VIRGINIA BEACH FLOOD PROTECTION PROGRAM

Status Report

- Mike Tippin and team members attended the Coastal Resiliency Working Group hosted by HRPDC.
- Mike Tippin gave a presentation on the Virginia Beach FPP at the Dutch Dialogues Coastal Resilience Conference held November 5-7.
- Two blog posts were sent out in the “Be in the Know” email which included the following topics:
 - Keeping Flood Protection Systems Ready
 - New Stormwater Extension Program is Your New Partner in Flood Resilience.
- November 11, 2025, Mike Tippin presented the Bow creek Stormwater Park and the Windsor Woods Tide Gate Projects to 30 attendees of the National Association for Interpretation conference.
- Eastern Shore Drive BRIC projects will be moving into construction soon.
- Coastal Virginia experienced four tidal events in the fall of 2025, requiring activation of the Windsor Woods tide gate.

Stormwater Operations and Control Center (SWOCC) – Arcadis

- The Stormwater Operations Control Center will be the central hub for Flood Protection Programs.
- Arcadis is the Engineer of record for this project as well as the Windsor Woods project.
- Arcadis is currently working with Portsmouth in stormwater modeling.
- The main goal of the SWOCC is to protect all of the different assets.
- Portsmouth has approximately 70% of its citywide stormwater model, which is less robust than Virginia Beach’s.
- Virginia Beach SWOCC will be unique in its predictive modeling and SCADA components, protecting city assets.
- The potential for bringing in different algorithms and machine learning and all this new technology will help optimize the performance of these systems and the maintenance of these systems.
- Funding for the SWOCC is separate from the bond referendum and has not been secured.
- The budget estimate for the SWOCC is approximately \$32 Million.

Board Member and City Council Liaison Comments

- Questions were raised about the necessity of the SWOCC and if it was possible to lease an existing building.
- Concerns were raised about the public expectations being too high regarding project timelines and flooding issues.
- It was suggested to involve community members in future media to share personal experiences with flooding and how they feel about FPP projects.
- The annual resilience reception in Richmond is scheduled for January 27th.
- Board to consider adding another member with approval from City Council.

Board Chair Jeff Waller adjourned the meeting at 3:13 PM.
