to ensure beach management plan looks like a professional document and meets city standards.
